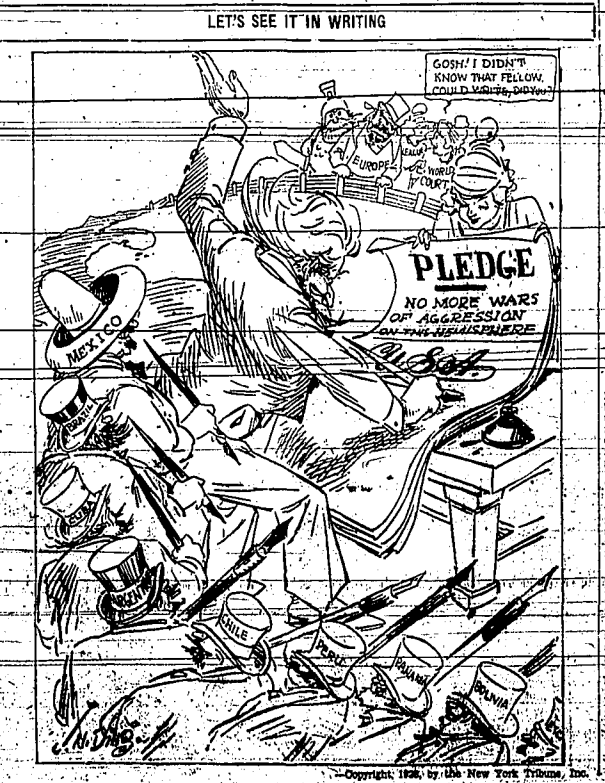

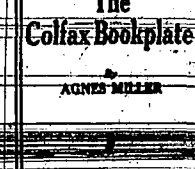

ASH WEDNESDAY TO OPEN LENTEN TIME

Episcopal, Lutheran and Catholic Churches to Observe Season of Lenten Time

Tomorrow is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten season which ends on Easter Sunday. There will be observance of the season in the Episcopal, Lutheran and Catholic churches.

At the Episcopal church service will be the recitation of the Litany of 144 saints tomorrow evening, followed by sermon by the pastor, Rev. W. H. Ward. During the following weeks there will be service on either Thursday or Friday evening to be announced later.

Evangelical Lutheran All present owing to the fact that the first pastor, Rev. M. H. Ziegler, has died. Lenten services in the Evangelical Lutheran church will be held Sunday morning. Should the pastor be able to move to Twin Falls before the end of the Lenten week day services will be held.

At the Lutheran church services will begin at 7:45 a. m. There will be evening service with sermon by the pastor, Rev. Remi S. Kreyer, or by his assistant, Rev. Thomas F. English. There will be services on Wednesday and Friday evening thereafter. The high school student Bible class will be held Tuesday evening.

Regulations Announced Regulations for fasting and abstinence were read Sunday at both masses. The following are the most important provisions of the regulations which were issued by Rev. Father Kreyer as administrator of the diocese of Boise: All persons under 21 or over 50 years of age, and those engaged in hard labor and sick and convalescent, and those who cannot fast without injury to their health, are exempt from the obligation of fasting. The law of abstinence is binding upon all those who have passed their seventh birthday. Persons bound by the law of fasting are fast only one full meal a day, but are not forbidden a small portion of food morning and evening.

Persons bound by the law of fasting are permitted to eat meat on the following days: Lent - Ash Wednesday, all Fridays, Holy Saturday and Holy Sunday.

The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat or substance made of meat, but permits the use of butter, cheese, milk and eggs, and consists of fast or abstinence made from the fat of animals.

It is permissible to take meat and fish on the same meal.

The law of abstinence holds for the following days of Lent: Ash Wednesday, all Fridays, Holy Saturday and Holy Sunday.

Persons exempt or dispensed from the obligation of fasting may eat meat at all meals on days when it is permitted.

By virtue of a special indulgence granted by the Holy See, January 6, 1926, working men and their families are allowed the use of fresh meat once a day on all fast and abstinence days throughout the year, with the exception of Fridays, Holy Saturday, Holy Sunday and the vigil of Christmas.

Persons exempt or dispensed from the obligation of fasting may eat meat at all meals on days when it is permitted.
