ALLEGED CARRIERS OF MENINGITIS BUG HAVE DISAPPEARED

Mussman Family Believed to Be Possible Agent in Spreading Disease Has Not Been Located Since Leaving Here

The mystery of the Mussman's, reputed carriers of germs of cerebro-spinal meningitis, which Dr. D. Weaver, Twin Falls county physician, believes were responsible for the cases in this county, is unraveled so far. Jacob Mussman and family left here it was supposed for Idaho Falls, on the same day that the general quarantine was raised after two children alleged carriers, had received two treatments, and have not been heard from since. They stated before leaving that they were going to Idaho Falls. Dr. Weaver wrote to the county health officer of Bonneville county that they had not been heard from since. He also wrote a similar letter to the state health department, but has heard nothing from either since. "Meningitis" unconfirmed cases place them at various other locations.

Said to Be Carriers Carriers are, speaking generally, people who carry germs of a disease and may give it to others without being in any way visibly afflicted themselves. On the Friday before the quarantine in Twin Falls was raised, Dr. Weaver who had been tracing the origin of the trouble in this county stated that he had discovered two children in a family after treatment, to be carriers. Under direction of the state health department, he treated the family twice. This family had moved from Oregon to Castledale, where five cases of spinal meningitis developed. Three more cases broke out in Buhl shortly thereafter. The family did not live in Buhl, though the proximity of Castledale may have resulted in the disease spreading to the neighboring town. Dr. Weaver said after the family had moved here and started to school, a son of S. Claude Stewart was attacked. The family admitted, it is stated, that the disease broke out in different places where they settled, but did not think they were responsible. They had lost two children of the disease at one time.

Discusses Mussman Family

Dr. Weaver stated that in the case of the Mussman family, he had discovered the fact that two of the children were carriers on the Friday before they left town, and reported at once to the state department of health, seeking for instructions. He received a reply from Dr. F. W. Almon of the department telling him to treat them, but without quarantining them, to appoint a quarantine.

Are Treated Twice

Dr. Weaver said he treated the children twice and warned them not to go to school. When the general quarantine was raised in Falls, until they had received the required treatment. They told him that they were going to Idaho Falls from there. Dr. Weaver stated that he had written the health officer at Idaho Falls that the family had started for that city, but had also written to the state department, but had not received any reply from either. He said that he had acted on the instructions received from the state department. He did not quarantine the family because he did not feel that he had a right to do so without further instructions.

May Be Quarantined

Asked in regard to whether in his opinion a person who is a carrier of a disease, but who was not "visible," could be quarantined, C. W. Witham, county attorney, said yesterday: "A fundamental principle is that a carrier of a disease denotes a person who carries the germs of an infectious disease on his or her person and as such may, and often does, spread the disease to others. It is my opinion that such a person is a person 'affected' within the practical meaning of the law, and again the premises where such a person lives are premises where such a disease prevails within the meaning of the law, and such person or premises subject to quarantine, even though the disease has not manifested itself, some malignant form in that person."

Mr. Witham said that he had not heard of the Mussman case until after the family had left the city, supposedly for Idaho Falls.



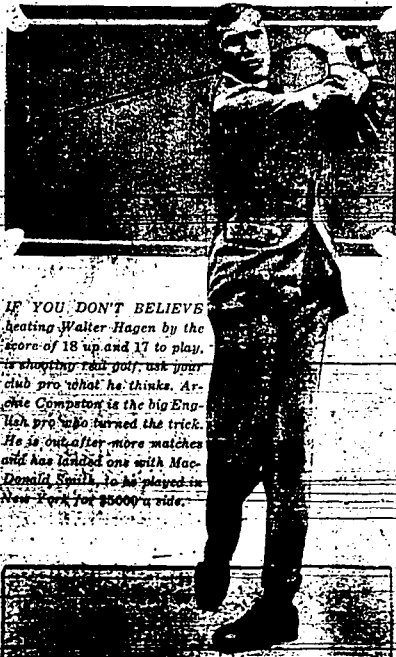

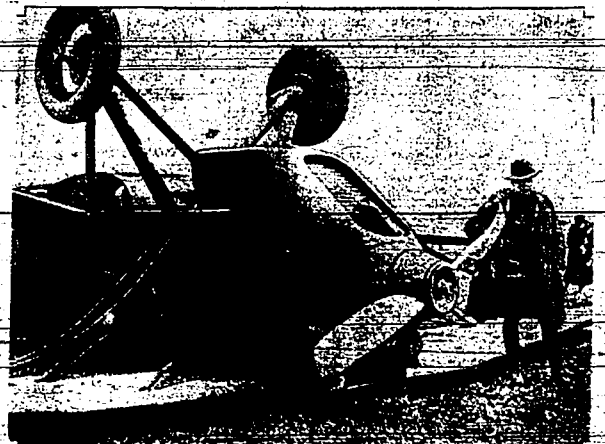

ENGINEERS DISCOVER NEW FOOD SOURCE IN REALM OF ANCIENTS

Back in San Juan River Basin, Among Ruins of Extinct Race, Science Will Try to Do What Prehistoric Tribes Attempted.

(By The Associated Press)
WASHINGTON, May 8.—Back in the San Juan river basin, amid the ruins of an ancient age and the hydraulic engineers' purpose to do by modern science what a prehistoric people sought to fashion in their crude and untrained way.

