WILD FROM REDFERN STILL LACKING HOPE FOR SUCCESS

Rugged Andes, or Deep Caribbean Sea, Alone Have Knowledge of Youthful Georgian Flier Past "Due" in Brazil.

(By The Associated Press) RIO JANEIRO, (Sunday Morning) Aug. 28.—At ten minutes past midnight this morning no news had been received here of Paul Redfern, the Georgian, long distance flier, since his announcement of the National Telegraphs, the government branch operating all Brazilian telegraph and wireless stations.

BRUNSWICK, Ga., Aug. 27.—The Andes, or the Caribbean sea whose deeps vie in profundity with the altitudes of the nearby peaks, tonight had not revealed the presence of Brunswick's flying man.

More than 62 hours had passed early tonight since Paul Redfern, formerly of Hope, Idaho, took his monoplane "Top of Tennessee" aloft and headed across the open sea toward the terra zone.

It was pointed out, however, that of the 450 miles he flew across water and jungle and it was quite possible, it was said, that he would be found before his ship would be sighted.

The flier's young days, shared with Paul J. Varner, chairman of the flight committee, the optimistic belief that Redfern was safe in Brazil, probably at some place where there are no communications, but both are becoming worried.

LIST OF VICTIMS IN GANG WAR INCREASES

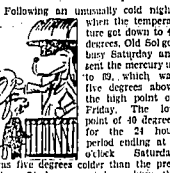
WORK TO BE PUSHED ON BURLEY FACTORY

Foundation Is in and Super-structure to Start at Once; Total Cost to Be \$70,000.

The foundation has been completed and work on the superstructure is to be started at once on the two-story brick building being erected at Hurley for the Idaho Star Milk company. It was announced by E. H. Worthington, architect for the Illinois White company, who drew the plans. The building is to be 62 by 112, built of brick and is to cost \$70,000, including an additional \$25,000 to be paid for the machinery and equipment, making an investment of \$95,000, and adding a plant to the tract that will contain a great volume of dairy products. Mr. Worthington explained that this company, which has headquarters at San Francisco, first contemplated building a rather small factory on the tract, similar in type to several it has at other points, and planned that the structure were seen here. After a canvass of the dairy situation here, however, and the future possibilities of the tract, were held with Mr. Hays, with the result that the company was persuaded to increase the capacity of its plant and build the two-story brick structure.

RUANWAN BOY KING HAS HOME AT SINIA

Historic Castle, Pelech Is. Set Aside by Government as Country Residence of Ruler.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—Sinia, where historic Castle Pelech has been recently set aside by the American government as a country residence for the boy king, is a beautiful resort in the pine clad Carpathian mountains and favorite summer gathering place of Balkan aristocrats.

Winding drives lead to snow-capped villas and modern hotels set against a background of forest and mountains. From their balconies and windows views of narrow valleys and deep gullies are unsurpassed. Gay, eyeslike Rumanian music floats from hand strums, smart croquet courts and tennis courts are scattered far into the night the gamut rooms of the casino are crowded by the fashionable world of southeastern Europe.

Heart of Rerent Orlan The delightful valley in the Carpathians, became popular has been recently set aside by the American government as a country residence for the boy king, is a beautiful resort in the pine clad Carpathian mountains and favorite summer gathering place of Balkan aristocrats.

When the royal couple first visited Sinia in 1914, they were met by a summer place built and they stayed for a week at a time at the Orlean castle. The castle was built by Prince Michael Cantacuzino in the 15th century. The walls of the masonry apartment set aside for royal use are said to be still covered with intricate sketches of well-known court ladies, drawn by the queen.

No changed were the new monarchs with the invigorating air and wild scenery of Sinia that they received the crown there of a summer court. King Charles supervised the erection of Castle Pelech, the royal residence, on a cliff overlooking the sea and furnishing the last had modern. Pelech is in the village and fishing boats, numerous, many-colored German style, looking more like a resort hotel in the Rumanian Alps than a castle in the Carpathian zone of the Balkans.

The building, however, is in harmony with its background of evergreen and mountain peaks. It stands in a wooded park of great beauty. Its many rooms contain pictures and art objects. The dining and reception halls are of Aladdinlike splendor.

Court Life Simple In spite of this gorgeous background life has always been less formal at Sinia than in Bucharest. It is here the guests of both German Sylvia and Queen Marie to wear native peasant costume while in residence.

It was at Sinia that the royal family first heard the booming of the guns on the Hungarian frontier after Rumania's entry into the world war. The Transylvanian frontier is a few miles away through the Carpathian mountains.

Modern Summer Capital Since the war Sinia has become more popular than ever, not only among native aristocracy but with visitors from all eastern Europe. Rumania combines strains of Latin gaiety and gypsy romance which seem to meet in Sinia. Rich owners of landed estates have been hard hit by war and many have been unable to maintain insignificant white villas at the summer capital, and their number is constantly being replaced by those newly rich from post-war development.

On Sinia's three-sided promontory are seen romantic fountains from the Blue de la Pele. Gay youths in flannels play tennis with girls in embroidered blouses, their hair blown by colorful gypsy scarves. Inviting bridge paths lead through the forest to mountain retreats of alpine grandeur. At the casino the wheel of fortune spins and each evening in the adjoining ballroom music plays far into the night.

