ROBBERY SUSPECT REVIEWS STORY AND DECS FOR LENIENCY

Jeffrey's Review of Story
Here, Tells of Escape From
Life-Term in Prison.

Twin Falls county's prosecuting attorney today reviewed the story of escape from an Oklahoma penitentiary by Irving J. Jeffrey, otherwise known as Earl T. Darnell, held here in connection with a robbery. It was indicated that Jeffrey thought more favorably of holding Jeffrey to answer here to the robbery charge than attempting to return him to Oklahoma.

Jeffrey, according to deputy sheriff J. C. Swenson, after being captured last Monday at Brigham City, Utah, that he had robbed "E. E. Jones, Twin Falls, second time, from whose store he is alleged to have taken about \$200, a diamond ring valued at \$350 and four guns. Following the robbery, which took place late Sunday night, Jeffrey is alleged to have forest J. L. Linn, at the mouth of a gun to go with him in Black creek canyon where he bound and gagged the storekeeper.

Commanders Automobile
Jeffrey was captured in an automobile on Monday. He is alleged to have taken a Buick. Jeffrey is alleged to have driven the machine to Pocatello, where Orlogs said the robber forced him to leave the car and drive it to the jail. Speaking to a representative of "The News" last evening Jeffrey made an appeal to Twin Falls county for leniency in their judgment of his conduct.

Asks Leniency
Jeffrey claims to have been a victim of circumstances which landed him in the Oklahoma penitentiary for murder of which he is innocent and to have been tempted to escape because of the malicious betrayal of a fellow prisoner, while he was a trustee.

Story of Killing
According to the story, Jeffrey's parents live on a small farm near Wenoka, Oklahoma, where he was born 20 years ago. He says that in 1902, he and two companions were in Atoka county looking for work. All carried pistols. At that time they were passing through a town and two deputies who were watching the road, pointed pistols at the three men and asked them to throw up their hands. Jeffrey said they did so, or started to, when one of his companions said "they are trying to hit us." He said he pulled his pistol and told them they were deputies and at that time he and his companions stopped their hands and pointed their guns, at which he claims the deputies opened fire but did not hit them. He says that one of the deputies was wounded and dropped to the ground holding his side. One of his partners, he asserts, seized the wounded man and in the scuffle the officer's gun was discharged, accidentally killing the other officer, Deputy Sheriff C. G. Swenson.


Had Heavy Trial
Jeffrey says that he was convicted of murder in less than a month after the occurrence. He said that his companion who was captured testified against him to get out himself. He asserts that the evidence showed that death came from a wound inflicted by a .45 calibre pistol, that carried by the deputy instead of a bullet from a .28 calibre shot as he carried, but feeling was intense and he was found guilty, December 29, 1920.

Made Model Prisoner
Sentenced to serve life imprisonment at hard labor, Jeffrey said he worked out to try and make good and get a parole. He says that he had no bad mark in his first five years of prison life and asked warden W. L. Key to make him a trustee which was done a few months later.

Enter Fair Box
The women's prison at McAllister is about a mile from the men's penitentiary and they have tunnels. At first he was delighted to get outside the walls of what he calls a "pit of burning hell" but in time Jeffrey fell in with a woman trustee and began a flirtation with a woman prisoner. The prisoners had established a system of exchanging goods and Jeffrey agreed to help relay them back and forth. Finally one of the women prisoners became angry with her correspondent in the men's prison and refused to answer his epistles. The man accused Jeffrey of deserting the jailers and gave away the plan to the prison officials. Jeffrey said that he got "tipped off" on this and knew that investigation would mean that he would be deprived of his privilege as trustee, so he took his last change and skipped one day last April. He went to Denver, he says, and worked in two places there only to be recognized in both instances, once by a drummer from Oklahoma and the other by a former convict. He and a girl fled to Pueblo where for a time they had a "hot" romance. A line from that city to Los Angeles, again discovered, he and the girl "departed" again for Denver. He got in carnival fixtures. He made he got the \$1000 "take" in Denver, he declined to "split" the "take" with the girl. He said after the fair season he stored the carnival paraphernalia in Sacramento and worked at different times in brief periods in Flagstaff, Arizona; Gallup, New Mexico; and St. Anthony, Idaho. He said on each occasion he saw someone who knew him, the girl and moved on. Once after the fair season he returned, and as he was being returned, he saw the picture. One

SUGAR COMPANY TO RELEASE GROWERS

District Manager Announces Purpose to Adhere to Policy Regarding Forecast.

The Amalgamated Sugar company, it was announced last evening by W. G. Swenson, district manager, "looks with confidence" on the government forecast of unfavorable prospects for a good sugar beet crop this season in the area between Rupert and Bull.

The district manager's statement is as follows:

Lucas in Twin Falls and commandeered Berkeley Orlogs and his auto. He expressed willingness to go back to Oklahoma and return inside the gray walls. He says if he ever gets out it will be in the regular way and he will go straight.

Last evening Jeffrey wrote a letter to his mother in Oklahoma, which, following universal custom was read by the inmate's wife and pronounced entirely proper. Though perfectly cool, the prisoner did not seem unduly vicious, but looks as if he would be capable of carrying out any plan in his mind, so far as nerve is concerned.

He evidently has a common school education. His grammar and spelling are far from perfect, though the former is up to that of the average man.

