William E. Hickman, Accused of Kidnaping and Slaying Girl, Object of Man Hunt; Search Goes Through Night.

(By The Associated Press) LOS ANGELES, Dec. 20.—The identification of William Edward Hickman, suspected kidnap-er and murderer of a young girl who recently robbed drug stores of cash, drugs and anaesthetics in a series of petty hold-ups, and is now being sought for the giving of information as to use of a knife, was one of the stand-out features of the police case announced by the police tonight.

The druggist kidnap victim, positively identified Hickman's photograph as that of the armed robber who obtained cash and drugs from his store. Druggists declared that the bandit who robbed them on different nights late last month and early this month had fled in a Chrysler coupe similar to the one in which the kidnaper was seen.

Tapping in Death Boat Grows Faint—Dies; Signals of Sextet's Pathetic Watch Fade in Silence; Rescuers Powerless.

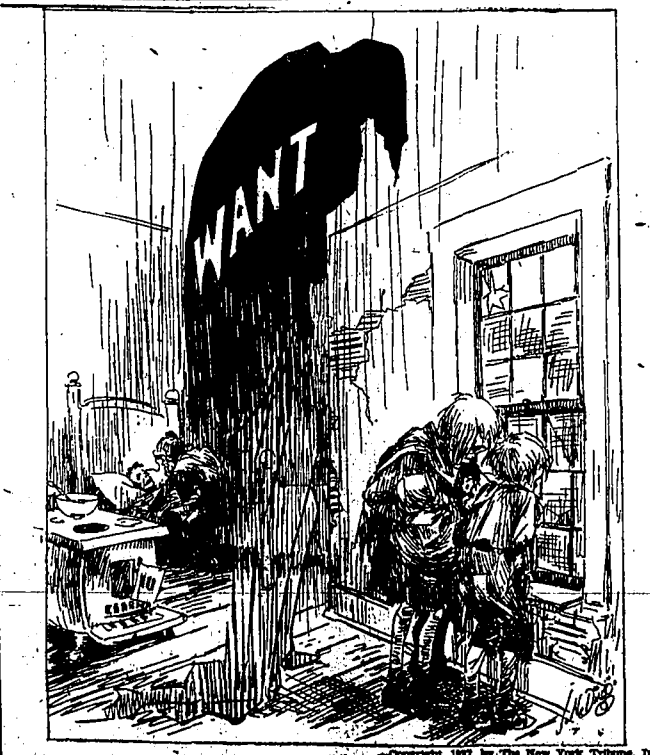
(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Dec. 20.—The weather bureau tonight predicted that the storm which raged since noon, which have forced a virtual suspension of operations for the rescue of the stricken battleship USS submarine S-4 at Provincetown, Massachusetts, would continue throughout the night and tomorrow.

SNOWDEN TRIAL IS MOVING ALONG WELL

Little New is Shown in Testimony so Far; Lawyers Both Familiar With Conditions.

The state is still presenting evidence in the case against Joseph L. Snowden, who is charged with the commission of burglary at the Diamond Hardware company store on the night of last September 14, but will probably close by noon today. There was no material difference so far as a casual observer could note between the testimony of witnesses so far given and that offered on the first trial.

Peters Testifies Again
A. M. Peters, complaining witness, who went on the stand Monday evening just before closing, completed direct examination and was cross-examined rigidly by the defense. He was followed by H. W. Merritt, county surveyor, who had drawn a map of the ground covered by the testimony of the witness. Peters says he saw Snowden jump out of the Diamond store window to the place where he fell when shot by the officers, and the location of the building near the vacant lot.

Ralph Leighton, chief of police, and Jack Empey, patrolman, testified, and were followed by the officers who were at the time of the occurrence, who were called just before court recessed for the night.

Trial Moves Fast
The trial will undoubtedly take less time than the first trial did. County Attorney O. W. Wilham, for the state, and J. H. Larson, for the defense, are more familiar with the ground than they were at the other trial and things are moving more rapidly. It is not generally thought probable that this can be done.

Pulverized Coal New Fuel for Ship

BALTIMORE, Dec. 20 (AP)—Coal pulverized to the consistency of talcum powder, has become a fuel for ocean liners. The steamship Mercator is one of the first vessels which will use the new fuel. It has been equipped with a 600-horse power plant designed for powdering coal and burning it.

Tests of the new fuel were made by the board in trial runs from Baltimore to New York and in New York harbor, according to the Marine Review for December. No appreciable dust, noise or congestion was noted in the trials, while an even steam pressure of 210 pounds was kept with only two or three boilers in operation, said the article.

Coal is carried by gravity to three pulverizing machines, each capable of crushing 3,000 pounds per hour. The fuel in the powdered form is blown through pipes to the furnaces.

Radio Control Used In Street Lighting

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 20 (AP)—A radio wave riding a 400-watt electric distribution wire, lights and extinguishes street lamps in one of San Francisco's residence districts. The new method, known as the carrier current street light control, was originated in Schenley, N. Y., home of the General Electric company, but the Pacific Gas and Electric company of San Francisco is the first lighting corporation in the United States to give it a trial in actual public service. VIENNA, Austria, Dec. 20 (AP)—The Vienna zoo has regained its pre-war population.

In celebrating the zoo's hundred and seventy-fifth anniversary, it was announced that the number of animals had increased to 2,000—the same figure as in 1914.

During the war the number dropped to 300, for many specimens were slaughtered and fed to the more valuable animals.

Mr. Davis called at the canal office, saying that he had been informed positively by the engineer that the Stouinour report had been received at the canal office and that it showed the value of the drop to be \$700,000. He declared that he was both amused and astonished to learn that the report, so confidently circulated, was without foundation and that no intimation had been received from the engineer regarding what the findings in the report would be.
