GOLDEN BEAR STATE GIVES 28 VOTES TO NEW YORK GOVERNOR

Returns From 7561 of State's 8753 Precincts Give Smith 127,101; Reed and Walsh Get 98,614; Hoover 528,433

LOS ANGELES, May 2 (AP)—Election returns from all 26 states and the District of Columbia, in yesterday's presidential primary are as follows: Hoover 528,433; Smith 127,101; Reed 98,614; Walsh 52,843.

SAN FRANCISCO, May 2—California was definitely on record today in the matter of her presidential choice. Despite the fact that it was May Day and the first day of the fifty-second session of the state senate, the senate yesterday afternoon elected Governor Alfred S. Walsh, of New York, to bear the nomination to the White House. This day the delegates pledged to the nomination at the Houston convention more votes than they gave to his opponents put together. Hoover 528,433; Reed 98,614; Walsh 52,843.

WHISKEY VOTES This indicates the possession of the form will send to delegates with 26 votes to Holston bound to vote for Smith. The victory in the state which was not a surprise, although the victory in Los Angeles, regarded as the stronghold of the "dry" and the location for the election was expected. BOISE, May 2 (AP)—An order dismissing Edward R. Dampier, Rupert lawyer, from the bar of the Idaho supreme court here today was handed down by the high court. Dampier was disbarred by the commission following his conviction on a charge of selling someone through the mails. The court said that an act of a disbarment could be interpreted as such only under the Idaho statute. The statute, however, specifically mentions sending of letters through the mails, this act could not be interpreted as such for the purpose of disbarment.

Ray Barton will be the featured speaker in the program. He will speak on 'The University of Life'.

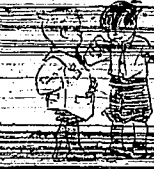
