Football games of the past week narrowed the district title race to four teams. Gooding, Filer, Twin Falls and Rupert. Gooding was idle, giving her team a rest. Filer defeated Burley in a hard fought contest and eliminated the East End team from the race. Burley has been considered one of the dangerous contenders thus far. Twin Falls barely skinned a one-point victory over Pocatello, and Rupert, playing with a full lineup for the first time this season, romped on Albion high school by a large score.

Twin Falls Bruins slumped down as a result of the hard struggle at Pocatello. The Gate-City eleven has been defeated several times this season by small teams and has lost at the hands of Gooding last week by a large score as strong as the North Side team.

Boise Defeats Nampa. Boise handed Nampa a 20 to 0 drubbing which came as a surprise to the fans of this district. The Bulldogs were slated to hand the Capital City a sound thrashing. Their great Filer stock a boost and makes the Wildcats stronger contenders for the district title. Comparative scores are tabulated below upon which to compare the strength of two football teams. Yet it furnishes some basis of relative strength. From the games of the past week Gooding would have a slight edge over the Wildcats, with Rupert still a dark horse. The Bruins would be out of this race.

The district race is certain to narrow to three teams this coming week when Filer and Twin Falls meet. The Bruins will have to bolster and stage a real comeback to defeat the Wildcats. The game will be played at Twin Falls and will be the first home game of the season for the Bruins. No doubt playing on the home field will be a decided advantage and with another week to go it promises to be one of the best battles of the season.

Gooding will take on the Bull Indians and from all available dope should win from the Indians. Rupert will face the North Side team to battle with Jerome and this contest will give the West End team a first look at the Bull Indians. The game will be played at Oakley in what is expected to be a hard contest with the dope favoring Rupert to win. Richfield will come to Woodville with the team they recently matched. Hansen will travel to Albion to play the high school team of that city. The Boise Cub will journey to Shoshone to take on the North Side eleven. This is expected to be a real contest with shoo-ins the favorite.

As far as the state title is concerned things look brighter than ever for a south central team to win. In the eastern end of the state American Falls looms as the only contender of merit and this aggregation has not yet been a real strong eleven. In the north the battle centers between Moscow and Lewiston. Moscow by her relative defeat of Ellinger's Spokane high school, stepped into the championship race and it looks as though the northern title would lie between Lewiston and Moscow.

In the west Boise by her unexpected defeat of Nampa looms strongest in the race for district honors. The Capital City team will journey to Caldwell next Saturday for the deciding game of the season. The two teams are about evenly matched, both having defeated the Emmett team by about the same score. The next two weeks will see most of the district titles decided and the fans are watching with interest the happenings of the approaching two weeks.

Thomas Edison Would Like To Live His Life Over Again

World's Most Famous Inventor Through Interview Makes First Formal Appearance Before Microphone. Celebrates Forty-Eighth Anniversary of Invention of Incandescent Lamp.

(By The Associated Press.) NEW YORK, Oct. 22.—Thomas A. Edison, working as hard as the age of 80 is in his youth, would be glad to live his life over again with all its disappointments and successes, he declared last night in a radio interview which was broadcast through the stations from coast to coast.

The first formal appearance of the inventor before a microphone was in an interview which was part of a radio program celebrating the forty-eighth anniversary of his invention of the incandescent lamp. He answered a series of questions put by E. W. Clegg, chief chairman of the board of directors of the General Electric company, which sponsors the program.

He believed the incandescent lamp to be the most important of all his inventions, he said, and is convinced that the development electrically has been the greatest factor in modern human progress. Its possibilities, he believes, are infinite.

South Refuses Advice Mr. Edison could not recall the name of any great woman inventor, although he called Mrs. Curie a "great research woman." He had no advice for the nation's youth, for "youth does not take advice."

The opportunities for the young man today, he answered his questioner, are "far greater than at any time in the past." There is a scarcity of

Utah Defeats Montana 42 to 0

SALT LAKE CITY, Oct. 22 (AP)—The Montana Crizzlies attempted an aerial maneuver in their annual football contest with the Idaho Vandals here tonight and were defeated 42 to 0.

The Vandals scored a touchdown in each of the first three periods, and in the fourth made three more. The extra point was added in each instance. Montana scored her single touchdown in the third period and failed to convert.

Parris, substitute left back, was the scoring star of the game, making two of the Vandals' six touchdowns. Data carried over the Montana score, but Kain and Chinake were the most consistent ground raiders for the Crizzlies, being the only Montanians who were able to penetrate the Vandals' defense.

Four of Montana's passes were intercepted, while but three of the seven passes undertaken by Idaho failed. The Vandals relied almost entirely on the line backs, essaying few end runs during the game.

University of Utah Wins From Colorado

SALT LAKE CITY, Oct. 22 (AP)—University of Utah today rebounded its claim to conference football honors by defeating the Colorado university eleven 10 to 10.

