AGRICULTURE HAVING WINNING IN POLITICAL SCHEME IN FAR WEST

Farm Relief Major Issue With Tariff Standing Close By; Party Affiliations to Be Broken by Prohibition Views

(Associated Press Staff Writer) BUREAU, Twin Falls, Oct. 2.—Whatever may be the farmer's place in the political scheme of things, past and present, just now he is having his inning, a moment of pleasure perhaps that comes with the knowledge that he has the "politicians" guessing and wondering.

It is true that normal party affiliations are to be retained or cast off because of prohibition and religion and the like, but the farmer's form and candidates, but in this campaign the big thing is farm relief, with the tariff standing close by. AIR MAIL ROUTE TO MEXICO CITY OPENS

Tom Harding Pilot's American Plane to Southern Republic Capital; Beats Train Hours

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 2 (AP)—The first air mail from the United States to Mexico was flown today when Tom Harding, piloting an American air mail plane, landed at Alvarado field, which has been designated as a flight of nine and a half hours from Laredo, Texas. A few minutes later a Mexican mail plane from Mexico City, which was en route to the same field, it was piloted by the Mexican pilot, Rodolfo Torres Rico, who had as a passenger Mrs. K. H. Houston, of Twin Falls. The Associated Press and the Laredo Times, Mrs. Houston had flown from Laredo to Mexico City, changing at Saltillo and San Luis Potosi.
