## STUDENTS SIGN FOR SECOND-TERM WORK

### Registration Occupies Morning Hours; Extra Teachers Are Employed; All Classes Meet

No definite figures on enrollment in the Twin Falls school for the second semester were available last night, school officials stated, although a considerable increase over last semester is estimated. About 100 additional students registered in the high school yesterday, approximately 75 per cent of that number being provided for by the junior high school.

Three extra teachers have been employed in the junior high school and one extra in the high school to care for the increased enrollment and fill vacancies caused by the transfer and resignation of teachers.

Miss Bethel Blake, science instructor in the junior high school, formerly held by Miss Blake, Miss Clark, Miss King and Miss Graduate of the University of Colorado at Boulder, has been employed as English instructor in the junior high school. Mrs. Grace Boehm, who will instruct in science and mathematics, Fred Hart of Twin Falls, graduate of Park college, Missouri, has been added to the staff of the history department of the junior high school to fill the vacancy left by the resignation of Miss Mary C. Scott. Miss Verma O'ary of Clarkston, Washington, will fill the position in the science department of the junior high school, formerly held by Miss Blake. Miss Clark, Miss King and Miss Graduate of the University of Colorado at Boulder, has been employed as English instructor in the junior high school.

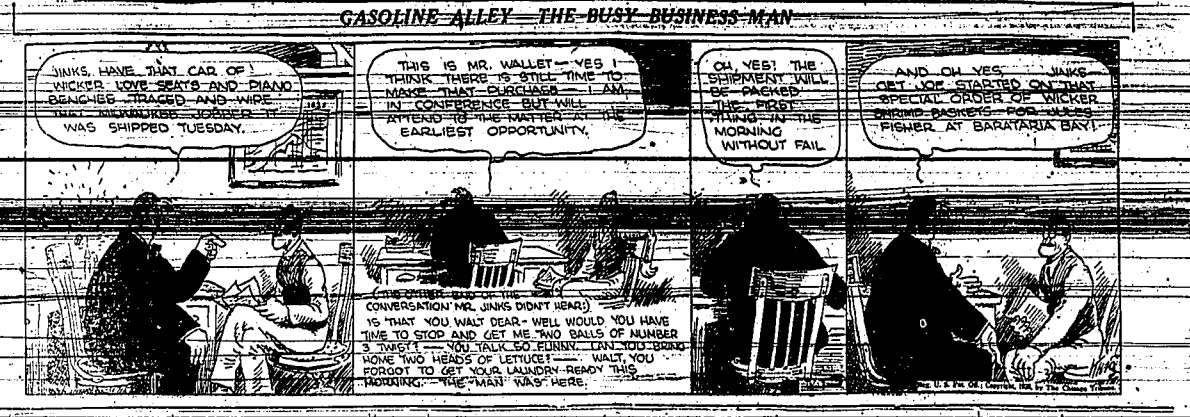
