At the same time, they are furnishing the driving power for new alignments that may have far-reaching effects when balloting actually begins.

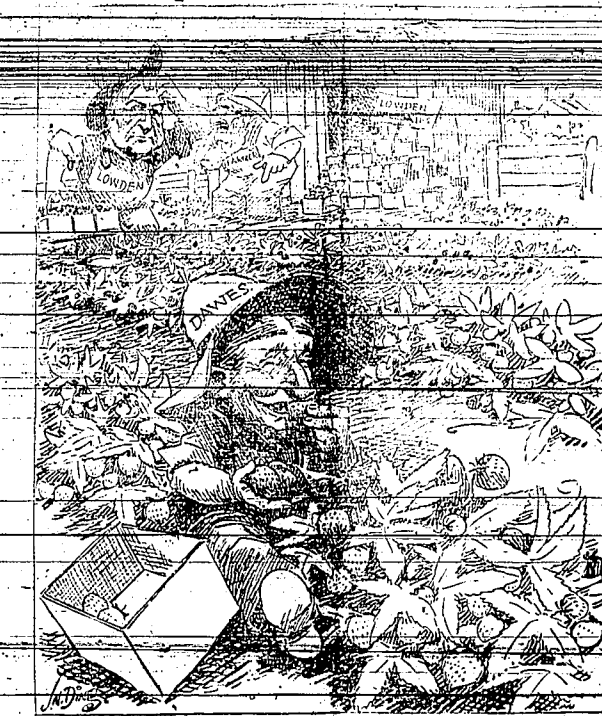

BUSINESS WOMEN TO JOIN IN DEDICATING FALLS ILLUMINATION

Idaho Power Company Project for Lighting Famous Cataract Worked Out in Connection With Convention Order.

Months ago the project of illuminating the falls by a series of colored flood lights on a steel framework now under construction by the Idaho Power Company.

Grand opening of the illumination of Great Shoshone Falls will be held on the evening of May 24 from the occasion of the meeting of the Idaho Business and Professional Women's convention. Arrangements for participation by the women's organization will be made by the Twin Falls Chamber of Commerce, which has charge of preparing the program and publicity for entertainment incident to the lighting up of the great entrance to the total cost of the permanent lighting system built by the Idaho Power Company at its own expense, will be \$12,000.

Site for the necessary structure connected with this achievement of the company on the south side of the river, was donated by "Tom Adams" of Omaha, who owns the land around the falls and who has taken great interest in beautification of the premises. Mr. Adams has donated the highway and rights of way. Twin Falls highway district will construct a modern highway from the road to the ferry over to the falls but this cannot be done before the illumination ceremonies take place.

Vast Candle Power

The illumination will be similar to that in use at Niagara Falls during the past three years, and will be furnished by 100,000 candle power of combined candle power of 25,000,000.

Work on putting in the necessary structures and equipment for the illumination of the falls is now in progress and will be complete before the opening, at which time it will be dedicated to the use and benefit of the public.

The permanence of the structure is indicated by the fact that the lamps will be mounted on a structural steel frame anchored to the side of a rock promontory which projects from the canyon wall. The frame will be covered with reinforced concrete, which will provide a roof for the lamps and will extend back on the promontory, where there will be a platform 10x24 feet, with a walk extending out on the point, all furnishing a fine view of the falls. The lamps will be located on the south bank of the river some distance below the falls and slightly higher than the crest. There will be an iron railing and highway mesh fence four feet high for protection of spectators, enclosing the platform. A short stairway from the

BURRELL TRACING MENINGITIS CASES

Commissioner of Public Welfare Visits Twin Falls on Inquiry Regarding Family.

David E. The health authorities here did not receive any further word regarding them. However, letters were received from them from Idaho Falls by Mrs. Edith Gray, principal of the local school, asking for grades in order that their children might attend school in their new home. Dr. Weaver has notified health officers of Bonneville county to the effect that this family had moved there.

Mr. Burrell will here yesterday called on Mrs. Gray and others in regard to them and will investigate the case on arrival in Bonneville county to determine whether the germs were completely eliminated by treatment received from the county physician here.

SUPREME COURT ORDERS DISCHARGE OF RECEIVER

The supreme court Saturday, on application of the Deweller Mercantile company, directed District Judge W. A. 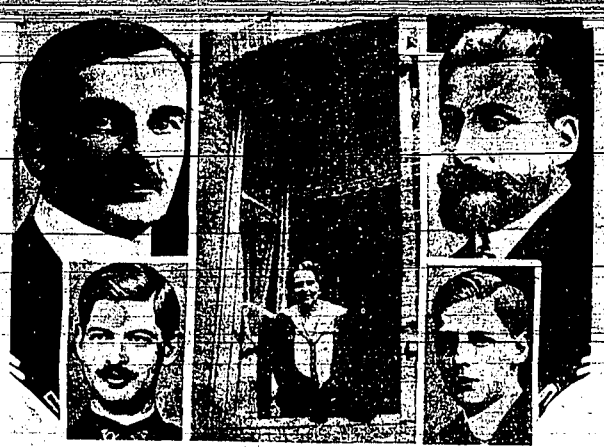

