Boise Defeats Parma In Hard-Fought Game

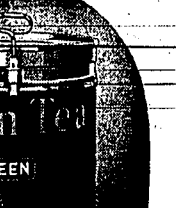

FINNISH SPRINTER

LEADS IN FOOT RACE

Ahead of All Competitors in 3400-Mile Dash to Gotham.

BLOOMINGTON, Calif., March 5 (AP)—Wille Kolheimain, crack Finnish runner of New York City, led the field of nearly 200 starters today at the end of the second lap of the 3400-mile transcontinental marathon that started yesterday at Los Angeles. Kolheimain raced from Puento to Bloomington, a distance of 34.7 miles in four hours 12 minutes and 30 seconds, finishing shortly before 12:30.

Kolheimain also paced the huge crowd of pavement-pounding in yesterday's first lap from Astor, Nevada to Puento, 10 miles. His total running time for the two laps is five hours 46 minutes and 30 seconds and his total mileage to date is 51.7 miles. Kolheimain dashed into Bloomington control station several minutes ahead of the next runner, Ed Gardner, Negro, eastern team leader.

The rest of the field was stretched out over a space of approximately 10 miles when Kolheimain finished. A steady drizzle of rain handicapped the runners from early morning until shortly before noon.

Crowds lined the highway as the huge cavalcade plugged along the route. Gardner completed the two days in four hours, 43 minutes 45 seconds. His total time for the two days is six hours 41 minutes, 46 seconds.

WILLIAM STATLER, mayor, change constitutional provisions may be amended or repealed. Political expediency may alter public opinion may shift, but a social policy that can be tested with the cold accuracy of economic law, and public safety is based on everlasting granite.

That the salient policy of free government prohibition has been in the testing period from its beginning, and has passed successfully all those tests, legal and experimental, and the test of enforcement even under adverse conditions. None of these, however, has approached the importance and significance the "let it flow" faced after all, it is a justified fear of the past is safe. The real problem has to do with the present and the future.

Enforcement efficiency, the strictest of laws, even the eighteenth amendment, carry in themselves no guarantee of the permanency of prohibition. For 25 years the main emphasis was on education. 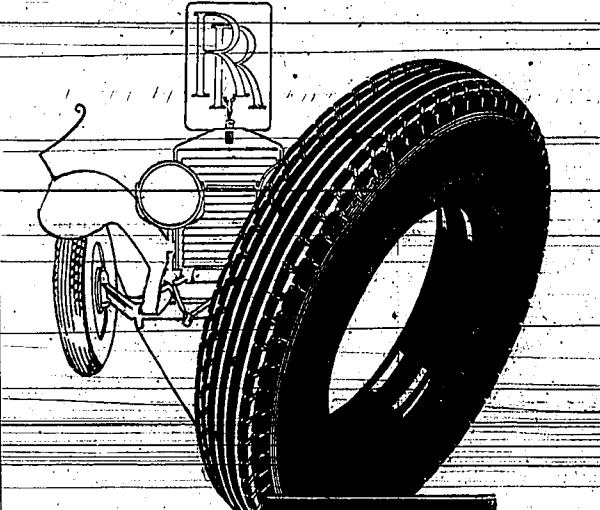