The game was played before a crowd of more than 18,000—the largest that ever witnessed an athletic contest in the state of Utah. It was homecoming day and also marked by the formal dedication of the university's new \$14,000 stadium.

Outplayed in the first and last quarters, Utah's scoring came in the two middle periods, the first coming on a costly fumble by Colorado, when the ball was on the 15-yard line.

PROBABLE TO BE SAME AS LAST YEAR
Idaho Turkey Growers' Association - President Reviews Situation and Makes Forecast; Quotes Survey.

The Thanksgiving turkey in the American home this year will come sent an outcry about the same as last year if the law of supply and demand is permitted to operate without manipulation according to the survey issued by George C. Barrett, of Wendell, president of the Idaho Turkey Growers' Association, after a recent survey of the season's production prospects. It is as follows:

"The spring and summer months during the spring and summer months that an excessively large turkey crop was in the making and many growers have been led to believe that the market for the national bird would be glutted this fall and prices would be constricted. The rumor of an immense Texas turkey crop has been especially prominent.

Survey Displays Gloom
"However, the first authentic information in the form of a nation wide survey by the 'Packer' magazine, to dispel any gloom that turkey raisers might have felt. The 'Packer's' survey shows that the turkey crop in the last year and 10 showing a decrease. The eight that show increase average only 11 per cent while the 16 showing average decrease production of 25 per cent. It is obvious from these figures that the Texas turkey crop will not materialize. Kentucky reports a decrease of 25 per cent from last year. North Dakota and Minnesota crops will be 30 to 40 per cent less. The remainder of the states east of the Rocky mountains report a turkey crop averaging from 20 to 30 per cent less than last year. The states west of the mountains forecast a crop the same as last year.

The item of frozen turkeys, which was taken into consideration, September reports showed sold storage holdings of better than 2,000,000 pounds over last year. However, 2,000,000 pounds is but a drop in the bucket compared to the 300,000,000 pounds produced annually in the United States and should cut very little figure in setting the price of turkey.

The officials of the Idaho Turkey Growers' association do not believe that it would be wise to raise the industry as a whole for the price to go much higher than it has been the last year. However, it is perfectly clear from the analysis of the 'Packer's' survey that there should be very little if any drop in turkey prices this year. The law of supply and demand is allowed to work without any artificial manipulation.

Factor in Growers' Profit
The Idaho Turkey Growers' association does not claim entire credit for the excellent price obtained for birds the last two seasons; but we do claim that the association has been a powerful factor in reducing the spread between the producer and consumer and in establishing a fair and uniform price. The Thanksgiving turkey pool will be sold the first week in November. As this is the first large block turkey to be sold each year it sets the price to a large degree for the entire turkey crop of the nation.

It has often been said that farmers are hardy that they hardly get an organization perfected for marketing their crops and getting full value for the same than they begin dropping out lured perhaps by a few pennies of immediate gain and blind to the dollars to be made in the long run. We wish to believe that the turkey growers of Idaho have arisen to a higher mental plane than that and that they will continue to faithfully and loyally support the association that it may continue through the years to come to obtain for the Idaho turkey growers that which they deserve—the top market price for the high quality Idaho birds.

He is survived by his widow, Mrs. W. Wyland; four daughters, Miss Beulah Wyland, Miss Ida Wyland, Miss Phoebe Wyland and Miss Fay Wyland, and one son, Ernie Wyland. Miss Fay Wyland is chief operator at the Twin Falls exchange of telephone messages. She is a widow, having been married to a Mr. Wyland for the past four years. Miss Beulah Wyland is also employed by the local telephone exchange.

HONEY CROP SHORT BUT PRICES SOAR
Officers of Mountain States Producers' Association Predict Good Returns.

"Although the honey production of Twin Falls territory will be only a small amount, large as last year, the increased price will in a great measure make up for the shortage," A. W. H. Johnson, secretary of the Mountain States Honey Producers' Association, stated last evening at the meeting of the association at the home of Mrs. K. Johnson, and A. W. Anderson, the Utah director, here, after consulting with O. H. Stinson, secretary of the association.

The conditions which resulted in honey being scarce in flowers, a condition which existed through the intermountain region this year, there were plenty of flowers and little nectar. Mr. Johnson said that the organization which covers the entire intermountain region is the largest in the world dealing in honey. He says that since its organization the price of honey has gone up from five and a half to eight cents. There is a shortage on the coast, and on the lower Mississippi valley, and in this year, the organization visited R. E. Brewster, county agent, and consulted with A. M. Sange of the Twin Falls Bee and Tea company in whose warehouse the honey produced here will be stored.

Radio Is Expected to Blaze Air
Trails of Future and to Direct
Crafts Through Storms.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 22 (AP)—Radio today is expected to blaze the air trails of the future, to guide speeding planes through fog and storm and around mountains. The radio beacon already has led aviators from the California coast to Hawaii, the straight path, however, can not well be used over land on account of the many detours in mountainous country.

