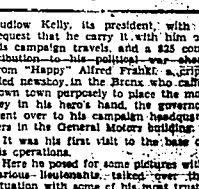

NEW YORKER SAVES AMERICAN ATHLETES ON OLYMPIC TRACK

Ray Barbuti, Iron-Legged and Stout-Hearted Son of Empire State, Wins 400-Meter Race in Sensational Exhibit in n.

(By The Associated Press) OLYMPIC STADIUM, Amsterdam, Aug. 3.—Ray Barbuti, the iron-legged, stout-hearted son of little old New York and Syracuse, saved America from rout on the Olympic track this afternoon by winning, in a manner seasonally dramatic, the 400-meter race. It was only by a margin of eight inches that Barbuti staved off the spectacular closing rush of the Canadian, Jimmy Tall, but it was sufficient to send the Stars and Stripes up the victory staff the first time for a footrace and to give the wildly yelling American contingent the biggest thrill of the entire games.

In the 6000-meter race, which was the day's only other final event, Nurmi's calm acceptance of defeat and his refusal to battle it out with Ritola in the attack or extend himself otherwise man-sufficiently to beat Edwin Wente, Sweden, for second place stunned the crowd. Spectators as well as experts anticipated a repetition of their 10000-meter duel, but Nurmi, removed the prospective thrill by jogging in second, letting Wente sprint to the taps first by 40 yards.

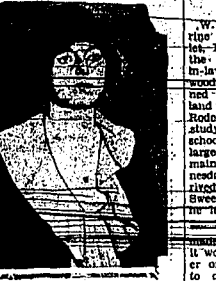

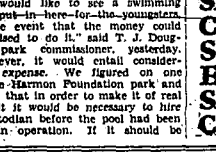

OLD SETTLERS HEAR STORY OF PROGRESS AT ANNUAL MEETING

Idaho's Governor Honor Guest Of Twin Falls County Pioneers Past and Future in Topics Under Discussion.

More than 300 members of the Old Settlers society of Twin Falls county assembled for an annual picnic on the county fair grounds at Piler yesterday to spend the day renewing acquaintanceship and discussing the development of the state in general and of the Twin Falls country in particular.

Governor H. C. Baldrige, of Idaho was an honored guest. In his address he urged carrying out of the work of the pioneers through use of American capital in development of American resources, and emphasized desirability of development of water transportation.

Other speakers included—Shad L. Hodgin, former Twin Falls mayor and a resident of Idaho since 1860; G. D. Thomas of Twin Falls, a pioneer of the state and president of the society; George F. Sprague, pioneer of Twin Falls, and Mrs. Lucy Stricker of Rock Creek, resident of Idaho since 1870.

Former Senator M. J. Swooley of Twin Falls introduced the speakers. A musical program was furnished by an orchestra composed of Rev. J. D. Groun, pastor of the Methodist church at Piler since 1905, and members of his family.

Name New Officers The Old Settlers, James L. Barnes of Hansen, resident of the Twin Falls country since 1904 and a member of the board of county commissioners, to be president of their organization for the coming year, and elected vice presidents as follows: Roy W. Gager, Castleford; Chester Chubb, Berlin; Buhl; Mrs. T. E. Moore, Piler; C. D. Thomas, Twin Falls; Harry T. West, Kimberly; George Decker, Sturgis; Mrs. Lucy Stricker, Rock Creek; Ross Carter, Hollister.

The society paid a tribute of respect to members who had died during the preceding year, standing in silence for a moment after the names of the dead had been read. They were Mrs. W. Humphrey, Mrs. Kennedy Packard, M. Speckman and Daniel Thurniscent.

Work of Idaho's pioneer settlers, Governor Baldrige declared, should be continued by unremitting effort, and urged further advancement of the state, American capital, he asserted, ought to be employed in this country. He declared, in his address, that the most fertile fields for development, he declared, is to be found in improvement of the position of the intermountain region with reference to markets. Idaho, he said, is less advantageously situated in this regard than the middle west which has been described as a "land locked and rate handicapped" region. He quoted the words of the statesman, "The statesman of the world war, cost of rail transportation between intermountain points and Chicago has increased 13 per cent, while water transportation cost has declined 13 per cent.

Idaho's history during the period from 1858 when it became a territory until July 3, 1909, when it was admitted to statehood, was reviewed by G. D. Thomas who at last year's picnic meeting had outlined the earlier history of the state. Mr. Thomas referred to the bitter contest that attended removal of the territorial capital from Lewiston to Boise, and of the celebration of Independence day following the admission of the state to the union, and included a number of the incidents drawn from his personal experience.

Introduced as a "reformed cowboy," Mr. Hodgin told of the life of Idaho's first settlers, and discussed the transformation of Snake river that, in the early days, was regarded as one of the "most dangerous and most useless streams in the world, and that now has been diverted to uses of reclamation, and power development proving to be of almost incalculable value.

TELEPHONE SERVICE DISRUPTED BY FIRE

Small Boys Playing With Matches Responsible for Blaze; Transfer Firm-Suffers Loss.

Telephone service was disrupted throughout the entire Twin Falls telephone section, the entire telephone and rural districts of the Mountain States Telephone and Telegraph company when a 200-line lead covered cable was burned through for a distance of 20 feet by a small grass fire at the rear of Shipman Brothers' Transfer and Storage company building, 402 Shoshone street, west at 2:55 o'clock, Friday afternoon.

The combination of small boys and matches resulted in a blaze which caused a loss of \$500 by the telephone company, according to an estimate made last night by W. L. Dudley, wire chief and damages of about \$100 to the property of the transfer company.

This was the worst disruption in the telephone service in Twin Falls for many years. Mr. Dudley stated. Workmen were busy throughout the afternoon and until 10:30 o'clock last night in re-establishing telephone connections which were destroyed in the fire. The work could not be completed last night because of the absence of the office forces through the business district. Service will be completely reinstated this morning.

Three boys had started two small fires in the grass at the rear of the Pacific Electric and Telephone company office, 434 Shoshone street, about 1:30 o'clock. The transfer manager ordered the boys to leave the lot and stamped out the fire.

About half an hour later, fire was discovered in the rear of the company lot. Firemen extinguished the blaze immediately upon their arrival, but the flames had done considerable damage before their discovery. A sheep rack had been badly charred, the rear of a farm wagon box burned and the top and upholstery of a school wagon destroyed. Police turned the matter over to W. J. Young, county juvenile officer, for investigation, after interviewing a number of small boys about the premises.

Firemen burned off the grass on adjoining vacant lots as a precautionary measure before returning to the fire station.

Shank, which made the recommendations to the meeting Monday, will not meet to make further suggestions, as it was selected only to report to the particular meeting. It is thought that the committee will refer exclusively to the Democratic voters who write in the name of anyone they may have in mind with their future suggestion. A rumor that Harold L. Yeaman of Buhl, progressive candidate for prosecuting attorney in 1926, might run, was received Thursday.

It is believed that E. J. Finch, recommended for assessor, M. Shank, recommended for probate judge, and W. A. Minnick, recommended for surveyor, will probably run in the event that their names are written in at the primary, as it is generally believed that they will be. The committee on nominating made no recommendation and the Jefferson club took no action relative to the position of county treasurer. Up to the present no Democrat has, so far as is known, been mentioned as a candidate for the office of county treasurer.
