JUNIOR HIGH STUDENTS SCORE WELL IN ENGLISH

Series of Standard Examinations Given Eighth A Grade, Foot Pupils Hold for Study

Twenty Twin Falls junior high school students made 30 or less errors on the English test given recently in which 30 senior high students averaged 30 or less errors. 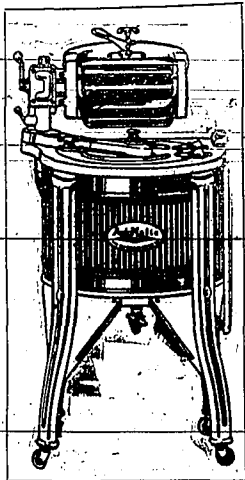
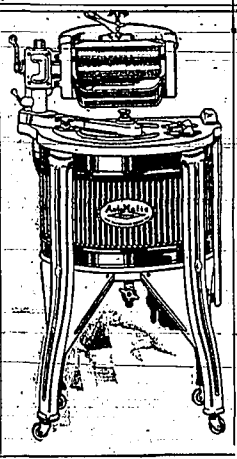

WHAT TO DO
The law of the jungle versus the laws of Christianity appears to constitute an interesting and unusual note in the controversy now raging between the soft coal operators and their employees in the West Virginia fields.

THIS PHASE OF THE inquiry is being brought out at the hearings being held by a Senate investigating committee, which is examining into the situation in an effort to aid in the settlement of a strike situation which has long been a serious one.

Striped to the bones, the situation discloses the same old stumbling block in the way of amicable adjustment of the difficulty. On the basis of six days work a week good wages can be paid to all the miners employed. But a six day week, or even a five day week, is insufficient to provide employment to all the miners.

SCHOOLBOY PATROL TO ORGANIZE HERE IN GRADE BUILDINGS

Automobile Association Will Inaugurate Movement to Stop Accidents Among Children; Endeavor is Nationwide.

Through the cooperation of W. B. Smith, superintendent of schools, and Ralph E. Leighton, chief of police, there will be established in Twin Falls within the next few days a schoolboy safety patrol similar to that which the American Automobile Association is establishing in 930 cities throughout the country.

The patrol will consist of one chief and four members from each of the grade schools. The junior high school will be organized later. The boys will be picked by school principals according to scholastic training, deportment and ability.

The primary purpose of the patrol is to teach children the danger of nature's forces in the highway. They will act as junior traffic officers, will assist schoolmates in crossing streets safely, caution drivers of cars to slow down, or where needed, to stop cars until the children have passed.

The school boy patrol has been organized several years and is spreading over the country. Where tried it has, it is stated, greatly reduced the number of automobile accidents.

Speaking of the matter, Mr. Beauchamp said: "The school boy patrol movement is one of the most important steps taken to save the lives of school children, and it is believed that the patrol offers the most direct means of educating boys and girls to protect themselves and to lend a helping hand to others and to impress the adults with the importance of observing safety precautions."
