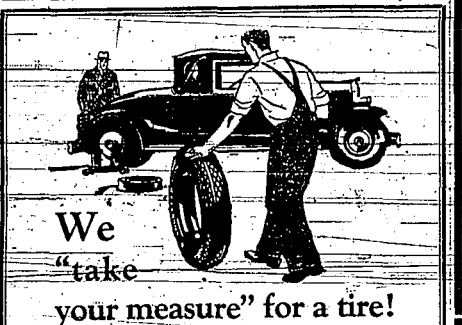

ATTORNEYS AGREE ON PENDING LITIGATION

Irrigation Unit Lawyers Seek to Effect Understanding On Flood Water

A conference of attorneys of the lower Snake river canal companies... The litigation involving ownership of flood waters of the river, was near here yesterday in connection with the meeting of the Board of directors of the American Falls reservoir district which is interested along with the Twin Falls Canal company, the North Side Canal company and the Mindoka and Rupert reclamation units. The matter of ownership of flood waters is involved in the suits of the Woodville Canal company against the Clark-Edwards Canal company in Bonneville and Highgate counties.

An agreement was reached by the attorneys who were here yesterday and drafted for presentation today at a meeting with other lawyers interested in the case. At the meeting yesterday, H. E. Spitzmeier, Portland, represented the United States reclamation bureau, S. T. Edwards, Boise, represented the Binley and Rupert units, R. H. Parry, Twin Falls, and A. B. Barclay, Jerome, represented the North Side Canal company, and Judge James R. Bothwell represented the Twin Falls Canal company and the American Falls reservoir district. Although both principal parties to the litigation are interested to abide by both the Foster and Rexberg decrees, the plaintiff company, made all

other companies on the Snake river parties defendant since the question at issue involved the waters of the river. If both of the principal parties to the case agree to the stipulations drafted by the lawyers here yesterday, the other companies will not be interested in the outcome of the case and their interests will not be affected. Should either of the principal parties object to any vital stipulation, the lower river companies and the reclamation bureau of the federal government will participate to protect what they contend to be their rights.

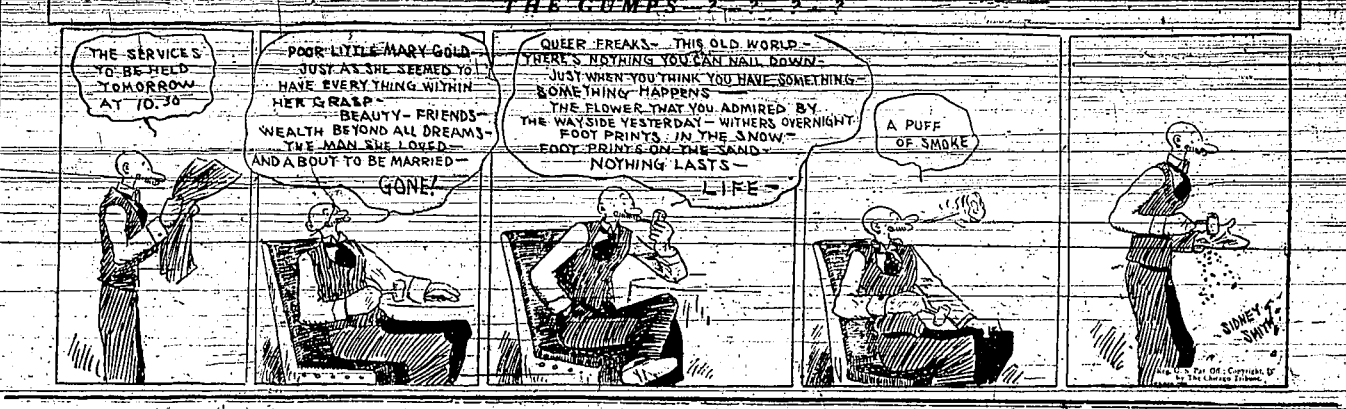
