Republican Demonstration Results in Policeman Being Beaten Senseless; Women in Parade Hurt; 10,000 March

WORCESTER, Mass., Nov. 5.—Thirteen persons, including a policeman, were injured 10,000 marchers were showered with bricks, eggs and refuse and women were huddled roughly here tonight in disturbances which developed during an "election eve" Republican demonstration.

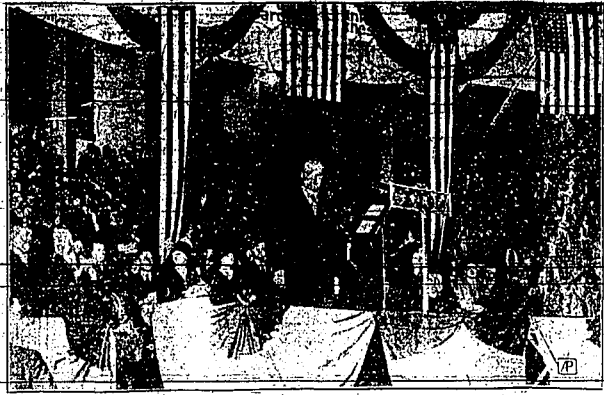
