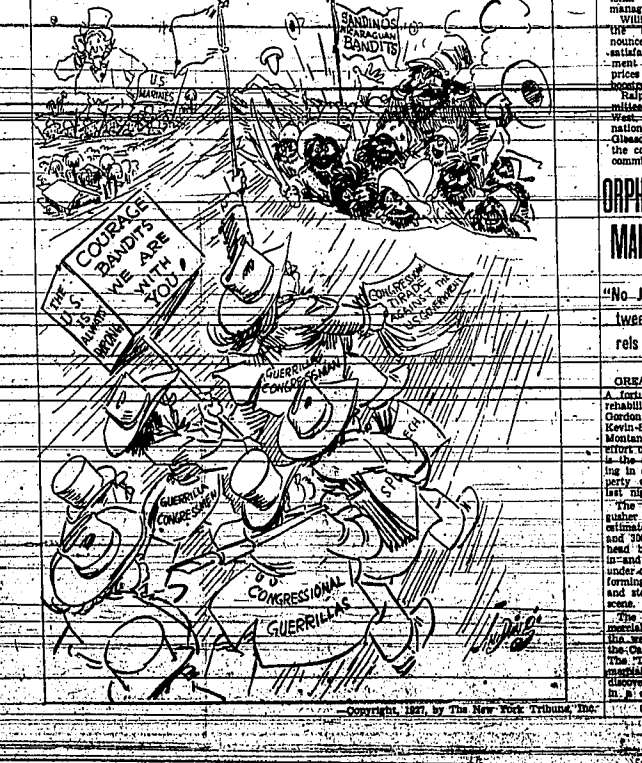

# THE POWER SITE ISSUE

Ten Reasons Why I Am in Favor of the Sale of the Low Line Drop Power Site as a Water User Under the Twin Falls Canal System.

1. Fifteen to 20 per cent of the waste water from use of the 150,000 acre feet necessary for the new project can be picked up by our Twin Falls Canal System and thus increase our water supply to that extent.
2. It will reduce our taxes materially. More valuation means reduction in taxes.
3. It will reduce the indebtedness of the Twin Falls Canal Company immediately by \$100,000.
4. This will represent a savings in interest of approximately \$6,000.00 per year.
5. It will reduce the upkeep and maintenance cost of the drop itself and the cost of cleaning silt out of the canal system below, which is a continual annual expense.
6. It will not change the management of the present canal system in any way whatsoever.
7. No water will be taken from our canals for the new project since the supply will be pumped out of Snake River above Milner Dam and be distributed through a new canal system of its own.
8. The Government reports show there is only a limited storage in the American Falls Reservoir for sale. Why take a chance on letting this go out of our community?
9. If sold to the Murtaugh, Irrigation District this power site can never be acquired by big power interests as it will revert back to the Twin Falls Canal Company if not used for the purpose it is obtained for.
10. The 45,000 acres of new land to be irrigated compared to the United States improved farm area of 505,027,400 acres would represent a proportionate increase of just 21 acres in comparison with the 243,000 acres of irrigated land in Twin Falls County. This could not affect our market prices to any appreciable extent.

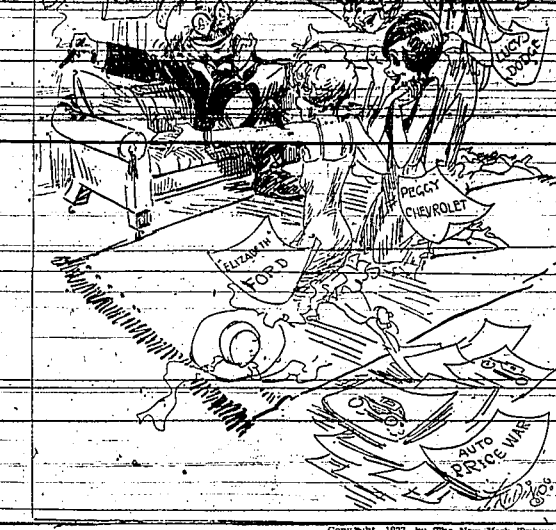

" A wise and brave man," said Mr. Young, "acts independently so far as he can and co-operates when he must in order to get results. So it should be with nations. Let not the greatest hand dumb when it is most spoken. Let it not be able to do what it should do. Let it have courage and sympathy and vision. Let it assume the responsibility of a leadership commensurate with God's great gifts to it. Let it be unafraid for itself and ununsuspicious of others. Let the paralysis of small things and the selfishness of little things be conquered in our politics here and never become a part of our policy abroad."

