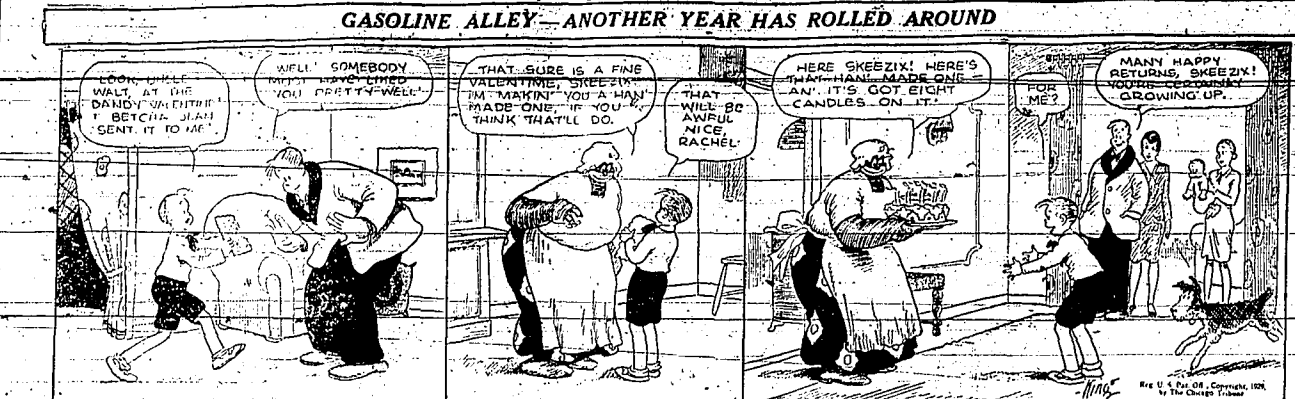

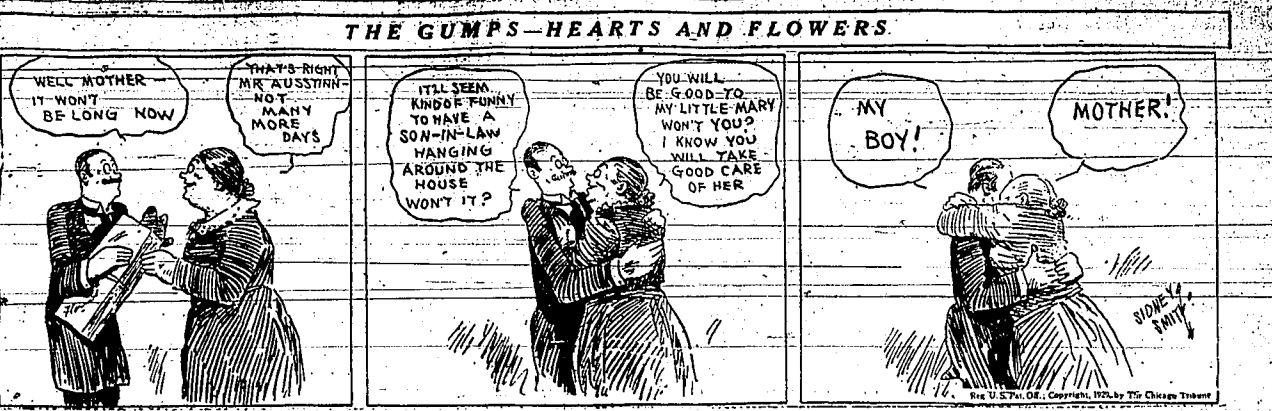

HOOVER ARDENT FOE OF WASTE, EXPERT TELLS ROTARY CLUB

Assistant Director of Bureau of Standards Explains Work of Government Department and Predicts Its Extension

That the study of waste elimination introduced into the working of the department of commerce under the leadership of Herbert Hoover, will probably be extended under his administration as president, resulting in large savings, increased efficiency, higher wages, greater purchasing power and more comforts for people generally was the opinion expressed at a luncheon meeting of the Rotary club held here yesterday at Tom's cafe, by Ray M. Hudson, Washington, assistant director for the bureau of standards of the commerce department.

The subject of the address by Mr. Hudson was "Some dividends on Your Tax Dollars," and consisted in some high lights on the working of the bureau of standards, one of the 12 bureaus of the department of commerce.

Assisting Aviation
