The three houses, which are wholesale for the seed trade and carrying concerns, uniting in the merger are the John H. Allen Seed Company of Shaboga, Wis., the Everett B. Clark Seed Company of Milford, Connecticut, and the N. B. Keeney and Son, Incorporated of Le Roy, New York.

Representatives for the three houses in this district were Benjamin Miller of Kimberly for the John H. Allen company; Everett B. Clark company, and L. A. Bethel of Elmer for the N. B. Keeney and Son. The Idaho representatives of these houses have been informed of the merger, but do not know at the present time what the results and effects of the union will be.

### CASTLEFORD MEN ADMIT GUILT IN LIQUOR CHARGE

#### A. Jacobs and A. Meyer Taken in Raid on Residence During Early Hours; Liquor Found.

Arthur Jacobs and Andrew Meyer of Castleford will appear in probate court this morning to receive judgment on a charge of illegal possession of intoxicating liquor to which they entered pleas of guilty at their arraignment yesterday.

Jacobs and Meyer were taken in a raid upon the Jacobs residence, southeast of Castleford, early yesterday morning by members of the sheriff's force. They were brought to Twin Falls where charges of illegal possession of intoxicating liquor were filed against them. At their arraignment before Probate Judge C. A. Bailey they pleaded guilty and date for the passing of judgment was set at 10 o'clock this morning.

Officers state that the men after pleading guilty made a statement in which they admitted their possession of a small quantity of beer, and also Fred Wise, who was on a charge of forgery is now pending in the district court.

Wise was sent to the penitentiary on Caydon county on conviction on parole. A. W. Witham, warden of the state penitentiary, while here, stated that some showing beyond unproven allegation of forgery would be necessary before he would revoke the parole. O. W. Witham, prosecuting attorney, said last night that he was investigating the alleged statement of Jacobs and Meyer, with a view of determining whether it would furnish ground for such revocation.

Officers stated that about two gallons of moonshine whiskey was discovered by the raid. When the officers arrived at the house, Meyer was still in bed, which indicate that the raiding officers possess all considerable quantity of "early bird" qualities.

Jacobs is married and has a family. Meyer is a bachelor at the Jacobs' home.

### OVER 300 CRIMINAL CASES DURING YEAR

#### One Prosecution for Every Day in 1927 on Record in Ver-

There were 300 and fourteen cases were filed during the year 1927 by the office of Twin Falls county attorney, according to figures compiled last evening by O. W. Witham, prosecuting attorney, for his annual report. Of these 37 were felony charges and the rest of the charges involving minor offenses.

There were 188 convictions, all told; 13 trials, including misdemeanor cases resulted in acquittal; there were 40 dismissals for which various causes are assigned including disappearance of defendant, insanity, death of defendant, and jury disagreement, evidence deemed insufficient on investigation, etc. Fourteen cases were still pending in 43 cases, there was no arrest owing to disappearance of defendants before complaint was made. There was one "juvenile" hearing which resulted in decision for the state. In addition there were three inebriate cases, three prisoners sought release through habeas corpus and failed.

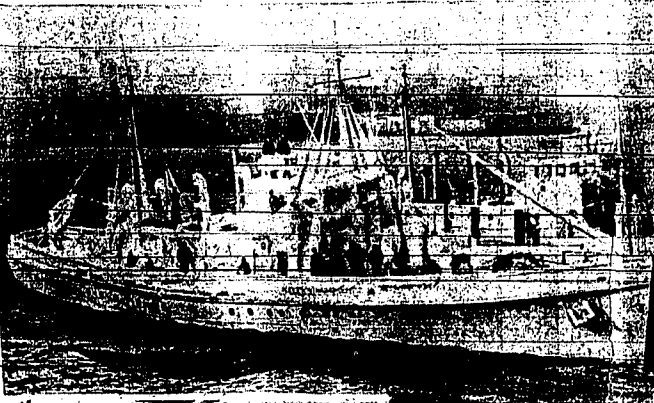
