ANNUAL HUMAN REPAIR BILL—BILLION DOLLARS PHYSICIAN ESTIMATES

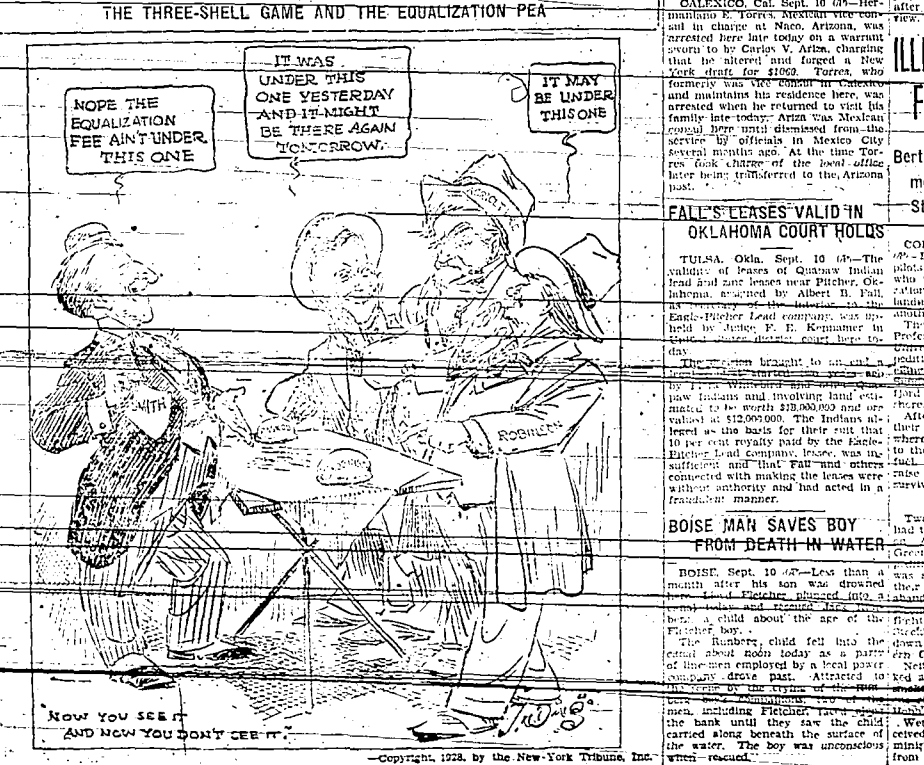

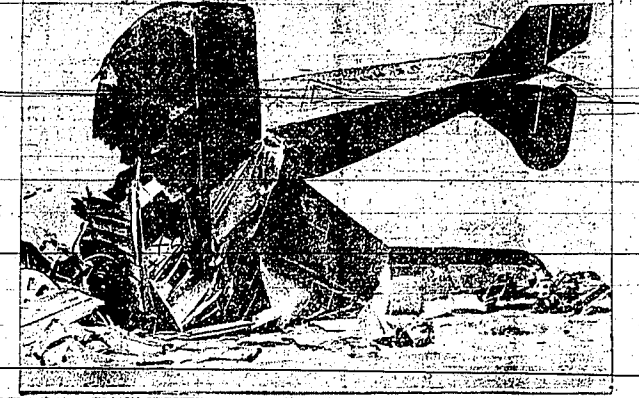

CHANGE IN OUTLOOK ON CROPS RECEIVES BARBON'S ATTENTION Agriculture's Prospects Stage Most Spectacular Quick-change Act in History, Says Noted Bay State Statistician

Special to The News: BARBON PARK, Mass., Sept. 8.—Crop prospects have recently staged one of the most spectacular quick-change acts in history. A dramatic change took place on the first of July 1928. Today, however, there is every evidence of bumper crops. Two short months have witnessed a complete change in corn, and wheat. What seemed like dismal failure in June is heralded as an agricultural triumph in September. The drought means that every locality will have a beautiful harvest, but it does mean that the biggest producing areas of the West, Northwest, Southwest and central states have weathered a process.

"This great change from the poor outlook in June shows what good weather in the United States means. July and August can do. Wheat, corn and cotton plants like human beings recover from sickness amazingly fast when given favorable conditions. Similarly, the greatest crop element for both people and crops is a proper combination of sunshine and water. We are just beginning to appreciate the governing power that the sun has over the weather and through the human health.

"Two things now are of interest. How it happened that such a change in weather should develop under the miserable conditions that existed in June? (2) What are the prospects for favorable weather conditions until the crops are harvested?

"For several years I have been interested in watching the weather which seems to determine the cause of the crop changes. I have been making progress toward a reliable system of forecasting the weather for a month or a season ahead.

"The men who have opened the field of research is Henry John Clayton. His studies show beyond question that the amount of rainfall given off by the sun, determine the moisture content of the air. This moisture is being drawn in finding the underlying causes of the weather. He has shown that the amount of water there would be a normally hot summer. Clayton and his staff told us that it was hard to believe, especially as the autumn anticipated that it would be up as early in June as was expected. It seemed incredible that the weather of the past few months should be so low such an unusually high weather in the month of June. Such, however, has not only been the case this year but in other years when the sun has been unusually active.

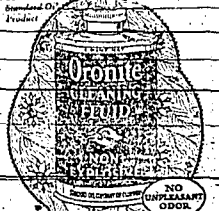
