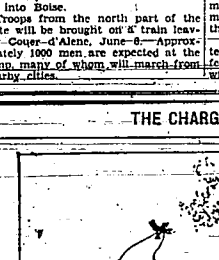

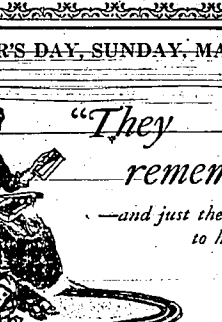

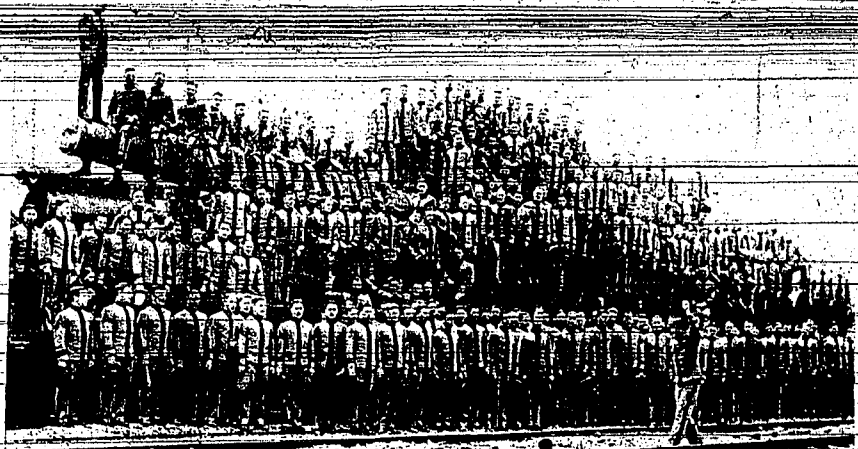

Links Glandular Disturbances With Pro-Criminal Tendencies

NEW YORK, May 10 (AP)—A new study for the diagnosis of criminal tendencies attributes glandular deficiencies to a certain type of blond, curly-haired giant with the peachy and cream complexion to be distinctly dangerous.

The scientist, Dr. Walter Dill Scott, of the medical department of the University of Pennsylvania, is the author of the study, which is being published in the journal of the American Medical Association. The study is a part of a larger program of research into the relationship between glandular activity and criminal behavior. Dr. Scott states that the study was based on a series of experiments conducted in a laboratory. He found that the glandular activity of individuals who were prone to criminal behavior was significantly higher than that of individuals who were not. 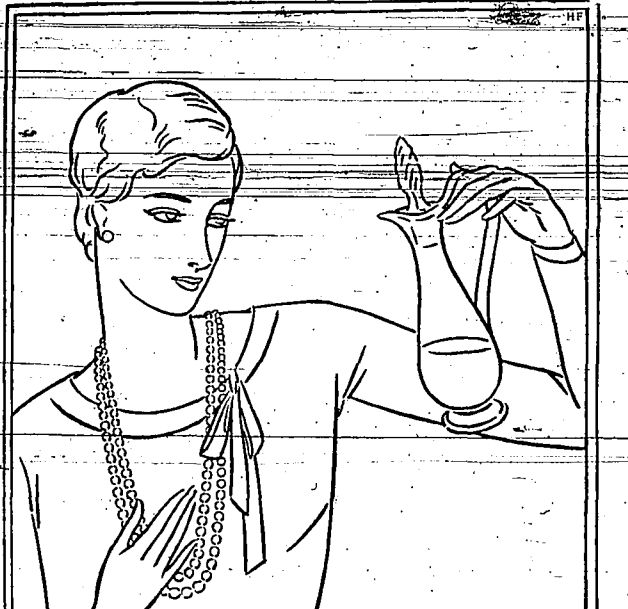

