William Hickman Relates Startling Narrative of His Colorful Career of Crime

Boy, Accused of Los Angeles Murder, Boasts of Deeds of Outlawry; Skipped From City to City; Got "Fine Write-Ups" in Newspapers; Captive Says "My Brain Must Be Warped."

PENDLETON, Ore., Dec. 23.—William E. Hickman, 19, revealed a startling story in jail here today of a career of crime that carried him through many cities of the eastern states before he came to the Pacific coast to become involved in the kidnaping of little Marian Parker, daughter of a Los Angeles banker, who was murdered and terribly mutilated last week.

Hickman boasted of his deeds of outlawry as he told of skipping from city to city. In some of the cities, he said, he got "fine write-ups." As he calmly dismissed his travels, he remarked: "My brain must be warped, or I could not have thought I could go through with this."

HICKMAN'S MOTHER STILL IS UNSHAKEN IN BELIEF IN SON

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Dec. 23 (AP)—Mrs. Eva Hickman remained unshaken tonight in her belief that her son, William Edward Hickman, had no part in the killing of Marian Parker, Los Angeles school girl.

Learning that Andrew Grammer, named by Hickman as an accomplice in the crime, had denied any part in the killing, Mrs. Hickman said: "I still believe my boy when he says somebody else did the killing. I know he couldn't be guilty of that."

Four offers to pay Mrs. Hickman's expenses to California if she desired to go to the aid of her son were made anonymously today to the family adviser, Lieutenant Colonel Charles Edwards.

Mrs. Hickman today sent a message to her son telling him that "your mother, brothers and sister still believe in you and trust in you to be truthful and 'true in God'."
