BOISE COMPANY BUYS SALT LAKE FRANCHISE FOR U. I. BASKETBALL LEAGUE

Manager of Organization Begins Negotiations for Signing of "Tip" O'Neil, Former Skipper of Zion's Machine

(By The Associated Press) **BOISE, Feb. 11**—Professional class "B" basketball for Boise became a reality today when Ray McKelg, Boise, announced a Boise company had purchased the Salt Lake franchise of the Utah-Idaho league, thus entering Boise in the league with Twin Falls, Idaho Falls, Pocatello, Logan and Ogden.

The franchise was purchased from George O. Bell, Salt Lake, and will include the services of 12 players of the Salt Lake club last year. McKelg would not make public the consideration or the other members of the Boise company of which he is the manager, but will act as business manager.

McKelg declared he had started negotiations for the signing of "Tip" O'Neil as manager. O'Neil was manager of the Salt Lake club last year, but his services are held under contract by the Los Angeles club of the Pacific Coast league.

Boise's athletic association will assist in securing the financial success of the league by guaranteeing the sale of 1000 season tickets at \$10 each. In consideration for this help McKelg has agreed to give local club players an equal chance to make the team.

Players will be assembled here for spring training at least two weeks before the opening of the season. McKelg said he has been advised the season would open May 15 or May 22.

GIANTS TRADE GRIMES FOR CURVE-BALL STAR

Deal Catches Baseball World by Surprise; No Cash Involved; Both Are Noted Hurriers

NEW YORK, Feb. 11 (AP)—Burlingame Grimes, veteran spitball pitcher of the New York Giants, was traded to Pittsburgh today for Vic Aldridge, curve-ball star of the National league champions, in a deal that caught the baseball world by surprise.

Made on a straight playing basis with no cash involved the trade was completed in a long distance telephone conversation between Barney Dreyfus, president of the Pirates, and Jimmie Timmerly, Giants' secretary.

Both players rank high on the basis of 1927 records, which showed Grimes a much more consistent performer, the Pirates got the better of the deal but both twirlers rank among the best in the league.

Grimes who pitched his first big league game for Pittsburgh in 1916, turned in a sensational streak of 14 victories in a row last season, which started to show his best form at the start of the 1927 career, but took 50 great heights when Ray Kremer, ace of the champions' mound staff, was injured. 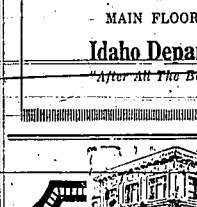
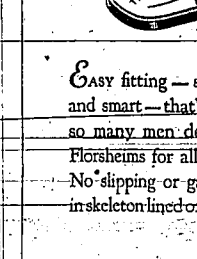

The personality of the great Lincoln appears to grow in stature as the years pass. Public esteem strengthens with the passage of time. The full extent of the great services which he performed is perhaps better understood today than at any time since the enactment of the stirring scenes in which he played so prominent a part.

It seems almost certain now that Lincoln changed the course of history through his uncompromising stand upon the slave question. Had any other candidate been elected to the Presidency at that time Civil War might have been averted for a time but the cost would have been the same.

THE GATHERING in the Wigwam in Chicago was a political convention, perhaps to a greater extent than almost any similar gathering since the politicians elected Lincoln and they did it largely upon the basis of plans which he himself had formulated.

Lincoln's own views on this phase of his activities appear to have been based upon the idea that the tools of the politician were the political leaders of the country. He was a man of complex character of a stern rock-ribbed philosophy. He hated deeds and abhorred the hypocrite. In an age when the use of flour was almost general he never drank or used tobacco. His private life was clean and in many ways was as simple as a girl, yet he attained the highest of honors.

Lincoln had toiled upon his own country a very period of intense strife. He was a man of deep religious convictions, yet he never joined a church. His sense of justice and generosity went hand in hand. He cared little for the passing current of public thought upon any topic yet he practiced a degree of adherence to his own set of principles which early marked him as a remarkable man.

