

# STATES WITH FEWER HIGHWAY FATALITIES

List Mounts to 27,500 in 1928: One Fatal Accident for Every 900 Automobiles On Nation's Roads

(By The Associated Press)
NEW YORK, April 13—Motor
traffic deaths in the United
States increased 7 per cent last
year over the highest previous
recorded figures. The 1928 futaility list stood at 27,500.
The figures were obtained by
an insurance company in a mational survey. If the rate of increase is maintained in 1929, approximately 30,000 persons will
meet death in automobile mishaps.

proximately 30,000 persons will meet death in automobile mishaps.

The fatality toll for last year averaged one death for every 900 motor cars on the highways. On an average, 75 persons were killed in motor accidents daily.

New York state, which for several years has shown motor vehicle fatality tolls in excess of 2000, was joined by Illinois in 1928, when 2068 persons met death in accidents there.

Montain, Texas, South Dak of a Tennessee, Oklahoma, Rhode Island, Connecticut and New Mexico reported an increase of more than 25 per cent in the number of persons killed by motor vehicles during the year.

Montaina, with a gain of 85 per cent, had the greatest increase while Texas and South Dakota also exceeded their 1927 tolls by more than 50 per cent.

Only eight states, Arizona, Arkansas, Idaho, lowa Nevada, New Hampshire, South Carolina and Virginia, showed a reduction in the number of motor vehicle deaths.
