SENATE COMBATS FREE REVERSES POSITION ON "DRY" LAW FUND

Senator Harris, Democrat, Georgia, Author of Amendment, Will Again Request Big Sum for Enforcement

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Feb. 26.—The senate appropriations committee today reversed its position on the bill for a \$24,000,000 increase in prohibition funds and voted down an attempt to amend the record-keeping efficiency appropriation bill.

The second deficiency measure, carrying more than \$200,000,000 to meet a number of emergency demands scattered throughout the country, was reported to the senate tonight and the prohibition fund was renewed on the senate floor tomorrow.

Senator Harris, Democrat, Georgia, author of the amendment, announced he would ask the senate to add the \$24,000,000 bill to the place of the \$27,000,000 increase for prohibition which he had put in the measure by the house upon the recommendation of President Coolidge.

Republican Charles Harris, of Tennessee, introduced the amendment which would reduce the first deficiency bill to \$100,000,000 and the second to \$200,000,000. The measure was opposed by Secretary Mellon.

The senate committee did add a number of provisions to the \$24,000,000 bill. It provided for the purchase of \$100,000,000 of seed grains in the hurricane area in various Southern states.

Washington, Chicago Loyola and Mercer Hoopsters Undefeated Teams

Sharkey and Stribling Restlessly Await Sound of Gong to Begin Battle Before 35,000 Fight Customers

Seattle Huskies To Fight For Title Of Pacific Conference

Record of Far Westerners Contains 13 Consecutive Victories; Will Battle California Golden Bears

NEW YORK, Feb. 26—East, West, North and South, three teams stand out tonight as the only undefeated college basketball combinations in the entire country.

A survey of all sections show that only the University of Washington in the West, Loyola University of Chicago in the Middle West and Mercer University of Macon, Georgia, in the south still are atop as the college court forces of the nation approach the climax of their season.

In other sections not a single stand-out winner remains even so, yet doubtless quietest as Fordham in the East, Arkansas in the Southwest, and Oklahoma in the Missouri valley having won their respective titles in mountain section, too, the teams succeeded in killing each other off.

Huskies' Record Impressive
Of the three proud survivors, the Huskies which may be further depleted before the season is over, the Huskies of Washington boast what appears to be the most impressive record. Members of the Pacific coast conference, one of the seven sectional "big leagues" of the college games, the Huskies have won the championship of their section without losing a contest.

In romping ahead to 15 consecutive victories, the Huskies have piled up a total of 257 points to its opponents' 246, an average per game of more than 40 points to less than 20.

On the strength of their sparkling record and the heights to which they have reached, the Huskies are given serious thought by the teams from California in the play-off between the Northern and Southern hall winners in Seattle, March 1, 2 and 4, for the all-coast championship. Their opponents will be the Golden Bears of the University of California.

Almost "Woroner Team"
Last year also the Huskies reached the play-off, only to be defeated in two hard fought games for the title by the University of Southern California by margins of 2 points and 2 points. On their home floor this time the Seattle players have high hopes of turning the tables. If successful in gaining the coast crown without a defeat the Washington team probably will deserve to rank as about the nearest approach to a wonder team that the season has produced, although its schedule is shorter than most and included no inter-sectional games.

NEW YORK, Feb. 25—Two robust tempers and a little insidious promptness from unknown sources outside the spotlight may rob the ring for 18 months—and possibly forever—of one of the finest heavyweight prize-fighters in the history of the fight racket.

The batter is Max Schmeling, Berlin-born, German, young German who carries the bolt of Thor on his right hand and looks and acts like a Jack Dempsey who never heard of body punching. He has the momentum of the tempest.

The other temper, spurred on by outside influences, rests in the pudgy person of Arthur Buelow, who brought Max from the Fatherland last October. Buelow came as Schmeling's manager and friend with a contract that still has 18 months to run. Max now has turned against the harassed newspaperman from the other side.

So bitter have the arguments become that there seems little hope of an amicable settlement, the New York state athletic commission has ruled that Schmeling can fight for Buelow and cannot engage in matches made by himself or Jacobs.

While the history of the situation is only that of other foreign boxers who have come to America, shown hollow and immediately become embroiled in difficulties through the interest of American managers, Schmeling represents far more in actual fact than any of his predecessors.

Of the many heavyweights from foreign lands in the past decade or more, only Luis Angel Firpo, and Georges Carpentier, beat the clutching hands of the American manager.

Among other heavyweights prospects, some with just as many possibilities as either Firpo or Carpentier, Paulino Uscudun stands out as the anti-example of Firpo and Carpentier.
