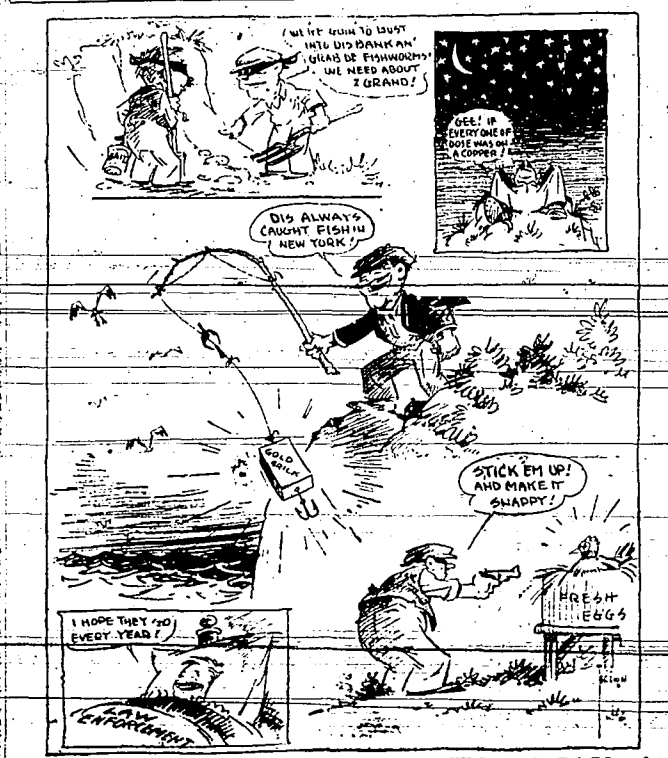

TWIN FALLS, JERSEY CATTLE GET PRICES FROM NOTED EXPERT

Ivan H. Loughary Declares Kaylor Herd Credit to State and Urges Adver- tising of Fine Stock

July 9 (Special to The News)—The Jersey cattle which we saw at the Kaylor ranch this morning are a credit to Idaho and would be a credit to any state in the Union. Ivan H. Loughary, secretary of the American Jersey Cattle club, told 60 members of the Twin Falls County Jersey club at a picnic at the fairgrounds this morning presided over by S. H. Kaylor, president today. Mr. Loughary emphasized the point that there has been insufficient promotional and advertising work done in this country considering the splendid quality of its cattle.

There are 22,000,000 dairy cattle in the United States, of which 10,000,000 are purebred or grade Jerseys, said Mr. Loughary. Jersey cow which is the most popular breed enjoys great popularity. Only 4 1/2 per cent of all dairy cattle of all breeds are purebred. On this purebred stock the industry must depend for its improvement for from this must be selected breeding stock to improve the grades. The herd which we saw at the Kaylor ranch is a truly remarkable one. I believe all herds of dairy cattle should be submitted to standard tests by all the American dairy promotional associations. Carl Misker, secretary of the American Guernsey club, told the state meeting at Thousand Springs ranch yesterday that if a dairy cow could not afford to test his herd, he could not afford to be a dairyman. Selection of a cow for proper development of purebred stock and advertising of its merits are essential for the greatest progress of the community. Mr. Loughary developed the ideas advanced in some detail.

You probably have more and better Jersey cattle in Twin Falls county than any other in the state of Idaho, but you are not advertising the fact and are not getting the credit you deserve because you are not," D. L. Fourn, field representative of the International Association of Idaho exhibitors, said following the address of Mr. Loughary.

UTAHN FINDS RUINS OF PLANE IN CANYON

Discovery Reveals Fate of Japanese Flier Out to Gain Worldwide Fame

SALT LAKE CITY, July 9 (AP)—The wreckage of an attempted flight around the world that cost the life of its author, Masaaki Goto, 35-year-old Japanese aviator of Los Angeles, was discovered southeast of here today.

Goto's body was located this afternoon in Dry canyon, 35 miles from Heber, Utah, in the wreckage of his airplane. With him was a fellow countryman, his designer, had built in the hope of carrying the dream of Japanese aviation to the globe.

Backed by funds raised by Japanese newspapers of the Pacific coast, Goto had flown to Oakland and Reno, Nev., and then on to Salt Lake City. Next morning he left the airport here alone in his 22-foot machine, en route for New York. From there he planned to ship the plane to England and then fly across Europe and Asia to Japan.

Wrecking of the plane ended his attempt and his life as well when Sheriff Praughton reported, it apparently had crashed in a canyon near Heber.

