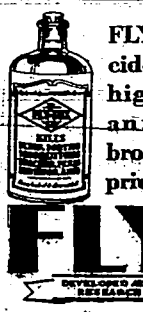
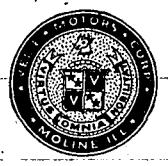

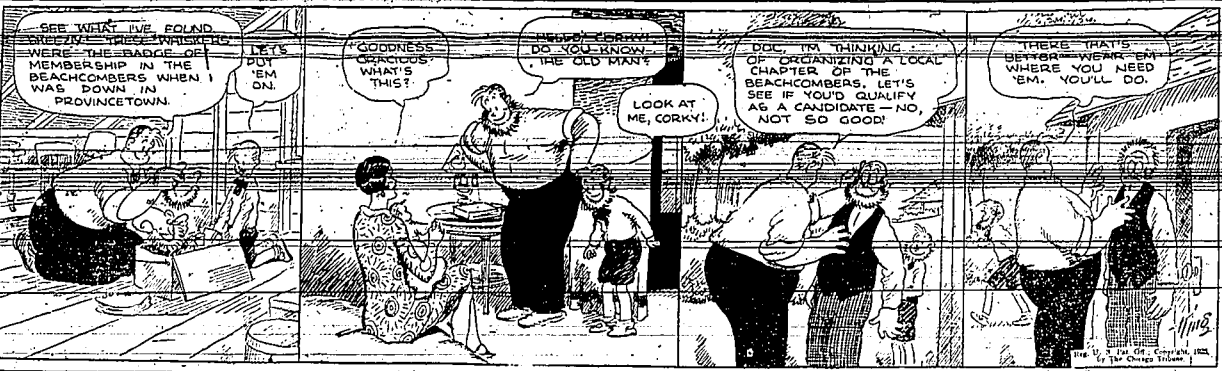

LAWYERS WAX WARM IN BATTERY ACTION

County Attorney and Counsel for Defense Grow Eloquent Over Cheries and Punches

The trial in the probate court yesterday when O. W. Witham, prosecuting attorney, and Turner K. Hackman discussed the question of the guilt or innocence of J. D. Earhart, charged with committing an assault on Alfred Scheel, a young man whom Earhart is alleged to have struck after charging him with attacking cheries.

Earhart was arrested Saturday on a charge that he struck Scheel and on another charge of striking Ralph Cowham. He pleaded guilty to the first and told fully to the second and Judge C. A. Bailey withheld the sentence in the Cowham case pending the trial yesterday.

Scheel, Cowham and two other young men testified yesterday that they drove past the Earhart farm on their way to the Twin Falls Rod and Gun club traps to pick broken "birds" at which to shoot. They said they picked some cheries while standing on the running board of their car and ate them. Later, they said, Mr. and Mrs. Earhart drove up and Earhart got out of his car, carrying a gun in one hand. They said he struck Cowham and struck at Scheel but did not think he struck him. Mrs. Cowham said her husband struck at Scheel and may have hit him one light blow near the top of the head.

Mr. Hackman tried to introduce evidence to show that Earhart had been pestered for a long time by his cheries, and that Earhart had in vain appealed to the officers for protection. The court held that this was immaterial. Mr. Hackman declared that as a man was entitled to use reasonable force to protect his property, Mr. Witham replied with considerable heat that Earhart told him that he did not see the boys take any cheries and that the boys had stolen his cheries. He said if Earhart had come in and offered any evidence to show that the boys had stolen his cheries he would have issued a complaint for him to sign. Mr. Hackman retorted that Mr. Witham now had the confession of the boys themselves and demanded that something be done. Mr. Witham insisted that the boys were not taking cheries when found and that the trees were on the public road. Mr. Hackman declared it was a private road. Judge Bailey said he was not sure whether the trees were on a public highway or along a private road. He could not see that the boys themselves had taken cheries would warrant the defendant in going on property which did not belong to him and attacking them physically, even though the trees were along a private highway on his land. He would take the case under advisement until the afternoon, he said. Judge Bailey said he was familiar with the situation and knew that the defendant had been harassed a good deal.
