ROTARY CLUB JOINS WITH BUIHL VETERANS FOR MEMORIAL HALL

Sentiment is Crystallizing for Memorial Building

Home, National Guard Armory and Community Meeting Place

BUIHL, Jan. 26 (Special to The News)—The Rotary club, in a recent meeting today, decided to get behind a movement that is rapidly crystallizing for the building of an American Legion building to serve as an armory for the Buihl company of the Idaho national guard, and as a meeting place for community gatherings, besides being the headquarters of Clark O. Fox post, American Legion. It would also provide a large basketball court with seating capacity for four or five thousand people.

Ed Daly, president of the club, was authorized to appoint a committee of three from the club to work with a similar committee from the American Legion post. The plan was explained to the club by Captain W. C. Bentler. This committee will be named during the next few days.

Captain Bentler discussed a plan for a memorial building which had been submitted by Colonel F. C. Stumm, architect of Boise, and colonel of the 116th engineers, Idaho national guard, which building, the captain said, would serve well as an armory. The building will be of frame construction with stucco finish outside, 70x112 feet in dimensions, 20 feet high, two stories high with basement. The main auditorium would be 10 feet high, giving ample height for basketball court. The estimated cost of from \$10,000 to \$15,000.

Financial Program
The plan as discussed by members of the American Legion and other business men of Buihl provides for the issuing of non-profit, blanking stock certificates in denominations of \$10, \$25, \$50 and \$100 each. These shall be sold to people of the West and the building will be built out of the proceeds of this sale. The stockholders would then elect a board of directors and dedicate the building to the Legion memorial to the Clark O. Fox post, American Legion. All details of the movement have not been worked out but they will be as soon as the committee from the different organizations in Buihl have been appointed. Several financial men in Buihl have offered jobs that would be desirable as a building for the Legion memorial.

Captain Bentler explained that the state will pay \$900 a year to the support of a suitable armory in Buihl, which he said could be used to pay for maintenance or upkeep of the building.


