BRITISH FACING WAR
IN MIDDLE EAST
PREPARE FOR RAID
Dispatches Near Head of Persian Gulf Paint Different Picture; King of Hejaz Is Planning for Visit to Mecca.

(By The Associated Press)
LONDON, March 8—British officials with characteristic English calm tonight viewed the march by King of Hejaz in Arabia with less concern. But dispatches from the district near Mecca and the Persian gulf pointed a different picture.

Official observers gave out a report that Ibn Saud, King of Hejaz and Sultan of the Hejaz, was planning a visit to Mecca. King pointed out that the Wahabites are not friendly toward the holy city of Mecca.

Anxious for Subsidy

Dispatches from Basra, Iraq, showed the British troops in the Persian gulf for possible early raid on the frontier. Patrols have been strengthened and more air and reinforcements moved into the territory.

CONGRESS DIRECTS A RETENTION TO FARM RELIEF LEGISLATION

That Measure Pending on Developments in House; Old Equalization Fee Involved.

By The Associated Press WASHINGTON, March 8.—While the house agricultural committee today is to vote on the farm relief bill in executive session, the committee action of the senate committee in approving a similar identical measure, was formally reported today to the senate.

The proposed assistance for agriculture, the 1928 version of the widely known McNary-Hughes bill, now takes place in the senate's long life of pending legislation. Action by the senate is not expected to materialize, however, until more progress is made by farm relief by the house, since priority is held by two other major problems—tariff—wholesome and flood control.

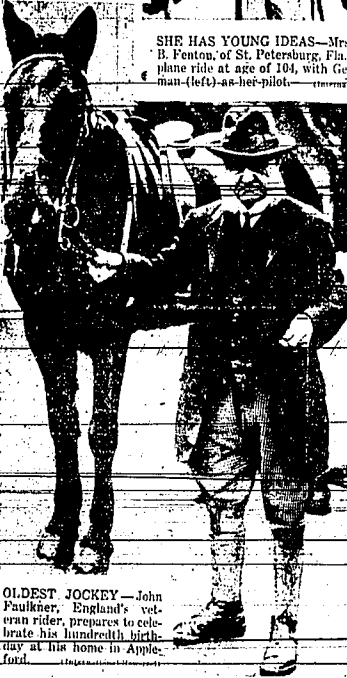

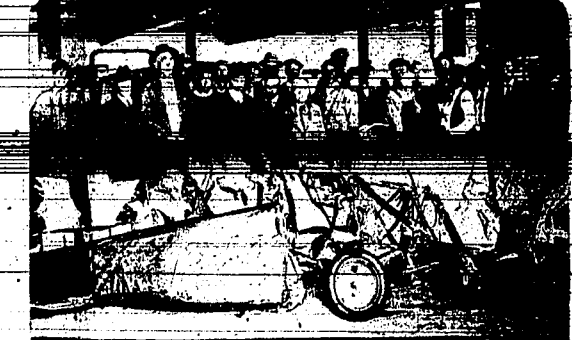
