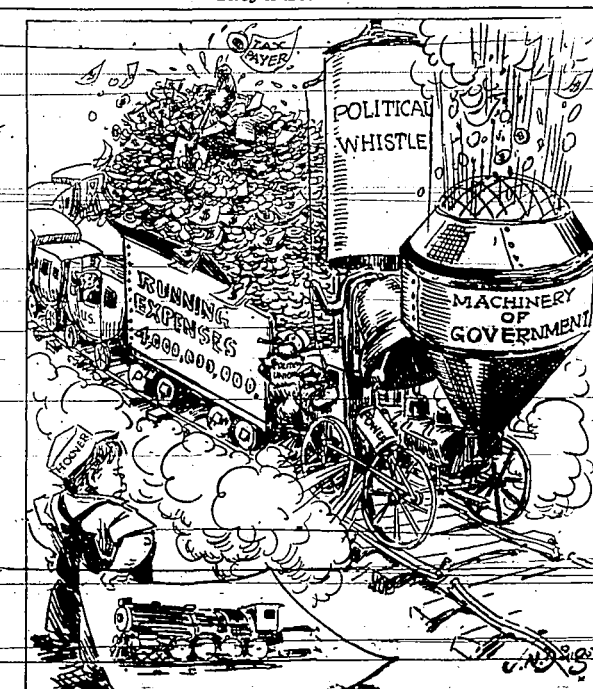

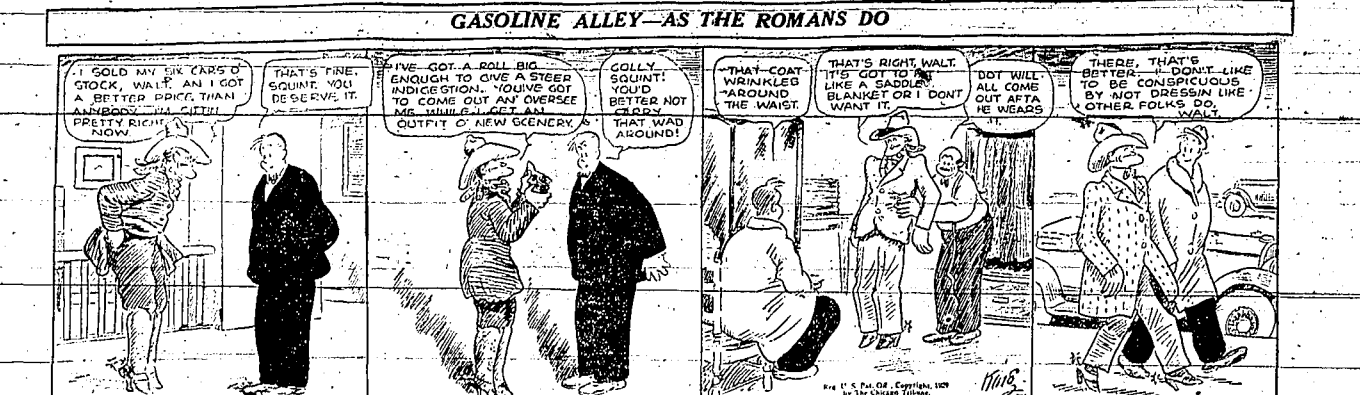

ADVISORY COMMITTEE SUGGESTS REDUCTION OF SALMON-PAY ROLL

Saving of \$14,000 Possible Report Reveals; Committee Opposes Leasing Deep Creek System

Protest against the leasing, purchasing or acquiring of the canal and reservoir of the Deep Creek Land and Water company, without submitting the matter to the stockholders of the company was drafted Monday by a committee of stockholders of the Salmon River Canal company, John H. Ray, chairman, and the advisory committee of the company board of directors.

The protest is valued as part of an advisory set of resolutions which it is advised that the retainer fee for the company attorney, now \$1000, be cut to \$250 a year, that the salary of the superintendent, now \$3000 and clerk hire, be reduced to \$2500 without clerical assistance; that an assistant superintendent be retained only during the time of water delivery, and that the maintenance fees, said to have been 96 cents last year be reduced to 45 cents per share. The statement of savings anticipated by the committee was made last evening by the committee, Robert Ray, the report recommends that no mileage be allowed members or employees outside Twin Falls county.