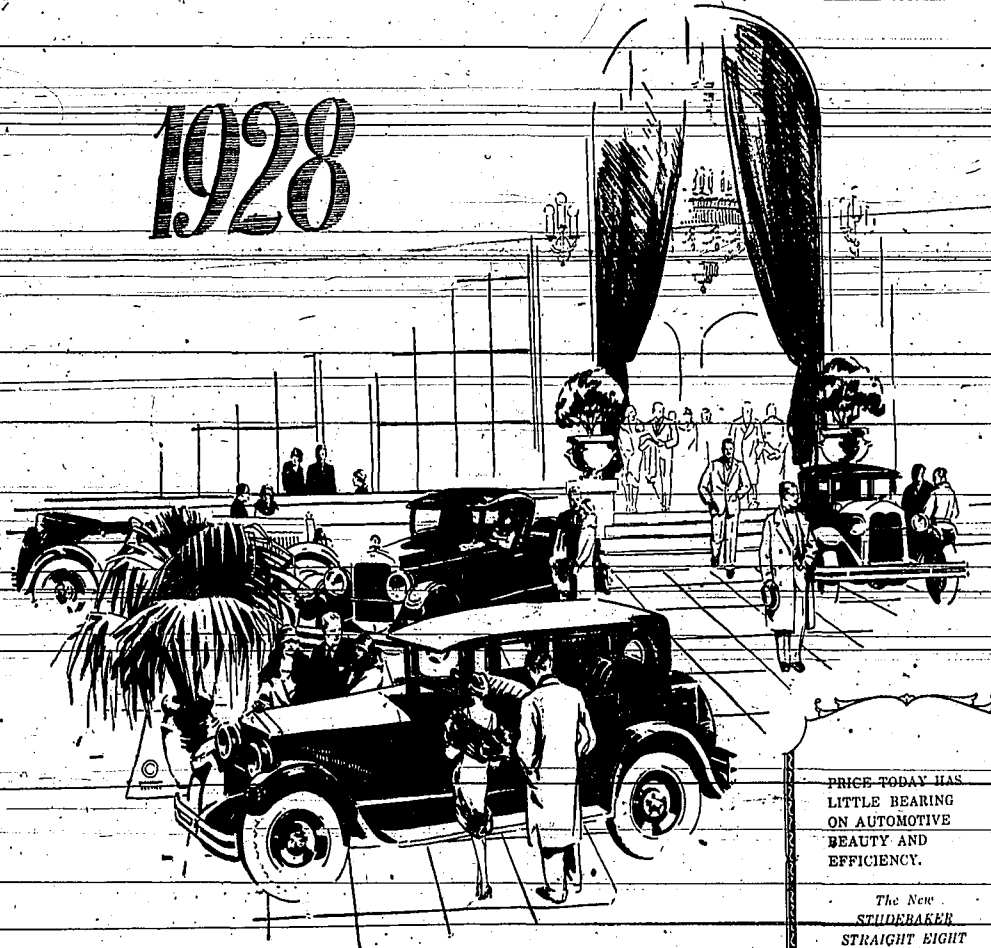

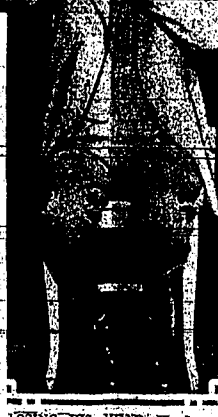

VETERAN MUSER IN LEAD IN DOG RACE

Leonhard Sepala, 60-Year Old Alaskan, Has Advantage of One Hour in Elapsed Time.

WOLFEBORG, N. H., Feb. 11 (AP)—

New England 200 Dog club Leonhard Sepala, 60-year-old Alaskan, was in the lead in a 200-mile dog race over his nearest rival, the youthful Emil St. Godard of The Fox, Manitoba.

