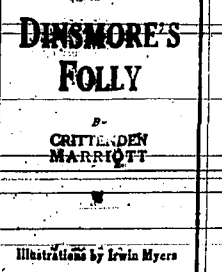

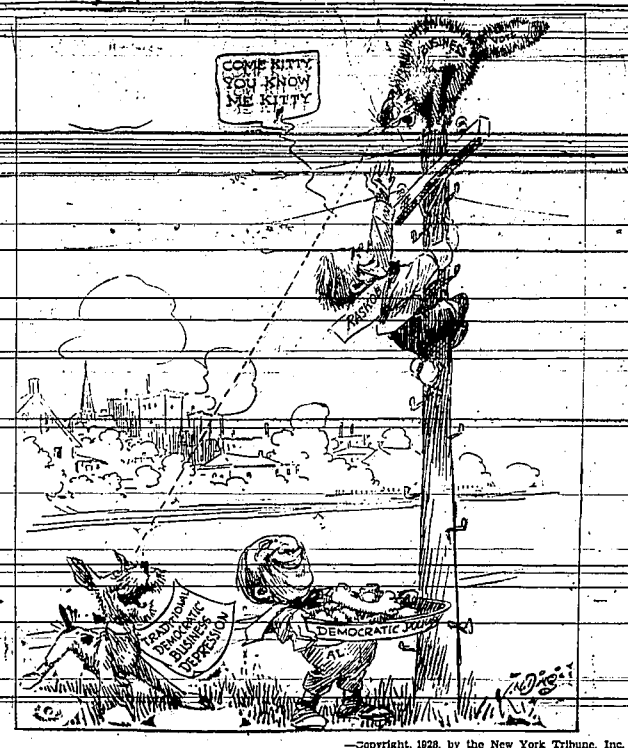

QUOTATIONS ON GRAIN SUFFER NEW SETBACK

Big Wheat Receipts Help of Lower Prices on Bread Cereal; Favorable Crop Reports

CHICAGO, July 30.—Wheat market underwent a decided setback in price today, largely as a result of big receipts of wheat and also of corn. United States wheat supply showed nearly 9,000,000 bushels increase for the week and the corn visible supply an increase of 1,000,000 bushels.

Chicago wheat prices were unsettled, 1c to 1 1/2c net lower, with corn 7/8 to 1 1/2c off, oats 1/2c down, and provisions varying from a slight decline to a slight advance.

Favorable crop reports for wheat and corn alike supplemented the bearish effect today of increased supplies. Minneapolis, Kansas City, St. Louis and Omaha had wheat today against 2700 cars a year ago, and Minneapolis announced that newly planted wheat in the Northwest was also at hand that cutting of spring wheat had progressed up to the North Dakota. Unexpected downturns in wheat quotations at Liverpool ascribed to larger shipments from North America, counted as an additional bearish influence.

Rust Not Spreading Lessening likelihood that either the Canadian wheat crop or domestic wheat would be unfavorably affected by rust was a standing feature of today's wheat news. Authoritative advice (current as to any special interest in United States wheat) and confirmed their purchases to 500,000 bushels of Canadian wheat.

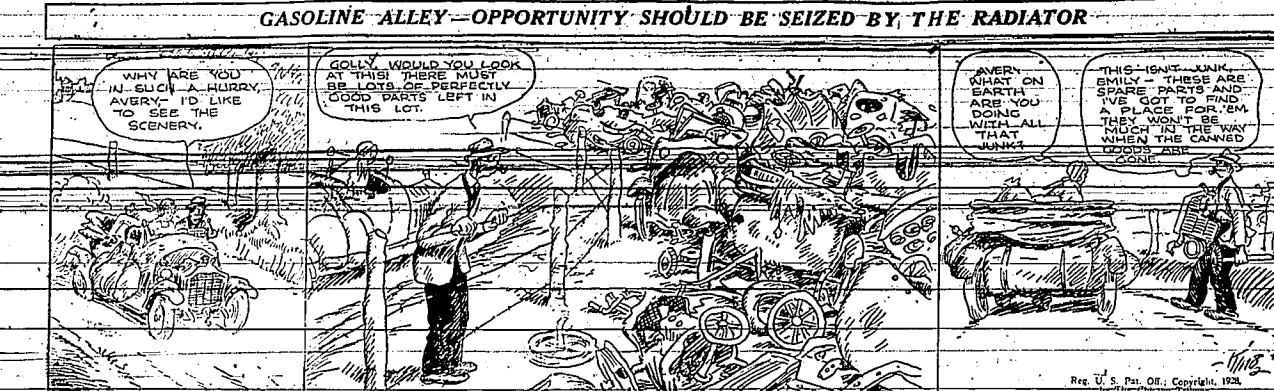

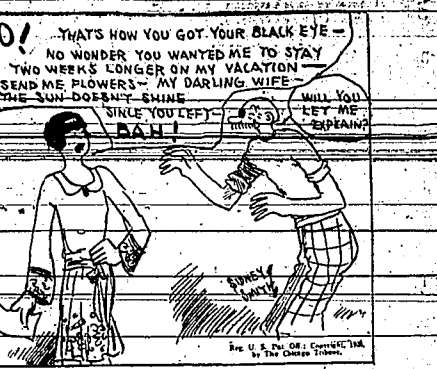
