COURT SUSTAINS OIL

ON SERVICE STATION

Holds That Continental Oil May Install Plant Near Washington School; Says Ordinance Is Void; Rules Out District.

The Continental Oil company has won its fight in the district court against the city of Twin Falls and the Twin Falls school district, to install a service station at the corner of Simpson street near the Washington school.

Work on the station was halted last summer when a temporary injunction was issued on application by the school district.

May Appeal From Bailing

NAVAL BUILDING PLAN IS UNDER DISCUSSION

Members of House Committee Want to Know Why Department Failed to Set Date.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 13 (AP)—The question whether the new warships requested by the navy department should be constituted into a "paper fleet," or a real iron and steel fighting fleet, today occupied the attention of the house naval committee.

The issue was raised by a dozen members who demanded to know why the department had failed to set a specific date for construction of the new fleet.

During this discussion Assistant Secretary Robinson of the navy said that the program originally estimated at \$140,000,000 probably would cost \$170,000,000 at present construction costs.

He insisted under close questioning by representative Brewster, the ranking republican and democratic committee members, that the navy actually wanted the new ships and that it cannot approve the program, a request for \$50,000,000 would be made at once in March.

After the committee meeting adjourned, the navy secretary, Edwin Wilbur, would be recalled for further questioning.

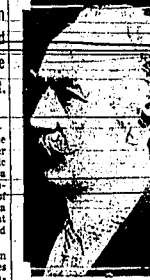

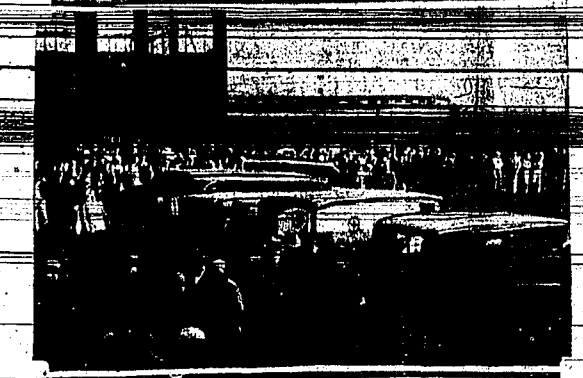

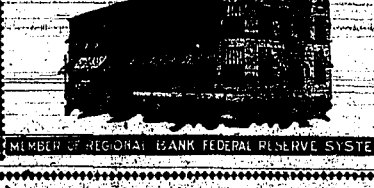

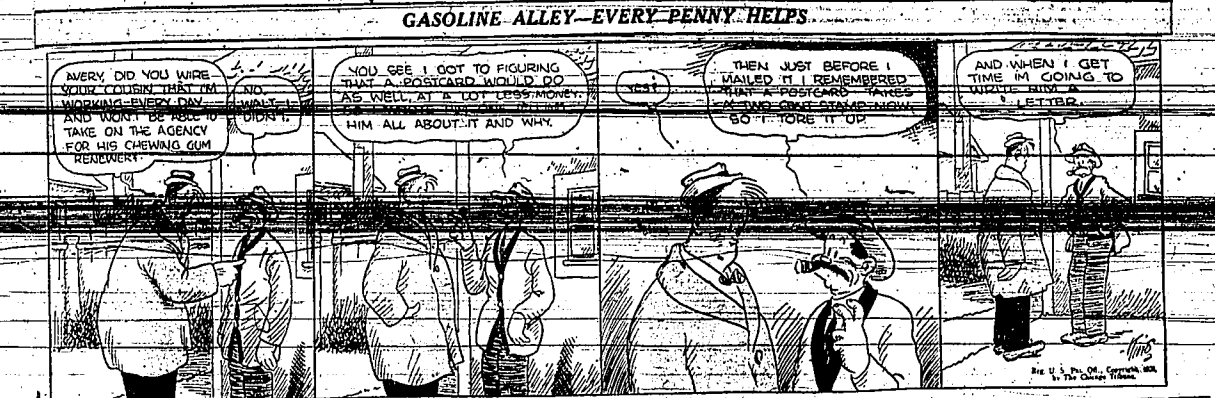

OUTLOOK BRIGHT FOR BUILDING AND LOAN

Directors Organize for Coming Year; Review Record of Outstanding Achievement.

association's history, with all its ups and downs, recently reviewed by directors of the association in session here last evening, organized with election of officers for the coming year.

H. R. Grant was re-elected president and manager, E. E. Wheeler was elected vice president, representing E. Adams, and other officers were re-elected as follows: Secretary, Miss E. P. Directors at this meeting devoted some time to consideration of the report of Edwin A. Wilson, auditor, containing the financial statement which the auditor said that he considered the strongest one which this association has ever been able to close.

Deposits or stock accounts during the past few weeks, the directors reported, have exceeded the association's peak time in 1923, while other accounts, according to the auditors' report, had a condition superior to that shown at any time previous to this year.

Considerable new money, the directors continued, is being put into real estate securities and in good real estate and in bearing interest in proportion to the total of deposits than at the peak period of 1923.

A net gain in assets of \$51,000, and a reduction of approximately \$18,000 in liabilities during the year, the auditor explains, practically amounts to a gain of \$70,000 for the year or is equivalent to a 10 per cent increase.

Real estate loans have increased 25 per cent. Loans have therefore increased 3 per cent more than the deposits and this condition, according to a reduction in the liabilities, thereby reducing interest, and by the sale of real estate and the reduction of expenses which the association has had to pay on their own squaring them.
