LEGIONS PLANS FOR NATIONAL BOYS' BALL

Nation-wide Junior Baseball Program Will Bring Out 100,000 Youngsters Annually; Judge Approves Arrangement

(By The Associated Press) CHICAGO, Feb. 14.—Support of the American Legion's nation-wide junior baseball program by the major leagues was secured today when the advisory council guaranteed \$50,000 toward the program of the legion will bring 100,000 boys to baseball competition each year, counting representatives of the East and West. The plan as presented to Committee C. M. Walker, President John A. Herder, of the national league, and President E. S. Barnard of the American League by Alan Bowen, national director of the American movement of the legion, is comprehensive. It calls for the division of each state into several divisions, winners playing off for the state championship. The state champions will clash in regional tournaments late in July. Then the regional titlers will meet to decide the two teams to compete in the final. It will assure a greater interest in the national game among thousands of boys throughout the country," said Judge Lewis, "and that we have taken part in a great work today to establish the healthy growth of baseball."

This is the most comprehensive and creditable thing the majors have ever done for the boys and the better reputation of the game," said President Herder. "It will automatically result in thousands of playgrounds, under the supervision of a well-organized and patriotic body. The division of the states into regions include: No. 1—Washington, Oregon, Idaho, Montana; No. 2—California, Nevada, Utah, Arizona.

INDUSTRIAL ALCOHOL DISTILLERY PROJECT OFFERS SPUD MARKET

Meeting of Jerome and Twin Falls Growers, Bankers and Business Men Authorizes Immediate Investigation

Opportunity to market full potatoes for from \$12 to \$15 per ton through establishment of an efficient and profitable distillery project has been investigated thoroughly by Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce during the next to last meeting of a decision reached at a meeting here last evening of a number of Jerome and Twin Falls growers, bankers and business men.

The meeting was held to receive a report on the distillery project that was presented by George Panacko of San Francisco, who at a previous meeting had been requested to compile detailed information regarding a number of phases of the proposed manufacturing.

On the basis of establishment of a plant of 100 tons daily capacity, which was considered last evening, the required investment, according to Mr. Panacko's figures, would be approximately \$1,000,000. Each ton of potatoes utilized not only potatoes but fruit and molasses. It would produce industrial alcohol, carbon dioxide gas and stock feed. Each ton of potatoes, figures given by Mr. Panacko, showed, would produce approximately 30 gallons of alcohol for which, he said, there is virtually unlimited domestic market at around 45 cents per gallon.

Estimate of cost of installation of the plant operation, overhead, transportation and containers were dealt with in detail in Mr. Panacko's report, which indicated that the plant could be operated at a satisfactory profit while paying potato growers approximately \$14 per ton for their produce.

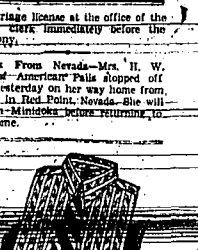
