CIGARETTE BUSINESS INCREASES OVER 1926

Records for Production in United States Shattered Last Year; More Women Smoking.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9 (AP)—All records for cigarette production in the United States were shattered last year when more than 10,000,000,000 were produced, an increase of approximately 7,000,000,000 over 1926.

The steady increase during the last 10 years was reported by the Internal Revenue bureau in a report issued by cigarette manufacturers in part to a spread of cigarette smoking among women.

While cigarette production shows an increase, cigars decreased by about 7,000,000. Production last year totaled about 1,700,000,000 cigars and 370,000,000 cigars.

On the other hand, total increased production of nearly 5,000,000 packs to the 44,000,000 pack mark.

Distilled spirits and wine increased 70,000 gallons a total of 32,700,000 gallons being made last year.

### TRIGUEIRO ESTATE CASE IS SETTLED AND IS DISMISSED

#### Relatives of Wealthy Ranchmen's Estate Worth Over \$100,000 Goes to Heir.

The suit of H. A. DeWalt, administrator against Maria Guerrero-Trigueiro, a Spanish-English inheritance case involving ownership of the estate of the late Frank Trigueiro, the value of which is estimated at over \$100,000, and the suit of Maria Guerrero-Trigueiro against H. A. DeWalt, for \$700, were both settled and dismissed yesterday by agreement of DeWalt and Chapman, representing Maria and DeWalt, and Taylor, representing the administrator and relatives of Trigueiro.

#### Terms of Settlement

Under the settlement Maria Guerrero-Trigueiro pays the costs of both suits. It was stipulated that if the suit for the estate of Trigueiro is settled, the relatives of Trigueiro the sum of \$100,000, besides that the relatives received certain sums hereafter, of which Captain DeWalt did not have a list at hand.

Frank Trigueiro was a wealthy ranchman in a territory of approximately five hundred acres and some improved property for many years. Finally, Maria Guerrero-Trigueiro, a young Spaniard, attracted his attention and won his confidence by faithful service, covering many years.

There was evidence offered at trial in the case to show that Trigueiro had made statements to the effect that he intended to leave the property to Maria. When near death he had in hope of expressing his will, executed out deeds and bills of sale transferring his estate of 500 acres—irrigated lands with water rights and other property, including 2400 head of sheep, horses, cattle and personal effects to the young heir.

Relatives of Trigueiro sought to set aside the instrument on the theory that the ranchman was in unbalanced mental state, though not clearly insane, when he signed them. The jury found for the heir, and the relatives filed an appeal which is now dismissed by mutual consent of parties. In return, Maria sued the administrator and relatives for alleged conspiracy which she asserted had caused him costs in the sum of \$700. This suit is also dismissed.

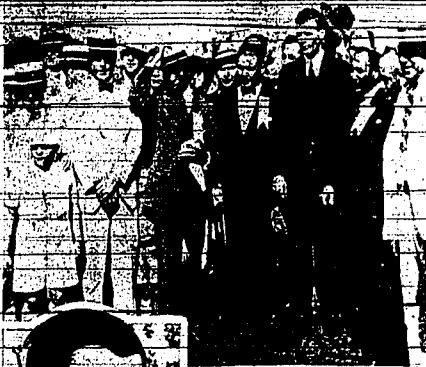

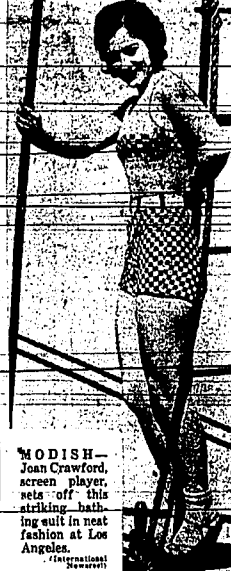

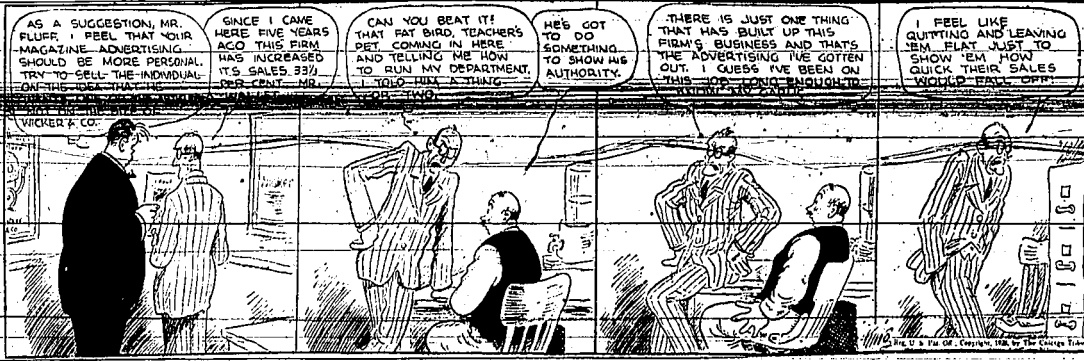

DIPLOMATS SPONSOR OPERATIC FESTIVALS

Five Ambassadors of European

Company at Washington.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Ambassadors of five European countries have cooperated with the Washington National Opera company to sponsor the first international grand opera festival here since the week of February 13. Tito Hufo, Italian baritone; Maurice Caputo, French tenor; Johanna Clawson and Miss Alsen, German sopranos, and half a dozen widely known American opera stars have been designated by their respective countries to represent them in the festival.

Ernst Howard of Great Britain, Noble Ciriano de Martino of Italy, Paul Claudel of France, Prince de Ligne of Belgium and Herr von Fritters and Anton of Germany are the sponsoring committee of ambassadors. American sponsors are headed by General John A. Pershing, Nicholas Longworth, secretary of the house of representatives, and Senator Philip of Colorado.

The festival will be opened with an American opera, "A Light from St. Agnes," by W. Frank Harling. Minnie Maddern Pasko wrote the libretto. The opera has been produced but once, in Chicago, last year. The composer will conduct the Washington presentation and it will be sung by an all-American cast.

The two operas chosen to represent Italian opera are "Tosca" by Puccini, and "Cavalleria" by Verdi. Mme. Gaski and Mme. Alsen will have the leading soprano roles in the two Wagnerian operas which will be Germany's contribution to the festival. Gaski sings Brunnhilde in "Die Walkure" and Alsen "Sieglinde."

Leading coloratura, Jennie Jenkins, soprano, and Paul Albers, tenor, all Americans, will have places on the week's program.

Bob Baker, son of Judge and Mrs. Jamne, presided from the boys' viewpoint. Dr. J. Myron Scholer was toastmaster.

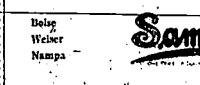
