FACTIONS OF UPPER HOUSE MANEUVERING FOR TARIFF BATTLE

Senator Borah and Western Independents Lay Plans to Confine Revision to Products of Agriculture

HAROLD POLVER Associated Press Staff Writer WASHINGTON, Sept. 3.—With one of the oldest party issues—the tariff—to settle once more, the senate half of the special session will resume work tomorrow after a two-and-a-half-month recess to complete the emergency legislative program recommended to it by President Hoover.

The house, which started last January formulating the first tariff bill, passed a measure and sent the complete measure to the senate in late May, will not meet until September 22. Then it will begin work on the bill, which will remain in the house for adjustment of differences.

Leaders Confident Leaders of both groups expressed confidence that they had enough votes virtually to uphold the bill to their liking.

Senator Smoot, Utah, chief spokesman for the regular Republicans, said he was ready for the fight, and the books and statistics piled on his desk as he made the statement indicated as much.

IDAHO DEATH RATE INCREASES IN YEAR

623 of 4177 Persons Summoned in 1928 in State

WASHINGTON, Sept. 3 (AP)—An increase in the death rate in Idaho in 1928 was reported today by the bureau of the census—United States department of commerce. A decrease in accidental deaths over the period, however, is indicated in the report.

4177 Deaths in Year During 1928 there were 4177 deaths in Idaho, an increase in rates per 100,000 population from those of the preceding year.

The report states that significant among the decreases in rates from 1927 to 1928 were those from measles, 17 to 0.4; diphtheria, 4.3 to 2.9; whooping cough, 3.2 to 2.7; and tuberculosis, 10.1 to 9.5.

In the same report the census bureau estimates the 1928 population of Idaho at 430,000 and in 1927 at 434,000.

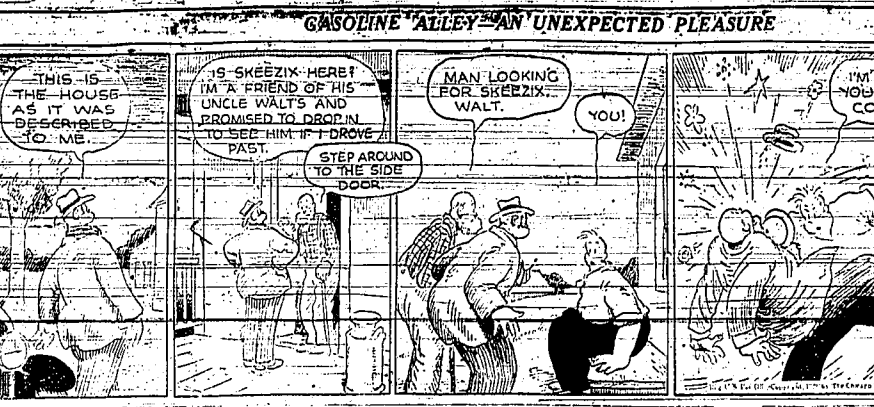

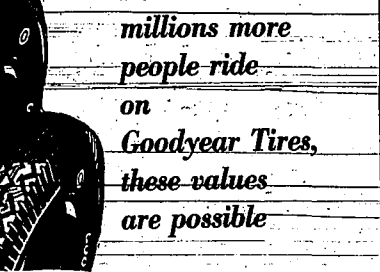

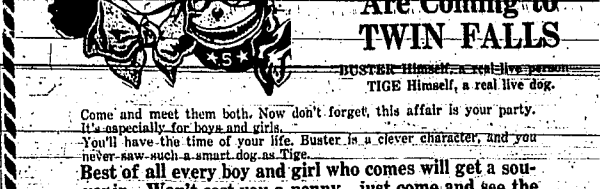
