HICKMAN'S SENTENCE

WAY AWAIT HEARING OF MOVE FOR APPEAL

Counsel for Defense Holds Judgment Cannot be Passed Until Court Rules on Motion for New Trial for Slayer.

(By The Associated Press) LOS ANGELES, Feb. 10.—Attorneys Jerome Walsh and Richard Cantillon, whose defense of William Edward Hickman, Barker-Karpis slayer, was crushed by the jury decision yesterday, today announced their belief that Hickman cannot be sentenced until they have a motion for a new trial next Tuesday.

Efforts to reach Judge J. J. Tamm, who heard the case, failed. Tamm is on his way to the court to ask the opinion on the statement of the defense, were unavailing, as he could not be located at the Hall of Justice at his hotel.

Walsh and Cantillon based their declaration on the fact that when the verdict was brought, the court asked the defense if it would agree to ignore the rule that arguments must be heard within 48 hours after a verdict is returned and present their arguments Thursday morning. This was agreed upon.

Obstacle to sentence. This agreement, according to the defense lawyers, may prevent the court from passing on the motion until the motion for the new trial has been disposed of.

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10 (AP)—A two-barreled senate inquiry into the Pennsylvania coal strike situation was in the offing tonight as a result of the day's developments at Capitol Hill.

After a plea by representatives of the miners, the senate-interstate commerce committee deferred action on the Johnson resolution in the senate today, but the committee, led by Chairman Watson said a prima facie case had been made out and an investigation would be reported favorably.

Seven committee members who considered the resolution were unanimous in the opinion that the inquiry which is to go into conditions in the mining districts of Ohio and West Virginia should be conducted by a special committee.

Mercury Drops 1 Degree Suddenly in Afternoon; Many Accidents; No Fatalities

LONDON, Feb. 10 (AP)—The British Isles again today suffered weather freaks. Late in the afternoon there was a sudden fall of the mercury—1 degree—accompanied by thunder and lightning, snow and sleet. This lasted about 40 minutes, as London was in temporary darkness.

The wind, especially in Ireland, was of hurricane force in some places, an hour's hail fell in London.

Thus far many minor accidents and property damage by lightning have been reported, but no fatalities.

4090 Cars of Idaho Perishable Products Go Out in January

In Oil Field; 50 Persons Injured

TERRIFIC CONCUSSION ROCKS CITY; RESCUERS FIGHT AGAINST ODDS

Explosion Shatters Windows in Wide Area of Plant; Pall of Dense Smoke Hampers Labors; Flames Pierce Skies.

(By The Associated Press) EVERETT, Mass., Feb. 10.—With a concussion that rocked this city and was felt for many miles beyond a unit of 10 large stills in the refining plant of the Beacon Oil company here, exploded late today, causing heavy loss of life. Early tonight the known dead numbered 10, but it was believed that other bodies lay covered in the red hot ruins of the still section. At least 50 persons were injured, many seriously.

Eight charred bodies had been taken to an undertaking establishment, and another was taken from the pile of the walls of one of the stills. (Continued on Page Three)

The two holdups, who robbed the Mortensen home last Sunday night, surprised Mortensen as he was about to enter the door. Going into the house with him, one of the men held a gun on Mortensen while the other slashed with knives and jewelry.

TWO DEPUTIES AND PRISONERS MISSING

Hunt for Officers and Men in Their Charge Broadens; Foul Play Theory Advanced.

LAFAYETTE, Ind., Feb. 10 (AP)—Search for two deputy sheriffs and their two prisoners, who disappeared Tuesday after leaving here for the territory near Ft. Posey, Indiana, 70 miles distant, was spread over the Middle West tonight, after Sheriff M. Johnson returned from a day of running down valueless clues in Indiana.

The deputies, John P. Grove, and Wallace McClure, started for Pocatello four days ago with prisoners, Samuel Baxter and John Burns, handcuffed in the center of their automobile. Nothing has been heard from them since, except a report that the two convicts were in Knoxville, Illinois, Tuesday afternoon following an escape.

Early today Sheriff Johnson received word from Sheriff W. M. McHenry, Indiana, which stated that he would find the bodies of his deputies in a quarry at Kokomo, Indiana.

SENATE VOTES 58-26

FOR CHIEF EXECUTIVE

LaFollette Resolution Carries After Four-Day Debate; Attempt to Insert "Elective" Is Overwhelmingly Defeated.

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Feb. 10.—The senate went on record today, 58 to 26, in favor of the resolution to elect the chief executive after their second term.

By this vote the resolution of Senator LaFollette, Republican, Wisconsin, declaring this precedent established by Washington and other presidents had become a part of our Republican system of government as approved after four days of debate revolving about its application to President Coolidge.

The second paragraph of the resolution commending "the observance of this precedent by the president" was rejected by a vote of 58 to 26. Senator Sen. Republican Ohio had moved to strike it out.

However, an attempt by Senator LaFollette to insert the words "only to second 'elective' terms" was overwhelmingly rejected, 73 to 8. This move which would obviously exempt President Coolidge from the scope of the resolution was supported only by Senators Bingham and McLean. Administration Republicans had contended that the paragraph reflected upon Mr. Coolidge, who they contended, might still accept "in good faith" the Republican nomination. Some Democrats have called the resolution "a bad precedent" and "a good faith" the announcement of the president that he did not choose to run.

Senator LaFollette, who said he proposed his resolution because Charles D. Hiles, New York, and "other power brokers" were seeking "in good faith" the president, withdrew the paragraph, but, he said, it was "apparent from statements by his

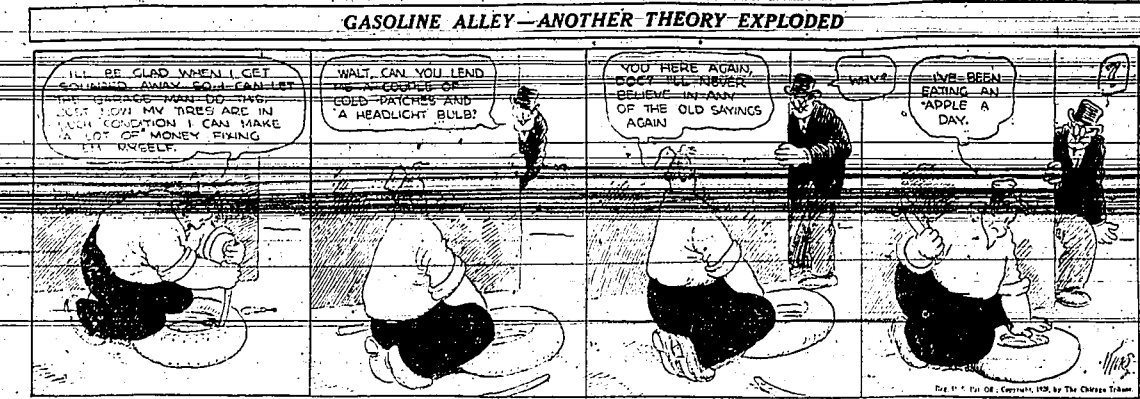

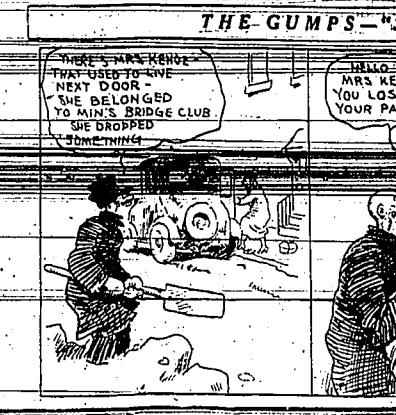
