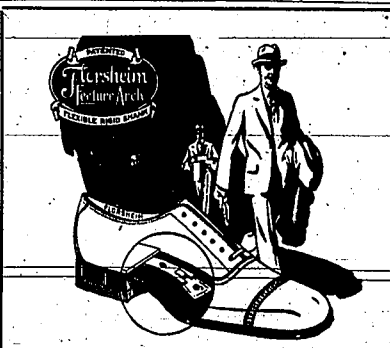

### MEETING OF BERRY GROWERS SUGGESTED

Twin Falls Man Believes Move Should Start at Once to Cultivate Small Fruit District

Suggestion that a meeting be called there by H. E. Broadard, county agricultural agent, with a view of laying plans for cultivation of berries and small fruits on limited acreages was made yesterday by W. D. Averitt, who has taken an "great" interest in the subject for several years. He said, in the event that no factors is built right away. Speaking of the matter Mr. Averitt said: "I notice there is some talk of a counting factory located at Twin Falls that would furnish a market for 150 acres of strawberries and other fruits. It seems to me as a berry grower the thing for the small acreage grower in this city and others in this section is to have small acreage farmers meet and form a program to put out as large an acreage of different berries but have enough acreage of certain varieties so they would be shipped in quantities. mine whether the bids from the canneries are equal to the net receipts from those shipped, grade considered. 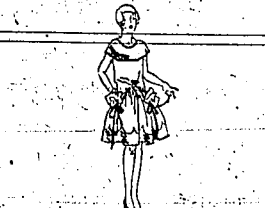

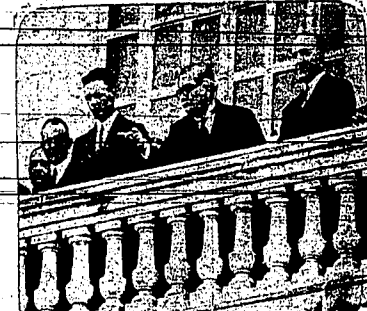

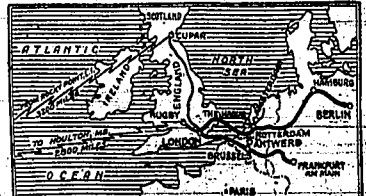

# AUTO RAGER SEEKING NEW SPEED RECORDS WITH TOY-SIZED CAR

## Used to Try to Bring Back Straightway to Americans.

(The Associated Press)

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 18.—A 16-cylinder motor built to do 60 miles an hour in first speed, 120 miles an hour in second and upward of 200 miles an hour in high, will be used in an attempt to bring back to America the world's straightaway automobile speed record.

The automobile is the creation of Frank Lockhart, famous speedway and dirt track driver, and the Stutz Automobile company. Lockhart has had personal charge of the construction for months. Painted a solid black, it will be known as the Black Hawk. A fortune has been spent in the car, the rear axle alone being valued at \$70,000.

The speedster is a toy both in size and motor compared with the English Sunbeam in which Major Regrave established his record. The motor will develop less than 400 horsepower, its piston displacement will be 120 cubic inches as compared with 2700 cubic inches in the record-holder, and it will be many feet shorter in wheel base.

The trials are to take place between February 19 and 23. Two other cars will try for the mark, one built by Malcolm Campbell of London, and another the creation of "White of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. White's record will be powered with three motors.

The car Lockhart will drive will have a wheelbase of only 112 inches and an overall length of 17 feet, 10 inches. It will be only 30 inches high except for the headrest, and the wind deflector, which will be 43 inches from the ground. The body will be only 24 inches wide at its widest part, the cockpit. The entire mechanism will be incased within the body except a dual-draglink and two steering arms, one on each side.

Every part of the assembly has been constructed either to eliminate wind resistance or to facilitate speed. Steel disk wheels encased in shields, streamlined to increase speed, were decided upon after long experiment. While the body design is extremely aerodynamic, it is not a record breaker or tests in wind tunnels at Long Island and at the army air service department at McCook Field, Dayton, Ohio.

The 16-cylinder motor is composed of two blocks of eight cylinders, set each at a 15 degree angle. There will be two carburetors, and the car will be driven only through the rear wheels.

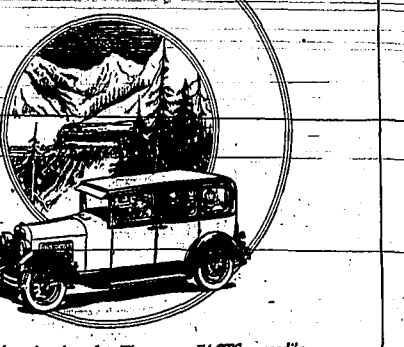

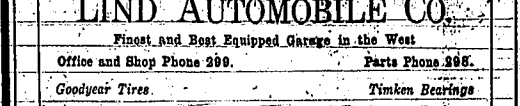

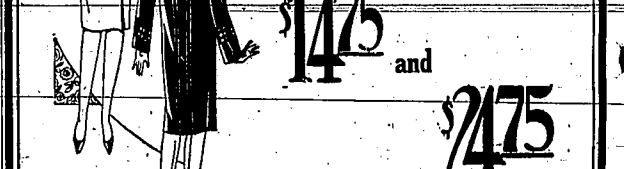