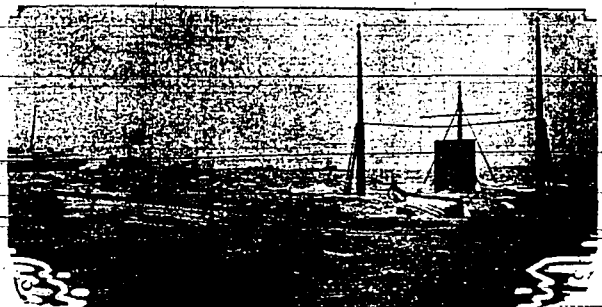

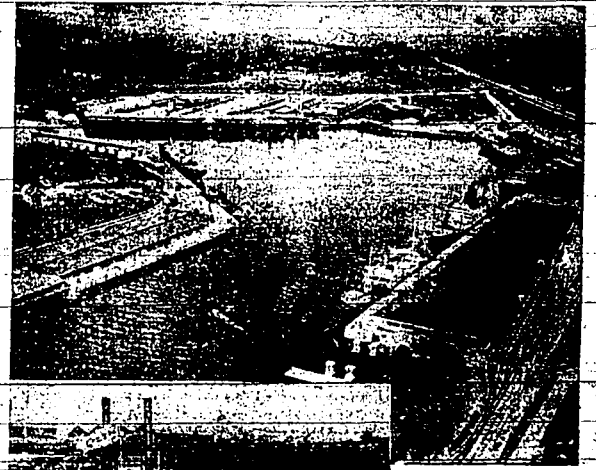

HOUSTON TO PARADE
ACHIEVEMENT RECORD

Excursions Down Famous Man-made Port One of Attractions for Convention Visitors

HOUSTON, Texas, May 12.—Visitors to the Democratic national convention at Houston, in June will be given an opportunity to inspect the city's famous man-made port, connected with the sea by a channel 60 miles in length and deep enough to accommodate seagoing vessels, according to plans of the committee on entertainment now being perfected.

Excursions down the great waterway connecting this inland city with the Gulf of Mexico, constructed at a cost of more than \$20,000,000, and inspection trips of the great manufacturing and shipping industries, valued at approximately \$150,000,000, are being arranged.

Visitors to this national political gathering will see one of the most romantic and outstanding port achievements in history. In 1914 a channel 25 feet deep was dredged in the Buffalo Bayou from the Gulf of Houston. In 1925 this depth was completed to 30 feet permitting the largest ocean-going vessels to dock at the city's public wharves.

Record of Progress
The first export cargo was shipped from the port in 1920, total tonnage that year amounting to 1,210,000. Today 73 steamship lines and 18 railroads serve Port-Houston. 1787 vessels docked at its port during 1927, and total tonnage handled was 12,003,497, a gain of more than 900 per cent over 1920.

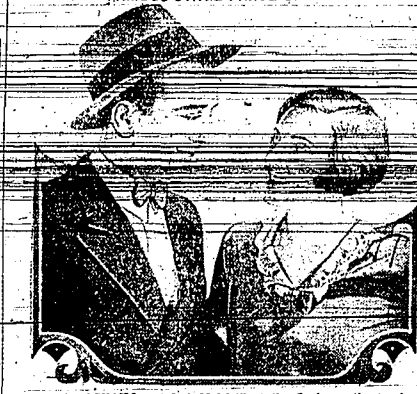
Products manufactured and exported included oil products, cotton lumber, salt, sulphur, rice, cotton mill products, oil well machinery, and steel products.

The trip down the channel on one of the excursion vessels, which will be in service during the convention, will reveal a most outstanding outlay of industrial projects, many of which have doubled their facilities in the past five years.

Berthing facilities for 16 vessels are provided at public wharves, while private facilities will take care of 32 additional vessels.

The waterway is lined with great cotton handling and manufacturing plants, oil refineries, chemical plants, cement plants, grain elevators, iron foundries, well equipment and manufacturing plants, and salt, sulphur and lumber shipping docks, all established since 1915. On the lower channel below the Houston industrial

WHEAT MARKET REELS HEAVILY DOWNWARD

Revision of Government May Crop Report Adds 7,392,000 Bushels to Crop Production.

Chicago, May 12.—Battered by an unexpected revision of the wheat market reeled heavily downward today in late trading. Revision of the government May crop report added 7,392,000 bushels to the probable yield of domestic winter wheat, and brought about a series of rushes to the selling side of the market.

Closing quotations on wheat were unsettled, 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 net lower, with corn 1/4 to 1/2 decline to 1c advance, and provisions unchanged to a setback of 10c.

Wheat finished at nearly the day's bottom level. Changes in the government May figures made the forecast of winter wheat production 462,700,000 bushels as compared with 470,000,000, the 1927-28 figure.

On the sudden downward plunge of wheat values which took place, the market fell to 4 1/2 a bushel under top figures that were reached earlier in the day.