A virtual aerial roadway, penetrating blinding storm and circling high peaks, is being transmitted by radio signals, says C. Frank Jenkins, Washington inventor. The aviator would be sure of his path so long as a tiny lamp flashes with radiant energy, which has been transmitted by radio signals at short intervals on the route being flown. Radio beacons at present utilize a series of sound signals, but Mr. Jenkins believes a pilot will find it easier to watch light signals, which take less attention.

Each radio transmitter used in Mr. Jenkins' system is a shortwave, low-power automatic station and has directional characteristics making a channel in which the pilot flies with certainty. A little light on the instrument board burns brightly while the plane is in the channel and dims as the plane deviates from its course.

CHICAGO, Oct. 22 (AP)—The home craftsman has joined in the evolution of the radio receiver. No longer does his product resemble the hazy jumble of the past. It rivals and sometimes surpasses the commercial output in the way of modernism.

While the set manufacturer has greater facilities for designing and constructing receivers, the home builder or his part-maker do this work for him and acts, in most cases, merely as an assembler, much on the order of the boy who buys mechanical construction toys.

The kitchen sink soldering expert doesn't have to replace expensive machinery when he wants to change the design of his receiver. All he has to do is to detach a few wires, replace a few instruments, and his receiver is radically changed. The set manufacturer must often go to great expense when such departures are made in his output. Yet the home builder and the manufacturer are far from rivals. One labors for the thrill—the other for financial return.

IRISH FOLK SINGERS
FIND RADIO AID

QUEZBEK, Russia, Oct. 22 (AP)—Radio, recently introduced into the village of the same name, has been appearing in the village during the last few weeks. The village folk are singing and playing new-fangled machines which are changing them out of one of their chief functions—that of family entertainment—and scores are leaving domestic hearth for lack of an audience for their old-time folk songs and dances.

Unlike Arabia, Turkey, covers also professional story tellers, but has always shown its cooks and girls with an eye to their story-telling propensities. The clock, but ten inches in height, is now one of the treasures of Buckingham Palace. It formerly belonged to Horace Walpole and when his effects were sold Queen Victoria bought the time-piece for 110 pounds.

Another specimen at the Palace, the town residence of the King and Queen, is known as the "act of parliament clock," a clock which grew out of a tax imposed on watches by Pitt. When the tax became effective, watches were worn less and less and tavern keepers and as many householders as could afford it adopted a bold mural time-piece for the benefit of their customers.

Shakespeare Invades East End

LONDON, Oct. 22 (AP)—Shakespeare has replaced Dickens in popularity among the children of London's east.

In fact, the voting of the boys and girls ranging in age from 10 to 14 was more than two to one in favor of the Stratford bard.

The test question was submitted to patrons of the juvenile section of the Bethnal Green Public Library, the librarian reporting on the result of the poll attributing the preference for Shakespeare to the fact that the children of London's east are more interested in the life of the Stratford bard.

New Laws Protect African Game From Unsportsmanlike Hunters

NARONI, Kenya Colony, Oct. 22 (AP)—East Africa, the paradise of big game hunters, is hired of motor car sportsmen, who surround themselves with protective wire netting and use machine guns in bringing down jungle beasts without giving the beasts a chance for their lives.

New laws have been enacted which will protect game from the 'heartless hunters' who have become so unpopular with sportsmen.

Hundreds of antelopes, zebras, buffaloes, giraffes and other game have been slaughtered by motor-car hunters, who ignore all the ethics of real sportsmen that they might return to their homes with pelts and boast of having killed them.

All this is now to end. The new law forbids chasing game in motor cars. Flashlights, which dazzled lions,

leopards and other wild beasts, are all forbidden. Explosive bullets are banned. Hunters are forbidden to chase game into Lake Victoria, or other large bodies of water, and pursue it in motor-boats.

In other words, sportsmen who are not willing to take some risk and play a square game are no longer encouraged to visit East African wilds.

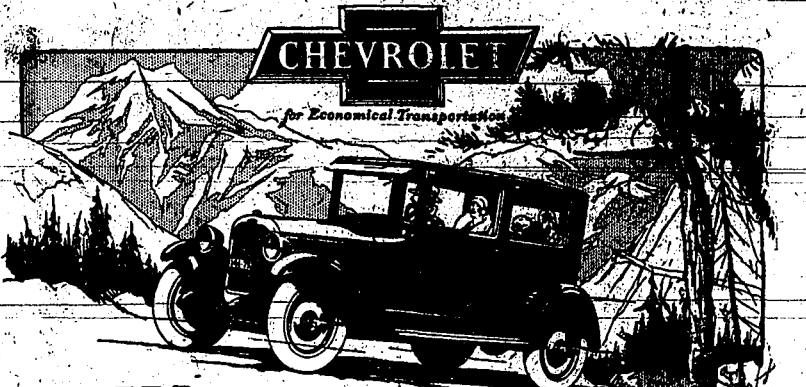
