WASHINGTON, Feb. 22.—The strident clamor of partisanship and conflicting opinion was settled today as Congress observed the birthday of the nation's first president.

# SENATOR REED GIVES ADDRESS AT MEETING OF KANSAS BOURBOIS

## Man Who Would Force Into Platform Issues Upon Which There is Wide Division Is Strong Aid for Republicans.

TOPEKA, Feb. 22.—Democratic leaders who insist upon platform plank on which the party would be bitterly divided tonight by Senator James A. Reed, Missouri, before a state-wide rally of Democrats, without mentioning the issues or the issues to which he referred, the militant Missouri senator declared that "man who would force into the platform issues upon which there is great division is the best assistant the Republican party can have."

He said "the effort to continue and attract all sorts of classes and splinters have divided the ranks of thousands who would willingly give loyal preference to the best principle for which we stand."

Since opening his western campaign Senator Reed has said off the platform that he believed the party "larger jobs to try than possible" and that he believed the issue in his opinion was "the restoration of the public business, the cleaning up of the departments, the curbing of the sinister lobby and the restoration of honesty and decency at the capital."

When the task is accomplished, it will be time to debate and divide upon other questions.

Without hesitation, I declared that the Republican party which has for the last eight years controlled the government in this country, the most venal and the most vicious body of men by which this nation has ever been afflicted."

He said "the cry of the hour" is "to do what the Democratic party has failed to do."

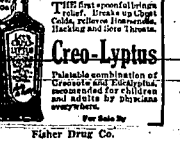

# UNIVERSITY TESTS AND ROAD BUILDERS

### Civil Engineering Department Turns Out 439 Analyses of Materials During Year

Specifications which are typical of those used in highway engineering. On the basis of these specifications the testing laboratories often find it necessary to select a proposed material as unsuitable for use because it does not meet requirements. On three occasions this winter, the laboratory found that the material was inferior to very good, about half were found to be very good, about half were found to be inferior. Recent investigations have shown conclusively that the success or failure of crushed rock surfaces is very often determined by the quality of binder used. That being true, the value of the work done in material testing can readily be appreciated as a protection in the expenditure of local and federal funds.

The neighboring states of California, Oregon and Washington during the past few years of careful experimentation and tests have found that maximum surfaces to be used in highway engineering. In keeping with this advancement, Idaho has carefully considered the possibilities of this type of construction and found it to be a most desirable method of road building.

The winter investigating the condition of existing road surfaces throughout Idaho with the view of properly applying to these roads the desired qualities. It has been found that in some cases existing roads are in good condition, but in other cases they need additional work before they can be properly applied, and in some instances the existing roads are not in a suitable condition to warrant the investment of money in doing the better knowledge has been obtained, however, and will be of considerable aid in efficiently directing the road program for 1928.

In connection with this careful scrutiny of materials, the bureau of highway engineering has been active in the engineering in charge of highway work. One of these was held at the University of Idaho in December, 1927, under the direction of Raymond Harsch, materials engineer of the bureau of highway work, who was assisted by E. B. Buchanan, materials testing laboratory, Mr. Buchanan is also a member of the civil engineering faculty of the University of Idaho.

Although the materials testing laboratory at Moscow is primarily for educational purposes, it is adequately equipped to furnish a complete testing service for building road construction. This arrangement furnishes another example of the service of Idaho by the publicly supported institutions.

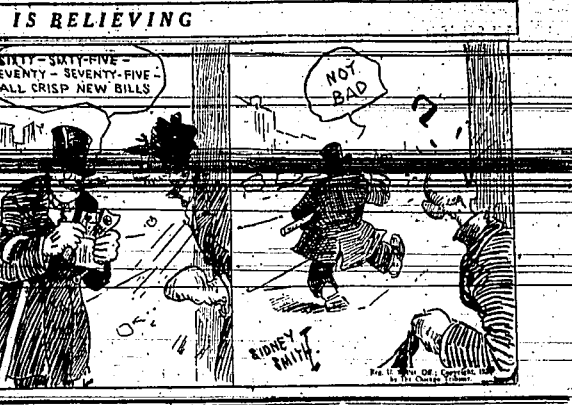

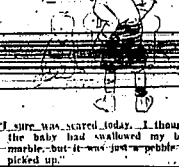