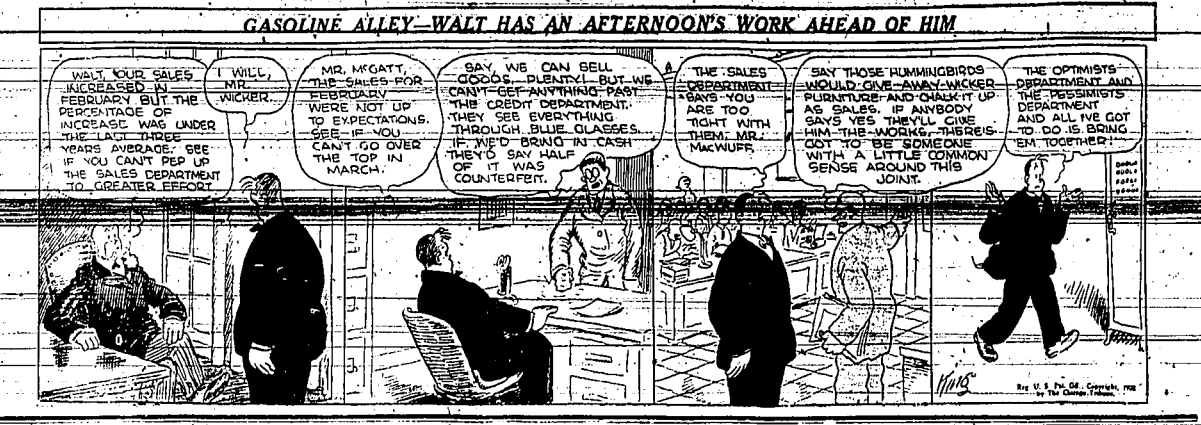

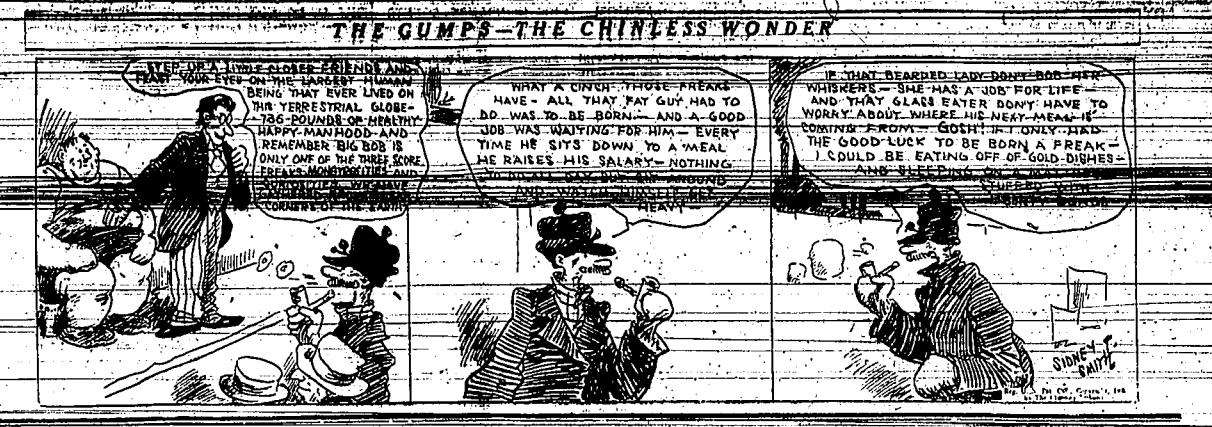

RESERVOIR DISTRICT IN GOOD CONDITION

Surplus for Interest Fund Assured; Accountant Makes Submission of Findings. The report of the audit for the American Park reservoir district for the fiscal year ending October 31, 1927, and as of January 1, 1928, which was received Saturday from the Edwin A. Wilcox company by the reservoir district board...

Will Have Surplus. The report says: The total amount of interest due January 1, 1928 was \$77,520, of which \$38,760 was paid by the trustee and an equal amount by the state treasurer. In addition to the interest paid up to January 1, 1928, we have also set up as a liability the full amount of bond interest accrued during the calendar year of 1927, which is \$38,760. This leaves a surplus in the interest fund of \$77,520 less \$77,520, or \$0.00.

Amount of Assessments. The report states that assessments receivable included 1927 assessments made for 1928 expenses, as well as an additional amount for interest and safety fund. The total levy made in 1927 is \$200,353.11 divided as follows: For general purposes of the operation and maintenance fund \$15,860.72; for bond interest, \$184,632.36; for safety fund requirements, \$23,430.03.

Trustee's Report. The report states that the trustee has not completed. Later last night the council, which in January deferred collection for the district and district No. 55, on account of delay due to condition of the streets, passed an ordinance making payments due March 28, 1928, which was the only action taken in regard to the matter. The cost of improving intersections to owners was estimated by some at \$250 a lot and by the city engineer at \$3 a lot.

Among the lot owners present were: W. W. Nicholson and T. K. Hackman. Since former city clerk Mee is not in Twin Falls and since no member of the council knew anything about the interlining of the petition, the same words were explained in petitions in all districts.

The amounts remitted by the various committees were furnished in writing by the county auditors, and all found to have been correctly accounted for by the treasurer. Considerable work has been done by Mr. Johnson and Mr. Laddon in checking up collections in some of the districts.