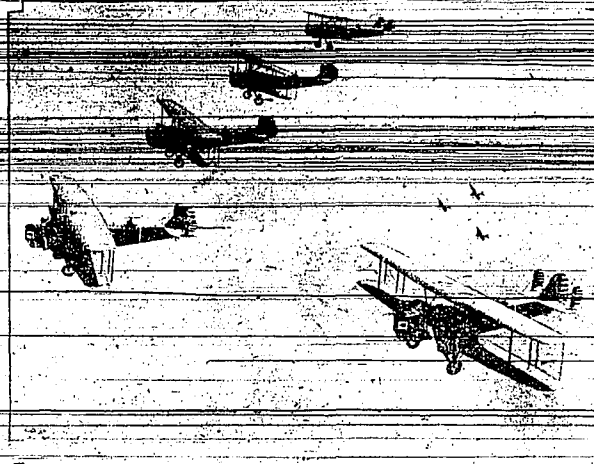

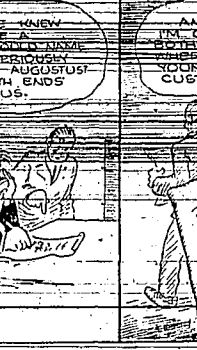

BATES DEBATE TEAM WILL EXTEND FIELD

Aggregation of Forensic Arts Ready to Meet All Clubs in English-Speaking World.

WASHINGTON, May 10.—The Bates college, which is ready to go on its first tour across the Atlantic for the first time, now is ready to take on the forensic forces of the English speaking world.

A team composed of Charles H. Quaint and John F. Davis of Portland and Marvin L. Ames of Springville, members of the Bates class of 1928, will sail for London in six months' time. In each of the principal English speaking countries, they will engage in forensic trials and arguments in courts of logic and argumentative skill.

Bates was the originator of international-intercollegiate forensics in 1908 a Bates team met in London against that of the Queens university team at Kingston, Ontario. Since that time, Bates has met in London, in 1911, an English team, has made the westward trip each year to make a Bates team. In 1925, the graduates of Bates toured England and Scotland.

The itinerary of this year's tour calls for one debate with the College of the Pacific at Stockton, Calif., before the team embarks from San Francisco May 24.

Due at Honolulu May 30, the team will go into action at the University of Hawaii. On June 18, the three men will settle down in Auckland, N. Z., for a six weeks tour. They meet in succession teams from Victoria university, Canterbury college, the University of New Zealand and University of Otago.

Another schedule of four debates is ahead of them when they arrive at Sydney, Australia. July 1, they will meet the University of Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide and Queensland are the opponents. Arriving at Durban August 21, the travelers will meet four South African teams. They will then go to Grahamstown and the University of Cape Town.

The debates with Oxford university and Cambridge university in England, about October 18, completes the itinerary.

The proposals suggested for debate are: That all treaties infringing upon the sovereignty of China should be abrogated; That efficiency has become a deplorable fetish in modern life; That democracy is a policy that should be replaced by the policy of protecting capital invested in foreign countries by force of arms without a formal declaration of war; and That the American policy of prohibition is desirable.

Museums, Art Groups Plan Cooperation

WASHINGTON, May 10.—(AP)—A move for closer cooperation between American artists, scientific and educational circles, was made at the joint annual meeting of the American Association of Museums and the American Federation of Arts here today.

"It will be the first time the two organizations have met together," says a full commission director of the American Association of Museums. "This is the first time an attempt has been made on a large scale to get together the people interested in arts, sciences and museums."

President Coolidge will address the meeting and is expected to urge the importance of coordination of art and museum organizations in the intellectual education of Cleveland and Buffalo, the two cities considered to have gone farthest in the new movement for coordination will be represented by the program.

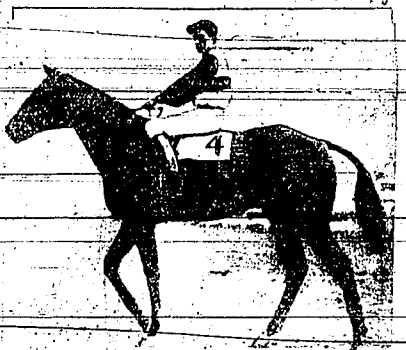

Salmon River Board Considers Purchase of Deep Creek Water

Canal Company Directors Study Indicates Important Advantages to Be Gained Through Acquisition of Adjacent Property and Rights

Salmon River Canal company directors have under consideration the purchase of Deep Creek water rights and adjacent property and rights to the main canal. The purchase of the Deep Creek water rights and adjacent property and rights to the main canal is being considered by the directors of the Salmon River Canal company at their next meeting June 5.

