NATIONALIST DRIVE ON PEKING DRAWING NEARER TO CLIMAX Two-Year Rule of Chang-Tso-Lin, Manchurian War Lord, Approaches End in Historic Capital City of Northerners.

(By The Associated Press) LONDON, June 1—The ever changing drama of the Nationalist drive on Peking, which began at Canton more than two years ago, has since swept steadily northward, appeared approaching a climax today.

From Peking, Tokyo and Shanghai came advice today that the two-year rule of Chang-Tso-Lin, Manchurian war lord, in the historic capital city of Northerners, approached its end.

While he made no specific reference to any plans that he might have for his own departure from the city for Mukden, stronghold in Manchuria, the diplomats present generally interpreted his speech as in the nature of a valedictory.

Although the army representatives of the Nationalists slowly but surely have won power and influence of the north, a possible change in the government of Peking was suggested in advice coming from London from China.

# LOUGHRAN CLINGS TO CROWN; CHALLENGER LOSES BY DECISION

## Casey Old Ring General Wards Off Wildcat Thrusts of Latozo

### He Holds Grip on Division Title; Fast-Fistio Exhibition

(By The Associated Press.)  
TOMMY LOUGHRAN, former general, tonight, warding off the wildcat thrusts of Pete Latozo, once a champion, clinched his victory by decision.

Both men fought the fight in a heavy-weight crown but the fight was not a close one.

The Scranton club fighter might have won the championship of the 175-pounders if his swiftness and long overhand swings had been confined into a space of 17 rounds. But against the Philadelphia ring master, rating the pace cleverly and saving his greatest efforts for the final rounds, Latozo was too good.

Even so, it was a fine display of class and all-round ringmanship through the last five rounds. Latozo, who had been in the ring for 10 years, that brought Loughran home the winner, ready for his last fight on June 21 at the Polo grounds. Pete could not meet the pace of those final rounds, and the shade he earned through the first 10 sessions faded into semblance of a "rounder."

ROUND ONE—Latozo drove into the champion but Tommy tied him up and clipped a left and right uppercut into Latozo's head. Pete bared in with the looping left of the side of Loughran's head. The challenger piled in continually but Loughran stabbed him with long lefts hooked him with short right and left punches in the clinches. Both fought carefully and were content to measure the progress of each other.

ROUND TWO—Tommy took the offensive of left hooks to Latozo's head. Pete drove the champion to a neutral corner, clove his right deep into Tommy's body and drove three left hooks to his chin. Loughran fought viciously, reaching the challenger with solid lefts to the head. Pete lashed an overhead right to the chin. He could not break through Latozo's guard. He boxed his head continually into short lefts and rights.

Tommy boxed the coal miner carefully and was dancing out of Pete's charges at the bell.

ROUND THREE—Latozo tore through the champion's defensive to plant a long right on his chin. Latozo stuck his chin out inviting an opening and Tommy covered it with left and right hooks. Loughran stabbed the challenger continually with his left as Latozo bobbed in, occasionally planting his left hook on Tommy's head and body. Neither brought his right into play as they bounded around the ring, snapping lefts to the head. They were slugging while the referee cheered them at the bell.

ROUND FOUR—The battle of left hands continued with neither doing much. Latozo switched to a right on an overhead right that dusted the champion's chin but Tommy drove right back to even matters with a short, probing attack on the body. Tommy took to the right, clipping Pete twice on the chin. The minutes went wild at the blow and poured all over the champion with both hands flying wildly into Tommy's protecting arms. Pete managed to drum home on Loughran's head with a left and right hook just before the gong.

ROUND FIVE—Tommy's left worked briskly on Latozo's features as the champion boxed the Scranton boy carefully. Pete crowded Loughran into a clinch and smashed both hands into Tommy's head. Blood oozed from a gash in the champion's chin. Pete's left dug into Tommy's body. Pete crowded the champion to the ropes and drew blood from Tommy's lips with three solid left hooks. A right and left to the head, wild overhead strikes, shook Loughran at the bell.

ROUND SIX—Tommy was more careful than ever as Latozo treated his light heavyweight majesty with utter disdain and directed another volley of swings into Loughran's head. The barrage opened a cut over Loughran's red visage. Latozo piled into him furiously, smashing him about the head on the ropes and hooked Tommy with overhead rights when the landed again in mid-ring. Latozo's looping left hand swooped again around Loughran's guard to the head

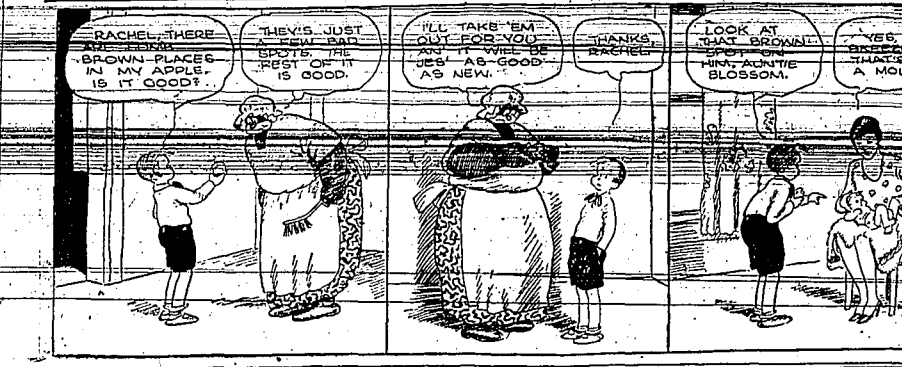