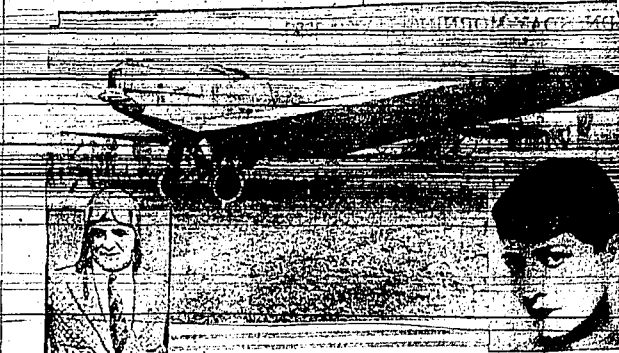
Today, as in the centuries long buried with their dead, the chief problem is water conservation. The region has a scant supply of rainfall, stretching inland from the Colorado river through Arizona, Utah and New Mexico. There, archeologists say, among the desert plains and steep-walled canyons, the Hohokavi people lived 2000 years before the Christians. Later came the cliff dwellers, to leave behind ruins of a civilization unthought of by the relics of its art.

Credit, Cliff Dwellers
To the cliff dwellers, since the first Spanish explorers tried to find in 1541, is given credit for the staunch construction of hummocks which still remain. They were planned by primitive engineers, built of rock and reaching from bank to bank across the narrow rivulets and streams, they held the flow of water and built up tiny reservoirs as a guard against months of drought.

Whatever the property of the present-day dam, still, the importance of the region as the seat of a forgotten habitation, its present utilization for mining or agricultural purposes is not extensive, owing partly to its remoteness from the main transcontinental routes. It is replete with natural beauty and the magnitude of its ruins indicates that as one of the best settled regions in the United States it has a picturesque part in human affairs.

Fifteen hundred years after construction of the singular irrigation system, the federal geological survey has made an investigation of the water resources of the area and, in the report, has indicated that the importance of the region as the seat of a forgotten habitation, its present utilization for mining or agricultural purposes is not extensive, owing partly to its remoteness from the main transcontinental routes. It is replete with natural beauty and the magnitude of its ruins indicates that as one of the best settled regions in the United States it has a picturesque part in human affairs.

Farmers on Lake Manitou Isle Dedicate Land to Raising Rye

SOUTH MANITOU ISLAND, May 8.—This island of the northern great lakes, surrounded by the blue waters of Lake Michigan, is the realm of rye. Here dwell George Hutzel and his sons, the King and Crown princes of rye producers. Six times they have won the rye championship of the International Hay and Grain shows.

Even the rye is royal. Twelve miles from the mainland, South Manitou has no problem of transportation. The wind does not carry alien pollen to this home of the blue-blood strain, and all the farmers have agreed to plant only one kind of seed.

Romantic circumstances have made South Manitou the pure-rye center of the western world. Twenty years ago J. A. Rosen, a young Russian, was a student at Michigan State college. He obtained from his native Rye a small quantity of rye. It was planted by the late J. A. Sprague, plant breeder at the school, and a long series of selections, replantings and watchings began. When Dr. Sprague decided he had a high yielding grain, he sent it out to the

best farmers of Michigan to be tried. The seed immediately responded to Michigan conditions and during the war a million acres were planted to "Rosen" rye.

Ten years ago Professor J. P. Cox of the Michigan agricultural college visited the island, seeing a place where Rosen rye might be grown as an undiluted strain. Farmers accepted his proposal to plant the new variety and no other kind.

Houston Land Bank Loans \$173,000,000 - Loses Only \$15,000

DAVES PAYMENTS WORK TO FRENCH ADVANTAGE

PARIS, May 8 (AP)—French farmers, who failed to learn to profit from the Daves payments, now take quite a different view. It was brought out in the meeting of the National Association of Farmers here.

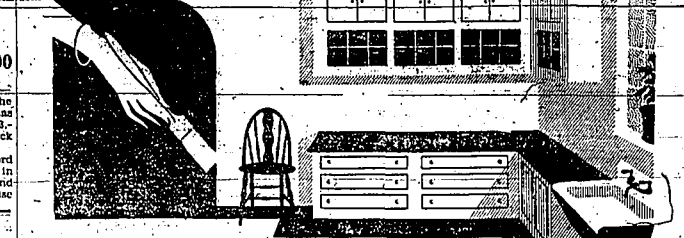
BAMBOO AS FARM CROPS INTERESTS SOUTHLAND

SAVANNAH, Ga., May 8 (AP)—Local experiment with bamboo are declared by growers to have demonstrated the importance of its culture in the south. There is a market for bamboo in the market, not the edible varieties. A grove near here has attained a height of 60 feet. Some shoots of the edible bamboo are used as a vegetable and salad. Producers say most bamboos will survive winter frosts in a grove and are used for the pulp of paper. The light poles make a great variety of farm purposes, while the heavier timber is used in the manufacture of furniture, building material and paper.

For the last nine years there has been a federal ban on the importation of live bamboo or seed from foreign countries to keep out the dangerous plant diseases and insects.

A treatise presented to the National Academy of Sciences by J. C. Walker of the University of Wisconsin reveals that resistant lines of cabbage have been developed by repeated mass selection of surviving plants...
