WASHINGTON, Oct. 4.—The recent organization of the American Manganese Producers' association in Washington, D. C., has attracted the attention of individuals from almost every section of the United States, and especially in California, where the manganese deposits are so abundant. Attention is on one of the most important sources of national wealth, not only because of the intrinsic value of the mineral involved, but because of the fact that manganese is considered indispensable in the nation's welfare. Idaho, says the association's president, is one of the states wherein very extensive manganese deposits and low grade ores susceptible of beneficiation, are found and the state is particularly well situated to carry out a program to view the development of this source of wealth.

HIGH SCHOOL HAS NEW BASKET BALL SYSTEM

"Doughnut League" Will Benefit Many Students Not Reached by Present Program.

An innovation in high school basketball has been introduced in Twin Falls by Superintendent W. B. Smith. The new feature is an inter-class system of team organization by which many more than the usual number of boys may participate in the sport.

Teams will be organized after the manner employed by many colleges and universities throughout the country. These groups will compete in a "doughnut league" within the high school.

Teams of five members each will be organized and will be coached in turn by men of this city who have had basketball experience. The only restriction placed upon team organization is that representatives from three of the four classes of the high school must be found on each team. This is to prevent the bunching of classes and will, it is felt, bring about better team spirit.

Any student wishing to organize a team may do so, provided he meets the above restriction and enters the name of his group before the close of school on Friday of this week. Practices and play will begin as soon as the quintets are formed.

The first call for basketball material was issued Monday, some 40 candidates appearing, none of whom were on the teams of last year. Superintendent Smith realized that only a few of these inexperienced basketballers could make the first and second strings and as a result plans were laid for the "doughnut league."

Superintendent Smith estimated that about 100 boys could benefit from the new system. Supervision of the league rests with the Superintendent.
