DISTRICT SCHOOL TAX LEVY INCREASE TO BE DETERMINED BY VOTE

Superintendent Smith Says: Election Is Not Bond Issue.

"Electors of Twin Falls independent school district should not consider the special election to be held next Friday with the bond issue recently discussed," said W. B. Smith, superintendent of the Twin Falls schools, in an interview yesterday. "Friday's election is not a bond election. No election will be held this year."

"Should Friday's election fail to provide for the seven mills increase, Twin Falls will have a five months' school year," Superintendent Smith stated. "Available funds exclusive of the proposed increase in the levy will provide finances for the operation of the district schools for five to six months and no longer," asserted the superintendent.

"Increase Is Necessary"
Friday's election has as its purpose the authorization of a necessary increase in the tax levy providing for the operation and maintenance of the Twin Falls schools during the fiscal year 1928 which begins July 1. Elections of this type have been held in Twin Falls regularly for many years.

"Taxes will not be raised above the millage which has been voted by the Twin Falls electors since 1921," Superintendent Smith pointed out. "In reality, the taxes will be lower in view of the fact that enrollment is increasing while the cost of maintenance and operation of the schools has remained relatively constant."

"Voters Determine Increase"
According to the Idaho state law, school boards may levy a tax of three mills and may also levy an increased valuation of the district. If this amount is inadequate for the upkeep of the school within that district, an additional tax of seven mills may be levied which approved in a special school election by a majority of the electors residing in the district.

"Twin Falls independent school dis-

tricting points to be kept in mind by the voters as they cast their ballots" 1. Twin Falls has an increased enrollment this year of 250 students, and more are expected next year. The additional levy which is asked is specifically the same as has been granted in the last seven years. In view of increased enrollment, taxes are in reality somewhat cheaper. 2. Friday's election is not a bond election for the construction of a new school building but is to provide the necessary funds for the maintenance of the present schools.

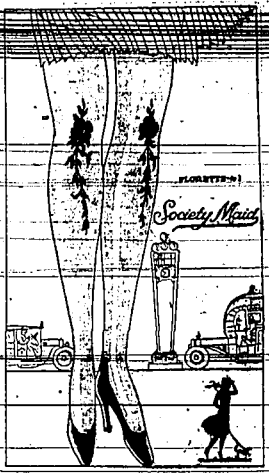