Sepala, printed into Wolfeborg this morning after a 200-mile race over hills roads from Lacena, with a clear lead for the day of 29 minutes three seconds over St. Godard in yesterday's 56-mile leg from North Conway to Lacena he had built up a lead of 31 minutes 30 seconds. The winner of last year's event, and runner-up, the Mume serum race, ran virtually the entire 80 miles in the two days, his elapsed time being slightly under six hours.

In the first 10-mile today St. Godard, the international champion, picked up 25 seconds on Sepala as the latter's short-legged Siberian dog found the six inches of new snow hard going. From that time on, however, the Alaskan picked up steadily. On the six miles of steep hills between Alton and Gray Point, one of St. Godard's dogs fell lame, and it was carried on the sled the rest of the day.

Earl Brydges, of The Pas, held third place tonight, 12 minutes behind St. Godard for the two days. Brydges' sled had only six dogs today but his team was in good condition.

Walter Channing, Boston, was fourth, "Sherry" Husick of The Pas, fifth; Mrs. E. P. Ricker, Jr., Poland Spring, Maine, the only woman driver in the race, sixth; and E. P. Clark, Tamworth, seventh. 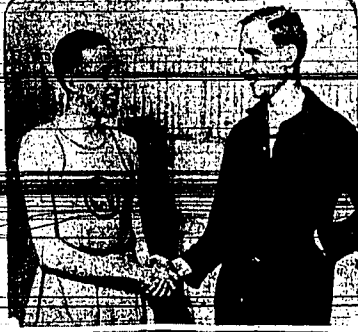

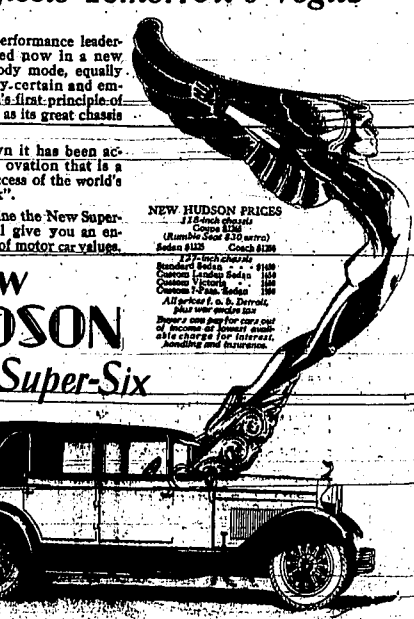

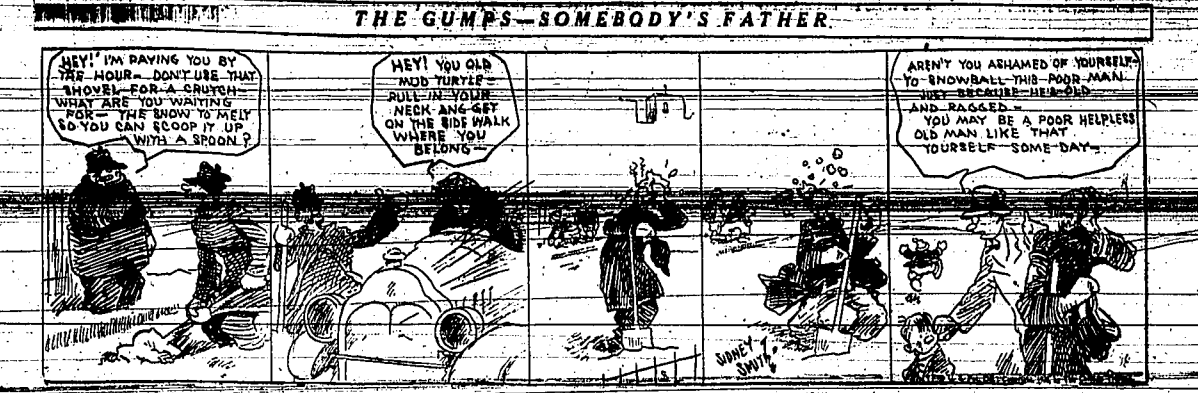