The remote Carpathian valley, in the shadow of the old Cantacuzino monastery, has been during the last century the summer resort of one of Europe's most ancient princely families. Rich upon the hillside above, embowers in cedars, lies the royal residence of Pelech, built by the German monarch of a Latin country and restored by many generations of an English queen. Now its ownership is the property of a boy of five.

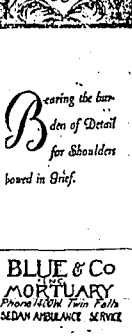

BOOTLEGGING OF BIRTH CERTIFICATES IS LATEST

Practice Stems From Fact That Children of Aliens Born in United States Are Citizens.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—The buying of birth certificates is a much more common practice than has developed over the last few years in the United States. The practice stems from the fact that children of alien parents born in the United States are citizens and, therefore, are entitled to enter the country without reference to immigration requirements. The matter has arisen, therefore, because many parents are not aware of this fact and are not prepared to pay the fee for a birth certificate. A relative or a friend of the parents, who is not a citizen, is often hired to go to the office of the registrar and to buy a birth certificate for the child. The practice is illegal and is being fought by the authorities.

And all too frequently it is granted in a purely friendly spirit, with a feeling of reciprocity that no harm can come to the United States through such an act, and that, therefore, it cannot be a crime. Nevertheless, the law uses an example of the closely nature of such a violation. It is just as much a violation as if the certificate had been obtained by a relative or an acquaintance of the child. Occasionally one is found which is an outright forgery, and many actual certificates are altered, although in exact copies. The would-be imitator takes the honor of a birth certificate, which will greatly simplify matters.

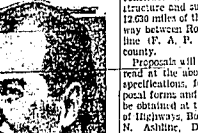

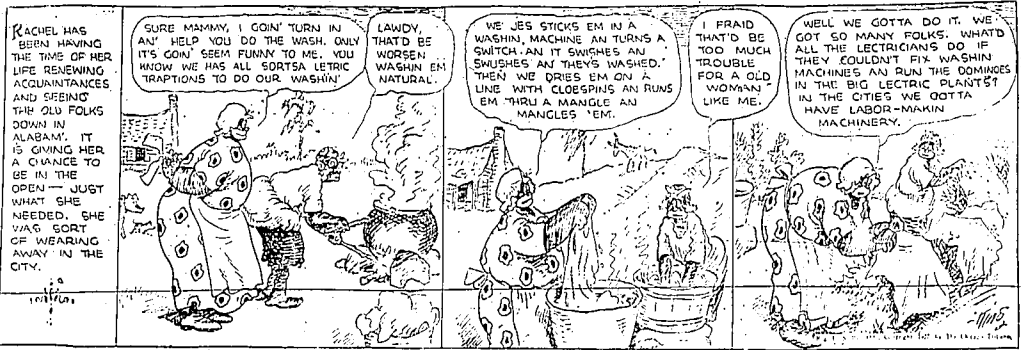

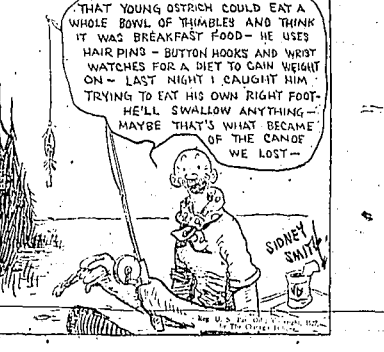

BLACK WALNUT AS NUT CROP WORTH MILLION IN MONEY

New Food Industry Not Far Distant; Intensive Marketing of Walnut Kernels Outranked Now by Several Varieties.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—There is a big nut crop in the United States, to be obtained from walnut forests.

For the past several years the government has been studying the nut crop. It is now estimated that the walnut crop is worth \$1,000,000 annually. The walnut crop is now being marketed in several varieties.

Walnut kernels are used principally in candy, breads, cakes, salads, and other foods, and often are sold by street vendors and on fruit stands.

In eastern Tennessee, western North Carolina and southern West Virginia thousands of persons earn a livelihood by gathering walnuts in the fall, cracking them and marketing them with local merchants. Approximately 40,000 barrels are cracked in Tennessee alone.

One dealer says his trade amounts to 40,000 pounds of kernels annually. An Illinois grower, marketing his own kernels, receives a dollar a pound wholesale and \$1.25 a pound retail. By actual measurement he gets 10 pounds of kernels from one bushel of whole nuts. Michigan farmers are following the precedent.

Baltimore firms purchase walnut kernels in carload lots and not infrequently in Cleveland candy makers order 10,000-pound shipments several times a year.

The government, cooperating with the Northern Nut Growers' association, is developing various types of the hulled nut with larger kernel percentages, and is working to improve commercial walnut orchards. From 2,000 improved seedlings, more than 50 have been selected for future grafting.

To encourage selective culture, the association will hold a two-day institute at Easton, Maryland, September 14-16. Because of the moderate climate, favorable soil and abundant moisture, Cook believes Maryland will be the seat of extensive orchard culture.

"However," he points out, "it must be remembered the nut crop of the black walnut is a farm-by-product and not a staple. The crop is not always certain, and while walnut trees require rich soil, it is a mistake to give up tillable farm land for their production. There are plenty of fertile, unused sites to be selected.

The black walnut is even more valuable for its timber than for its nuts. Single trees often are worth more than \$200. While it takes 60 years to make a timber crop, walnut has a good nut yield within 12 to 15 years."
