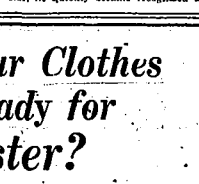

diving had made 500 dives to the ocean bed, 102 feet down.

With favorable weather on sight the salvage crew had worked nearly all last night—lowering and making fast the pair of pontoons in addition to the Falcon, the submarine tender, the mine sweeper Maddox, the tug Wanderer, Sagamore and Iuka, the submarine S-4, sister ship of the S-4 and the destroyer Mary and the Mahan were gathered at the scene.

Eight air lines had been attached to the compartments of the S-4 from the Falcon during the operation and two to each of the pontoons a total of 20, aggregating 6000 feet in length.

The Falcon saw the submarine and pontoons an air pressure of 225 pounds per square inch. During the raising an auxiliary air line was attached from the submarine S-4 to the deck of the Falcon.

As soon as the raising was completed Captain Henry Harvey of the Falcon started to get out the towing lines.

The Sagamore and Wanderer took the lead and the Falcon followed the submarine. The tow on its way to Boston shortly after 5 o'clock.



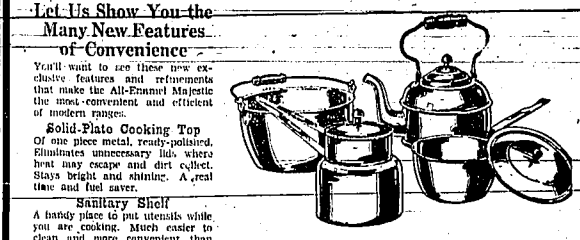

It is expected that Buhl, Piler and Rock Creek boards will be the Twin Falls board of county commissioners is practically out of the road building business, its immediate interest in the subject is less acute than that of other bodies to which the work has been transferred.

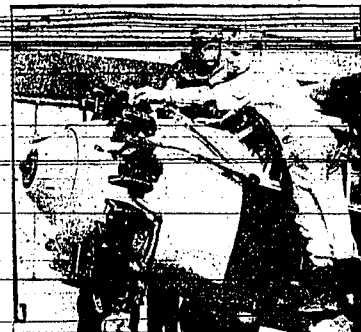

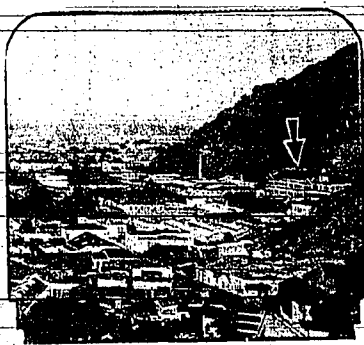

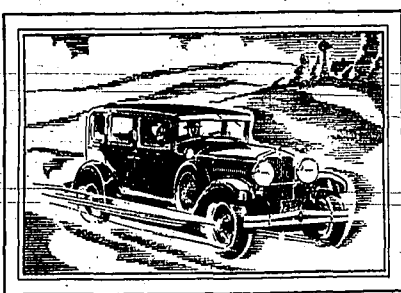

James L. Shumway, wealthy cafe owner and close friend of Hall, who also was reported kidnaped last night and was later reported negotiating with Hall's abductors for his friend's release, denied he had anything to do with effecting Hall's release.

Hand of Gunmen—Police attributed the kidnaping to a band of gunmen known to them as the "purple gang" which for several months had been preying upon downtown saloons and "blind pig" owners. Police said this gang has been using the same tactics employed last summer by another gang which kidnaped several prominent running horse operators and collected ransoms from \$200 to \$10,000.

Hall was held captive by the kidnapers less than 24 hours. He was taken from his home in a fashionable residential district yesterday by two men who posed officers who said they wanted him to view a robbery suspect at police headquarters. A short time later his wife received an anonymous telephone call demanding \$10,000 ransom.

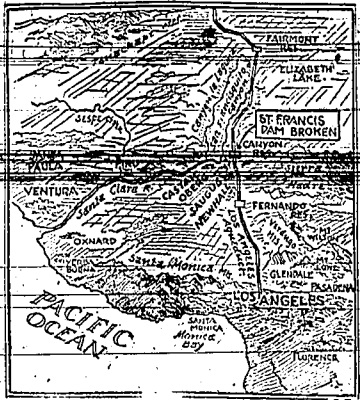

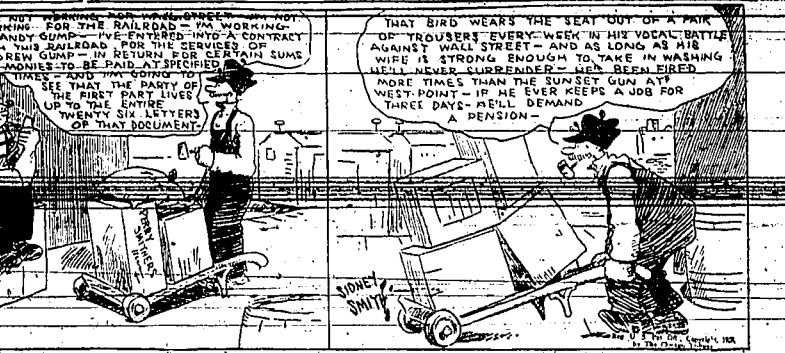