Mr. Ray said that the committee figured that its recommendations if carried into effect would mean a saving of about \$14,000. He said that the committee estimated that the maintenance fee of 45 cents per share on 35,000, each acre representing one and five-sevenths shares, would raise \$17,000, while he gathered that the tentative suggested budget would amount to \$41,000. He said part of the report was outlined some time ago. Its contents were suggested to the budget committee of the board of directors composed of H. Glavin, P. L. Joslin and W. W. Powell at a conference Monday. Mr. Ray said, and copies were made to be considered at the meeting of the board of directors in the office of Bottwell and Chapman Thursday evening. Mr. Ray said that high maintenance fees had resulted in accumulation of a surplus and that this tended to extravagance.

The following is a complete copy of the resolutions to which is attached the names of Robert Ray, J. H. Hestley, Carl D. Kunkel, C. M. Oates and I. E. Finney.

Make Resolutions

1. The committee, composed of the stockholders of the Salmon River Canal company, Inc. at its annual meeting on January 14, 1929, known as a budget committee to meet with the Salmon River Canal company directors to advise and assist, in the making and fixing of the budget of said company, hereby submit the following resolutions:

1. It is hereby resolved that we, the committee request, and recommend to the board of directors of the Salmon River Canal company that the said board of directors refrain from buying, leasing, or in any way acquiring, or attempting in any way to acquire the water, canals, reservoirs, of the Deep Creek Land and Water company, without first submitting said proposition to the stockholders of the Salmon River Canal company.
2. It is further resolved, and we the committee, recommend to the directors of the Salmon River Canal company that in order to reduce the running expenses of said company that the said directors pay not to exceed the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250.00) per annum as a retainer to their attorney or attorneys.
3. It is hereby further resolved and we the committee recommend to the directors of the Salmon River Canal company that they may not to exceed the sum of twenty six hundred dollars (\$2600.00) per annum for a superintendent and that said superintendent be clerical to do his own clerical work and that said superintendent have an assistant only during the time of delivering the water, and that said assistant be paid not to exceed the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per month during said employment.
4. We further resolve and recommend that the said board of directors allow

no employees to any of its members or employees outside of Twin Falls county, Idaho.

We, the committee, further resolve and recommend to the board of directors of the said Salmon River Canal

company, Inc., that all meetings of the directors of the said company be held at Hollister, Idaho, and that said meetings be open to any and all stockholders of said Salmon River Canal company, Inc.

6. It is further resolved and recommended to said board of directors of the Salmon River Canal company that all money or moneys in the hands of said board of directors, or which may come into their hands belonging to said company be deposited with some bank or depository located in Twin Falls county, Idaho, and that said bank or depository be required to give security for the safe keeping of said funds and that said security be by a surety company or other security equally as good.

7. After an examination of the conditions and finances of the Salmon River Canal company, the committee recommended that the canal board make a levy not to exceed forty five cents (45c) per share maintenance for the year 1929.

NEW CANAL MANAGER PRAISES COOPERATION

John E. Hayes Finds Satisfactory Spirit of Harmony at Recent Meeting

"While I have traversed every acre tract on the Twin Falls project, it has been so long ago that I will be compelled to go over it again in view of its development before I can discuss conditions," said John E. Hayes, the recently named manager of the Twin Falls Canal company, who arrived on the noon train yesterday from Idaho Falls where he attended the meeting of the Water User's association.

"One feature of the situation which I found existed at Idaho Falls was extremely pleasing to me, and that was the spirit of cooperation and harmony manifested at the meeting of water users. In Colorado, each segregation is divided into districts and each district has its own army and navy ready to

engage in battle with all the rest. Of course, this situation is very satisfactory to lawyers and engineers."

Mr. Hayes met the Twin Falls Canal company directors at Pocatello Sunday and went with them to Idaho Falls. Judge James R. Bothwell, attorney, and L. H. Perrine, engineer, accompanied them. Mr. Hayes and Paul S. A. Dickel met with the representatives of Twin Falls in August 1927.

Mrs. Hayes and children will not come to Twin Falls until after the schools in Denver have closed.

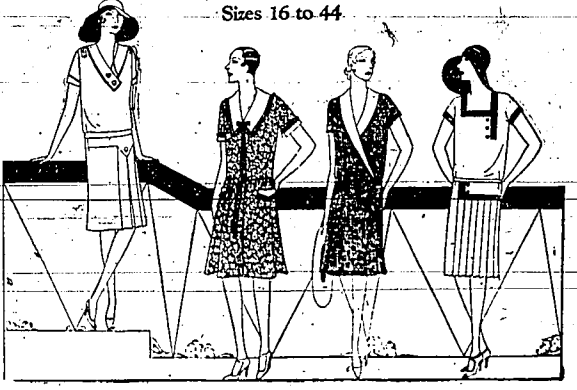