Identification of the flier, established by the number on the plane, was substantiated through papers on the body. The body was found late yesterday by Nymphus Simmons, shepherd, who telephoned to Sheriff Praughton. Darkness, however, prevented a search for the wreckage until this morning.

City airport officials said Goto was off his course.

Goto, who came here three years ago from Japan, worked as a gardener, saving his earnings to buy materials with which he and his countryman built the plane in a Venice, California aircraft factory. The two originally had planned to build a two-passenger ship and return to Japan together. The aviator held a private pilot's license.

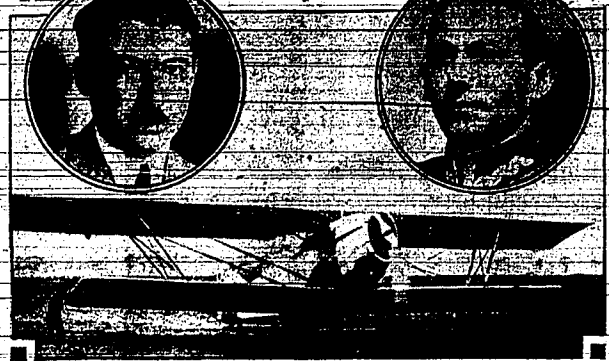

SPOKANE FIRM ASSAILS NEW GEM STATE STATUTE

SPokane, July 9 (AP)—One more of the acts of the 1929 legislature was assailed as unconstitutional in federal court today when the National Savings and Loan association, Spokane, asked the court to enjoin W. D. Gillis, attorney general of Idaho from enforcing chapter 25 of the 1929 session laws.

The act is that passed to tax building and loan associations, to comply with a provision of the national banking act forbidding imposition of any tax on national banks not imposed on competing capital. The law makes the attorney general responsible for filing suits necessary to take away the corporations' right of doing business in Idaho when they fail to comply with its terms.

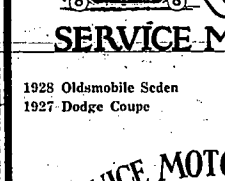

25,000 Fans See Sonnenberg Beat Lewis to Hold Title

Champion Suffers First Fall During Flashy Mat Career

Grappling Starts Off Past With Former Dartmouth Football Star Testing Ex-Titlesholder's Boast

(By The Associated Press) BOSTON, July 9.—(Gus) Sonnenberg's famous flying tackle overcame Ed (Strangler) Lewis for the second time in seven months and enabled the former Dartmouth football player to retain his heavyweight wrestling title here—tonight—at Fenway park.

In so doing the champion suffered the first fall of his mat career, which came when Lewis flattened him with a breast kick, but he caught the next fall with his deadly buttoning tactics.

They started off fast. Sonnenberg testing Lewis' boast that he had perfected a defense for his vicious (hook)-Lewis was able to get his hands on him with ease and Sonnenberg stuck to straight wrestling up to the 15-minute mark.

He was dashed to the mat when Lewis sidestepped one of them, the champion appeared shaken—his fall shouldered to the mat just before the expiration of 18 minutes.

After the first fall Sonnenberg started battling immediately and for the first 15 minutes Lewis was content to remain on the defensive, several times he avoided the champion's rushes.

After Lewis obtained five headlocks and got Sonnenberg groggy he kept an opening. Sonnenberg bit him squarely under the chin and threw him. The force of the fall stunned Lewis, and the champion took the second fall in 19 minutes.

The champion's winning fall required but three minutes.

The match drew 25,000 customers and gate receipts of \$90,000.

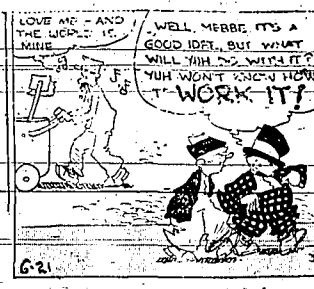

BEEKEEPERS OF BURLEY REGION REPORT PICNIC

WOMEN'S CAMP AT GUYER WILL ENTERTAIN CHILDREN

BURLEY, July 9. (Special to The News)—Honey producers of this section who attended the Idaho Bee Keepers' association picnic at Filer, Sunday, state that there was a large attendance and that much benefit was secured through interchange of ideas.

They say that though the honey season started late, that the flow of the sweet is now on, and that extracting will begin here the coming week. Some doubt this is usually left in the hives for bee food. They look for a good season unless cold winds should interfere. Indications are that the market will be satisfactory and probably better than last season.

Frank Beach, president of the association, says that some annoyance has been given bee keepers through miscreants entering the apiaries and stealing or injuring equipment. This practice caused the association to offer a reward of \$100 for information leading to the arrest of the culprits. Notices were printed and posted in many of the yards.