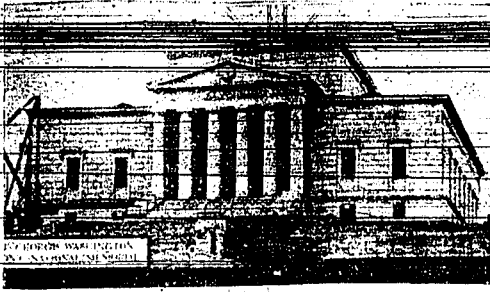

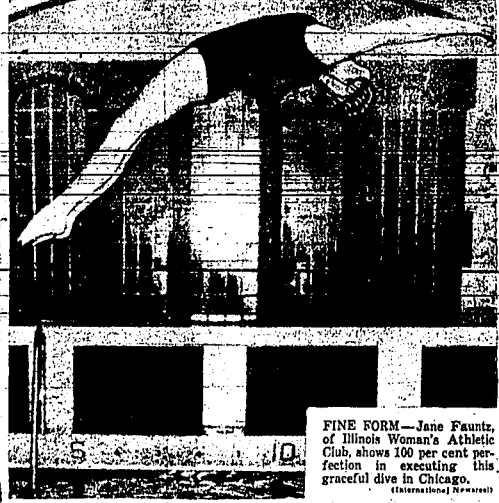

NOTE THE STATISTICIAN ANALYZING CURRENT THE TALKING PROBLEMS Chain Store Companies' Consist of Nothing More Than Concerns With Centralized Head.

(Special to The News) HATSON PARK, Pa., March 1.—Every retail store is a potential chain store if its owners desire to develop it. We hear a lot about the competition which the independent retailer must meet from the chain store. However, in the final analysis, what are these chain store concerns? They consist of nothing more or less than a number of individual stores plus centralized management. Most of the chain stores have started from one or two stores in the city. They have grown because of the organization, vision and aggressive merchandising methods. The opportunity, that, was open to them is open to every independent retailer if he has the same capability and vision.

However, do not believe that the day of the independent retailer is going. We heard the same complaint when the department store was started 40 years ago. Independent merchants feared that their business would be swept away by the big department stores. Time has shown that the individual retailer and the department store each has its place in our distribution system. Only a few years ago, many of the houses began to grow rapidly and once more the independent retailer became a mere statistic. Now, we find the big mail order house opening retail stores all over the country, recognizing that selling by mail alone is not enough. When the independent retailer has his field and the chain stores will not monopolize retailing even though they continue to grow at a rapid rate.

Chain Stores Compelled "Retailers should not feel that competition is confined to the realm of the chain stores versus the independent retailer. As a matter of fact, the chain stores themselves are meeting extreme keen competition now from each other. This is the reason why so many of the larger corporations have recently been selling their assets and putting earnings into expansion rather than disbursing heavy dividends. While the chain stores show very high sales records some of their net returns for 1927 are surprisingly low. Thus far the competition is keenest among the department chains, but it is growing rapidly more severe in other lines such as the 30 and 40 cent stores, the variety stores and between department store chains. Statistics clearly indicate that no field is free from competition today. Of course, jewelry ordinarily has a lower rate of turnover than most other lines of business. Figures, however, show a net loss of 2-10 per cent on sales for stores with a stock turn of only 5-10 times a year, a profit of 2-10 per cent for jewelers with a stock-turn of 9-10 times a year and a profit of 5-15 per cent where stock-turn is 1 1/2 times a year. The retail grocery stores have a relatively fast turnover of goods compared with other lines. It must be rapid if there is to be any profit. This is why the turnover in grocery stores is so high. Analysis of over 200 retail grocery stores showed that those with a stock-turn of only 3-10 times per year, averaged net profits of only 1-2 per cent above all expenses and return on owned capital invested. Those with a turnover of 9 times a year showed a net profit of 2 per cent and those with a stock-turn of 14 times a year a net profit of 2-10 per cent. These figures, which were compiled by the Bureau of Business Research of Harvard clearly prove that rapidity of turnover bears a direct relation to profit-making.

Special Sales Widespread "A study of reports on retail-trade conditions coming to me from all sections of the country reveals general evidence of 'special' 'stocking' sales. Retailers enjoyed a very good volume of business in December. In fact total sales were near to a record for all time. January showed some post-holiday 'slackness.' Merchants everywhere put on special 'make-down' sales to clean up inventories in preparation for spring goods. For the most part, these sales have worked with fair success, although in certain sections they have not lived up to expectations. The tendency to 'special' sales is continuous, also longer than usual, particularly in those places where unseasonable weather has retarded the movement of winter goods.

and jobs are loath to extend credit to the unit. In this connection it is interesting to note that there is one retail store for every 74 people in the city of Chicago. This was revealed by the new census of merchandising which has just been completed for 11 cities. Moreover, for these 11 cities one retail store exists on the average for every 71 people. On the face of it the situation is ridiculous. It is small wonder that the failure reports are so large. The answer to the situation is a gradual building out by natural process of selection of the unit and the survival and increasing prosperity of those retailers who have vision, integrity, and desire to honestly serve the public. The Babson chart of business is showing a considerable improvement in now registering a per cent above normal compared with 7 per cent below normal a month ago.

It has been found that early-hatched pullets will lay in a year about 10,000 eggs, valued at more than \$200, while the same number of late-hatched pullets will produce only about 11,000 eggs and leaving receipts in the season of lower prices only \$200. 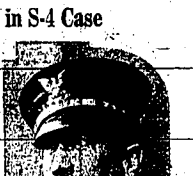

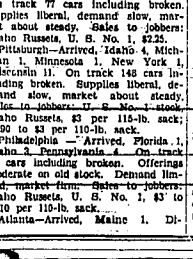

Weed Eradication Tools Are Given By Director

Warning Is Issued Against Planting Infested Lands; Methods of Fighting Noxious Growth Are Described.

Warning regarding the necessity for continuing the eradication of noxious weeds in the Twin Falls area is given by the director of the United States Department of Agriculture, Mr. J. C. Brady, who is in charge of the eradication of noxious weeds in the Twin Falls area.

Mr. Brady says that it is impossible to destroy noxious weeds effectively and raise a crop on the land while doing it.
