SUGAR BEET HARVEST TO BEGIN IN MONTH

Amalgamated Company Expects Large Crop Will Require 1350 Laborers

Harvesting of sugar beets will begin about three days later, if beets continue to mature at the present rate. It was stated in an announcement issued yesterday by the Amalgamated Sugar company. "The sugar beet crop continues to make splendid progress and a large tonnage is now fully assured," the announcement says.

"With the tremendous crop in prospect," the announcement continues, "approximately 1350 men will be required in the beet harvest in Twin Falls, Jerome, Cassia and Blaine counties. To handle all the crops maturing in this section this year will impose a heavy burden on labor and heavy importations will be necessary. Efficient, competent hand labor seeking employment will have no difficulty in this section in securing good return for their efforts. This section of the country enjoys an advantage over other agricultural sections in be-

ing assured of good harvest weather, thus providing continuous uninterrupted employment for hand labor during the harvest season.

"The labor payroll for topping and loading in these counties will amount to approximately \$480,000, and approximately \$225,000 will be paid out for the handling of by products, pulp, molasses and the movement of hay used in feeding, which will be stimulated by the beet industry."

"Experience during recent years shows a tremendous increase in the use of trucks in handling beets and other crops."

With the improvement in highways and the necessity for employing the economical means of transportation, trucks are rapidly coming into common use for this purpose. It is anticipated that a very great percentage of the beet crop this year will be carried in trucks. Trucks properly equipped with dump beds designed to accommodate the crop are useful for all transportation purposes and particularly for other farm activities.
