





# Buhl Defeats Twin Falls Sextet; Bruins Beat Indians 36-19

## BIG DELEGATION OF WEST END ROOTERS ACCOMPANIES TEAMS

First Few Minutes Look Promising For Blue and White Co-Eds; Quintets Set Fast Pace From First of Contest

Buhl and Twin Falls high school basketball teams tonight, the Blue and White, defeated the Twin Falls sextet, 34 to 23, and the Twin Falls Bruins taking the second, 36 to 19.

Buhl came down in force to cheer her teams, and space in the gymnasium was at a premium long before the games were started. Both teams had fine support from the rooters, and intense, but friendly rivalry prevailed throughout.

The first few minutes of the first game things looked promising for Twin Falls girls. Buhl had broken through first with a neat basket on the fourth play of the game, but Twin Falls came right back with a center court play blocking the ball away from the Buhl forwards.

The quarter changed hands, but the home team tossing a basket to end the quarter. Play stiffens. The second quarter saw the ball drifting more frequently to the Buhl end of the court. The Buhl forwards were not making a much greater percentage of scores from their centers and guards than the Twin Falls forwards were being earned. Twin Falls getting but one field goal in the second quarter and three points from three throws. At the half Buhl led, 18 to 11.

Begin Sharp Attack. Opening the second half the Buhl girls evidently had solved the problem presented by smaller size of the Twin Falls court and began a close, sharp attack, breaking up many Twin Falls plays by swift lunges for the ball, and feeding the play to the forwards with such persistence that the end of that quarter saw Buhl ahead with a long lead of 33 to 10. The "snatch" of many substitutes for Buhl in the last quarter gave Twin Falls an opportunity that she was not slow to take advantage of.

Buhl's Play Steady. Buhl's play was of the type characteristic of Coach Barry's teams, steady, fast and sure ball work, clean, sharp passes, and relying not so much on brilliant in-the-forward court as directing the play to give to the forwards many scoring chances.

The change of the guard was shown by the fact that Twin Falls threw only 8 field goals, four of these coming in the last quarter.

Twin Falls was without the services of three of Miss Cull's first string players. This condition affected the team work, caused costly hesitation at critical times, and while it did not in the least affect the fighting qualities of the team it did have an influence on the outcome of the game.

For Buhl E. Southworth led the team with 14 points. Twin Falls high for Twin Falls with 12.

Both boys' teams took a fast pace from the start. Buhl slipped over the first counter, and success. Fully broke up the Bruins efforts for the first few minutes. Play was so hard that 10 fouls were called on Twin Falls in the first quarter, and six on Buhl as the officials sought to keep the play down to a proper level. While these penalties made the players a bit more careful, they did not make either team slow down.

Both fought every minute. With Twin Falls working steadily for position shots, to such effect that she led 10 to 3 at the quarter.

Buhl was finding trouble in the fact that the Twin Falls team had the advantage of greater height and made good use of it, especially to hurry the Buhl players when near the basket.

Close Shots. In the second quarter Buhl had 12 shots at the basket, turning 2 of them into goals. The rest were close, but hurried just enough to miss.

In the same period Twin Falls worked down to 10 shots at the basket, but turned six of those chances into goals. Part of this was due to the effective use of a "slapshot" forward, and a long shot over the heads of the Buhl team to win the game.

At the half Twin Falls had drawn ahead, 27 to 9.

Play slowed somewhat early in the second half. Twin Falls was content to let Buhl make the pace, and to rely on her defense to produce a break, which could be capitalized into a score. How well this worked is shown by the ten shots Buhl took at the board, only one going in from the field, while Twin Falls loomed



but eight times and got 5 counters, to make the rating at the three-quarter mark, 32 to 14, for Twin.

Substitutions Take Toll. Substitutions took their toll in the last quarter, so far as scoring was concerned, but they did not slow up the speed of the game. Both teams took many chances at the rings, trying for shots from all over the floor.

These were exciting enough to watch, but not productive of many points, and the blackboard showed Twin Falls 35, Buhl 19 at the end.

The Bruins handled themselves, in spite of the absence of seasoning games, in good line with the strength they showed them with. Pinch at center, elected himself as a sort of distributing agent for his team mates, overlooked no chances that came to him, but discovering that he was the object of some guarding, accepted the situation and made himself very useful in feeding the ball to men who had a chance to score. The forward play of Taylor and Shumaker was consistent and careful. They were not much given to reaching for the long ones, and made the short ones count. ## CANAL BOARD PLANS 20-MILE EXTENSION

Reclamation Bureau Considering Data for Construction Program in Gooding District

BURLEY, Jan. 18 (Special to The News)—Data covering a 20-mile stretch of canal to be constructed for the Gooding extension irrigation project are being considered in the Denver office of the reclamation department prior to the advertising for bids. This stretch of new canal will be added to the three and one-half miles already authorized, will bring construction to a point just north of Hazelton.

An advisory board has been recently organized to harmonize divergent claims and solve right-of-way problems. J. E. Shepherd, representing the North Side Canal company, is chairman. Other members are J. H. Stuphen, secretary of the Gooding extension; E. W. Reiman, representing landholders on the left side; and Project Superintendent R. B. Darlington, who is secretary of the board. A fifth member will be designated to represent the Big Wood River Canal company.

Use Modern Equipment  
According to information given out from the office of Superintendent Darlington, about 15 per cent of the work in the first mile and a half of canal construction is completed, and a crew is at work on this unit which is entirely through law. The cut is narrow and deep and will have considerable fall. It is expected that work on this unit will continue right on until the end of the season. Contractors are installing a large central compressor plant to take the place of small portable affairs heretofore used. A great modern dragline removes the rock after it is drilled and shot. Work on the second unit, comprising 10 miles, is well advanced. The excavating has come to a standstill on account of cold weather, after being about 35 per cent completed.

On account of the magnitude of operations, and the novelty of some of the methods used, work here has been attracting considerable attention. There are several modern draglines on the ground, one of them a great "walking type" machine which steps along from place to place on enormous feet. Under favorable conditions, some of these dragline excavators can move 200 cubic yards of material in 24 hours.

Plan 70-Mile Canal  
Contractors for the first unit, or deep rock cut, are the Derron Construction company, Winston Bower and the second unit, E. B. Darlington has general supervision of the project for the government. Mr. John K. Rohrer is resident engineer. The undertaking contemplates a completed canal some 70 miles in length, of which about 50 miles has been definitely routed. At the lower end of the two units now being constructed diversion works of reinforced concrete will divert some 1000 second feet of water to the North Side Canal project. About 1500 feet will then be conveyed on down to the Gooding project, where it will be used to augment the water supply from Big Wood river. This will permit all water derived from Big Wood river to be used on lands above the government canal. The completed project will bring 10,000 acres of new lands under water, and will insure adequate water supply for the entire tract of 115,000 acres.