FRONTIERS AND HOMES (continued)
"Beyond the frontier America should speak as a unit, unweakened by partisan politics, and at the frontier all foreign influences should stop. Keep the doors to the house. Let every man who enters behave with the courtesy due his host. International relations are not more difficult than personal ones."

FRONTIERS AND HOMES (continued)
"Since all the problems arising out of personal relations have not yet been solved, it is perhaps not strange that the same problems should remain unsolved in many parts of the world. Let the attitude of the war be 'live and let live,' as described by Mr. Young, is an ideal worth striving for. And therefore, the study of international relationships in the theory of the same problems should be applied with happy results in both cases."

Without attempting to go into the merits of the plan, the standpoint of the feasibility of building a successful farm area by means of the power to be generated from the water, there are one or two points which should be clear in mind.

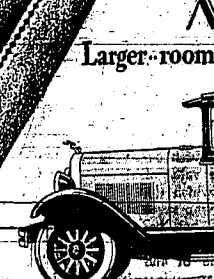

Rowley of Hansen pleaded guilty to a charge of selling a quart of whiskey on December 30 and was fined \$100.

Justice Mallory asked Pate if this was his first offense and being advised that it was, gave him 30 days in jail and imposed a fine of \$200. 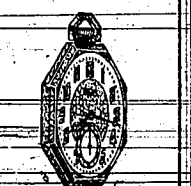

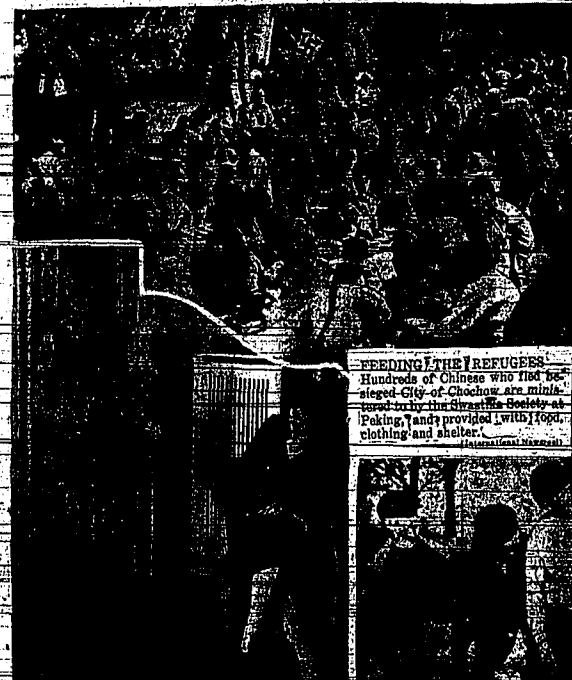

STRESS ON STEEL IS REVEALED IN OTHER

Problems too intricate for skilled mathematician can solve with colors.

A machine in the research laboratory of the Westinghouse Electric and Manufacturing company analyzes into beautiful brown, yellow and green the stress exerted on parts of a machine.

When the model is set in motion on the screen in shades of gray. As soon as the machine is started these sombre colors resolve into browns, yellows and greens that vary with the force exerted.

By looking at the variegated tints the scientist can tell how and at what angles the stresses will be concentrated.

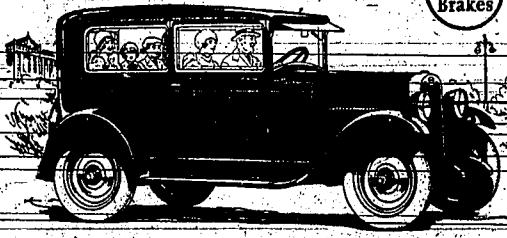

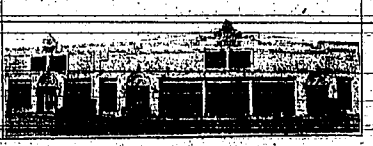
