# WEED PREPARATION KILLED STOCK SAY MURTAUGH COW MEN

### Action Instituted Against Com- pany for Alleged Poisoning of Cattle Comes Up for Trial Insurance Case With Jury

The suit instituted by Bothwell and Chapman in behalf of W. C. Hall and Glenn Briggs of Murtaugh, partners, against Twin Falls county, for \$485 for alleged poisoning of cattle by use of a preparation to kill weeds, will come to trial in the district court here this morning.

**CHIEF JURY**—The plaintiff alleges that such poison was carelessly distributed where the cattle had access to the weeds, by the commission of the defendant, and that they are then on June 24, 1925, and died.

The complaint names as defendants, Twin Falls county, E. C. Ives, Ivan G. Lincoln and W. F. Breckon, county commissioners; Ed S. Larned, weed commissioner, and Cyril Burkhalter, assistant.

**Goes to Jury**—The case of the American Union Insurance company of New York against W. J. H. Jones, for \$75,000, went to the jury last evening with instructions to bring in a sealed verdict.

The plaintiff claims that he had insured the barn of P. L. Silenberger and that on April 29, 1927, the structure was destroyed by fire. The burning, it is alleged, resulted from a fire in weeds which employees of Iron set on his farm and by his orders and carelessly allowed to get away from them. The company represents that by Bothwell and Chapman, paid the amount of the policy and sued for its recovery from Iron. The defendant, represented by Sweeney and Sweeney, denied that there was any proof that the fire on Iron place caused the burning of the barn, but contended that even if it were true it could only be attributed to a change in the direction of the wind which could not have been anticipated, and that there was no carelessness in handling the fire. County Attorney G. W. Witham represents the defense.

**Verdict for Plaintiff**—Verdict for the plaintiff for the sum of \$352.20 was granted by the jury in the case of Mrs. Nora Morrill, represented by J. H. Barnes, against the State of Idaho. In this action Mrs. Morrill and her husband sued for damages on account of injuries alleged to have been sustained by Mrs. Morrill in a fall last February over a sack of beans at the McDonald store at Hollister. She was carrying her baby in her arms, the evidence showed, and suffered a broken arm in attempting to protect the child.

## VAN EATON FILES APPEAL TO STATE SUPREME TRIBUNAL

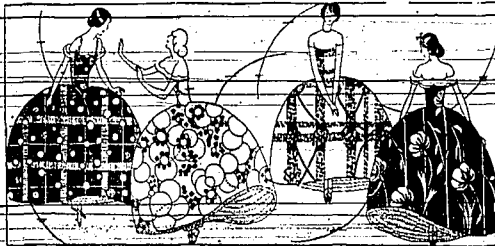

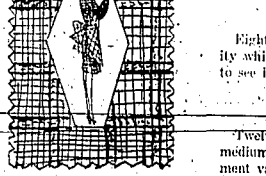
