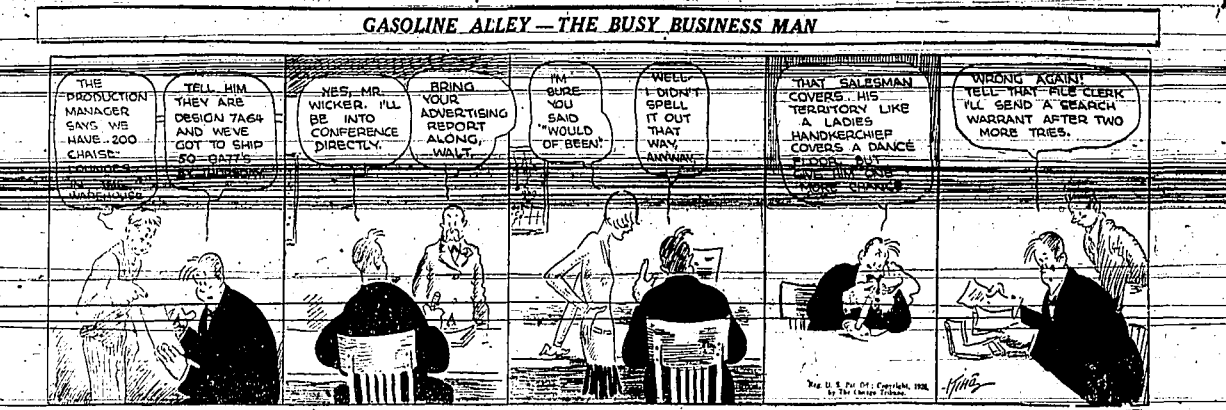

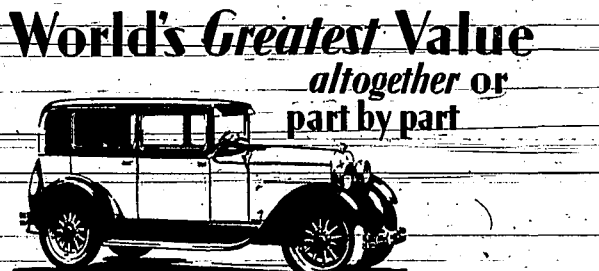

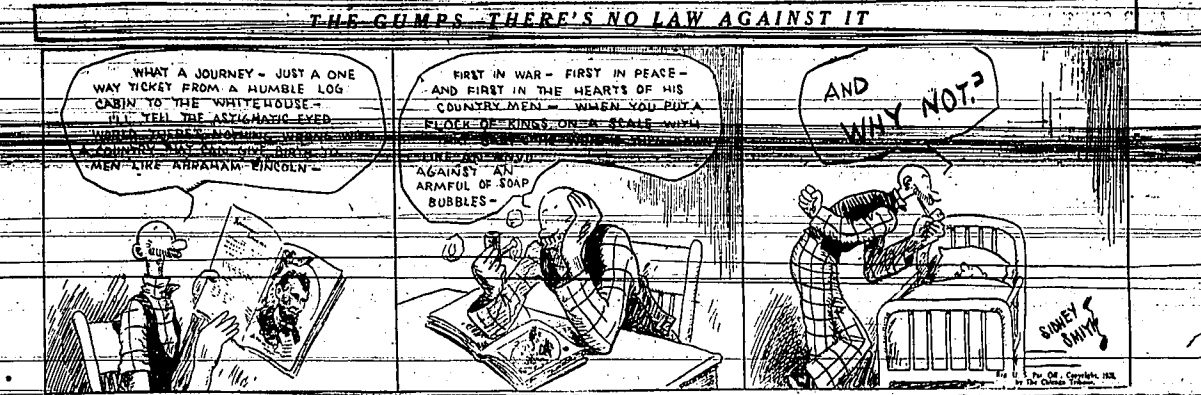

# AMERICAN LEGION'S AIMS GIVEN PRAISE IN COMMUNITY EVENT

Organizations Join World War Veterans in Unveiling of Poster Message.

With public exercises in which the members of the government and other patriotic and civic organizations joined with Twin Falls post of the American Legion, the public unveiling poster message of the American Legion's peace time aims was unveiled here Wednesday afternoon.

Spanish war veterans of General Lewton post and officers and men of Company E. Twin Falls unit of the Idaho national guard, marched with more than 1000 world war veterans in a parade led by Twin Falls high school band and the national and legion colors through the lined streets to the scene of the exercises at the corner of Shoshone street and Second avenue east. Two members of the boy scout troop that is sponsored by the Legion post drew the veil from the poster while the band played America. The exercises closed with the Star Spangled Banner played by the band.

Youth Activities Here  
Three of the peace time activities of the American Legion post were referred to by speakers in the course of the exercises.

Unqualified endorsement was given by Adam B. Wilson, president of Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce, to the Legion's program for construction of a memorial building and community hall.

R. W. Gardner, spokesman for Twin Falls boy scout council, commended the Legion's part in management of the scout movement, and declared that boys of scout age look naturally to Legion men for present and example.

Girls of the community representatives of the twentieth century club, tracing the origin and development of the world war veterans' organization, told of its work in ministering to needs of comrades and their families, and pledged cooperation in the end that it may continue to develop and spread its message of courage, good will and love of country throughout the land.

H. J. Boller, Twin Falls mayor, asserted that he regarded veterans of the world war as saviors of the nation, and declared for support of the American Legion in its peace time aims, including, in Twin Falls, the construction of a memorial building and community hall.

O. P. Duvall, speaking for the Kiwanis club, praised the American Legion's ideals and emphasized its opportunities.

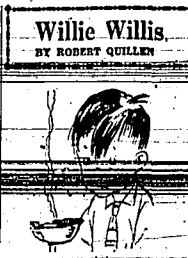
This Organization's Objectives  
In a brief introductory address, Harry Bennett, post commander, who introduced the other speakers, stated that purpose of the display of the poster was not attempted aggrandizement of the world war veterans' organization.

"The American Legion," he declared, "stands for principles that justify its existence. We are proud of its achievements; we desire to be a part of the community and to help to build it up and make it better."

Quoting a past commander of the New Jersey American Legion department, Mr. Bennett referred to a record of the organization at the close of the twentieth century where not so much consideration will be given to the cities that it destroyed by artillery as to the communities which it built by character, where not so much thought will be given to the empire which it helped to destroy abroad as to the republic which it helped to build at home, and where its glory will shine not so much from the light of its brilliant past as from the light of its brilliant part it may play, consistent with our national honor, in preventing the next one.