The proposition as presented by the Deep Creek company at a meeting of the Salmon River directors last Tuesday evening, July 2, 1927, was to purchase the Deep Creek water rights and adjacent property and rights to the main canal for \$200,000. more water than would be occasioned if the banks were kept wet. Small fluctuations occasioned by orders for water to be turned off or on could be taken care of by the water impounded in the Deep Creek reservoirs, and small fluctuations in the water supply in the main canal would be taken care of by the water impounded in the Deep Creek reservoirs.

A rule adopted last year by the Salmon River Canal company limiting the change in size of head-runs to 10 per cent in any one day of water flow, would be effected by the use of equalizing basins. It is estimated that as much as 2 per cent saving in the annual supply of the canal company could be effected by the use of the Deep Creek reservoirs as equalizing basins. However, if only one per cent could be saved, this saving would represent 100 acre feet of storage at the Salmon dam.

Conclusions Summarized

To sum the matter up, it appears to the board of directors of the Salmon River Canal company that the 100 acre feet saved by using the reservoirs as equalizing basins, plus the 600 acre feet saved by eliminating the canal loss in making domestic runs, would show a saving of 1700 acre feet of their present water supply. The cost of saving this amount of water would be \$20,000, the price placed on the reservoirs and dams by the Deep Creek company approximately \$10 per acre foot. In addition to this, a further improvement in Salmon River water rights would be made by acquiring the runoff of Deep Creek at \$20 an acre foot.

The reservoirs are situated to the west of the Salmon River project and about 10 miles from the main body of the Salmon River project.

Directors Investigate

Directors of the Salmon River Canal company have for some months been investigating the benefits that company ownership of the Deep Creek reservoirs and water rights. In the discussion which followed, the following facts were presented by the members of the canal board and the superintendent of the canal company:

That the reservoirs of the Deep Creek Land and Water company are adjacent to the Salmon River project and are favorably located for operation with the Salmon River system, without further construction other than enlargement of the gate structure, transfer of the water of Deep Creek is impounded in two storage reservoirs with an aggregate capacity of about 1500 acre feet. Water is held in storage by means of two garden dams, the upper or larger having a concrete core wall extending from the rock to the top of the structure. The diversion works for taking water into the distributing system of the Salmon River Canal company is located below the lower reservoir, but above the bifurcation works of the Salmon River project.

Two Distinct Benefits

Two distinct benefits to the Salmon River Canal company would be obtained by the purchase of the Deep Creek property:

One would be the water right in Deep Creek. No data is available showing the water runoff for the past five years out of the past 13, the reservoirs have filled and overflowed. A recent survey shows the capacity of the reservoirs to total 1500 acre feet. In 1917, it is estimated that the overflow caught up in the Salmon River canals and distributed through the system totaled between 15,000 and 20,000 acre feet. In 1921, another year heavy runoff, the Deep Creek reservoirs were full and began to overflow on March 2. From then on through April and into May 10, 1921, the water runoff was continuously in amounts ranging from 15 to 100 acre feet. On May 18, it began again and continued practically the balance of the month.

Cuts Distribution Losses

Under the proposition offered by the Deep Creek company payment at the rate of \$20 per acre foot would be made for the average runoff of Deep Creek for the next five year period. It is taken for granted that the average runoff into the Deep Creek reservoirs is at least 1500 acre feet, the Salmon River Canal company would benefit to the extent that this increase in its water right would be available for delivery at a point 12 miles closer to the Salmon reservoir. If this water were used in making domestic runs, and at other times when small amounts of water were run
