REPUBLICANS ELECT CLAUDIUS H. HUSTON HEAD OF COMMITTEE

For First Time During 73 Years History Grand Old Party Reaches Into South for Organization Leader

By JAMES C. WEST (Associated Press Staff Writer) WASHINGTON, Sept. 9.—For the first time in the 73 years of its history, the Republican party today reached into the South for a chairman of its national executive committee. Claudius H. Huston, of Tennessee, to succeed Dr. Hubert Work.

The choice of President Hoover, the new chairman was selected without opposition and after a suspension of the rules moved by his one-time political foe, J. Will Taylor, national committee member for the volunteer state of Tennessee in the second district.

Huston, a native of Indiana, who was reared in New York City, said in his speech of acceptance that the work of the national organization consists in bringing about such and such a more specific, modicum campaign effort.

Devotes Full Time to Task. Determined to devote his full time to his new job, the Tennesseean will be leaving his business, connections with which he is chairman of the board of the Trans-Continental Oil Corporation, chairman of the Associated Bond and Share Company of New York, president of the Brotherhood Management Corporation in charge of the financial affairs of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers, and vice president of the Atlanta, Tennessee, Table and Manufacturing company.

As soon as he can make the necessary arrangements to move to Washington and then will be making a survey of the field to determine what kind of campaign he will conduct, a vigorous senatorial and congressional campaign in 1931.

Memorial, Ralph Williams, first vice chairman of the committee, will take charge of the national headquarters. He is in charge until such time as Mr. Huston will continue. Thereafter Mr. Williams will relieve him as vice chairman of the new executive.

Dr. Work Thanks Colleagues. Calling the national committee together for the first time, Dr. Work thanked his colleagues for the cooperation given him during the past year and said that while he is gratified by a long hold with to retire from public life, he will continue to cooperate and praise for the services of the Republican club members.

Grand-Duques to Question. Expert in High Finance. MILWAUKEE, Sept. 9.—Elihu S. Hunkeler, 65, Wisconsin financier, who has paid investors dividends of 20 per cent a year for the past five years, today announced that he had resigned from the board of directors of the Grand-Duques, but faces further questioning by the government's case was dismissed because of insufficient evidence to prove that Hunkeler was not a spy, as alleged by testimony in the cigar business. Interest paid to depositors was \$407,476 compared with \$342,101 in the same period last year. The banks showed total resources of \$52,291,294.

FIERCE FIRES RAGE IN OREGON TIMBER

4000 Men in Heart-Breaking Battle Against More Than 100 Forest Fires

PORTLAND, Sept. 9.—Forest fires swept over western Oregon woods today, threatened two towns, destroyed homes and logging equipment, bridges and ranch houses and burned untold quantities of timber. Forestry officials declared the situation the worst in many years.

One thousand men waged a heart-breaking battle against more than 100 fires in Coos and Curry counties on the coast.

The town of Powers was threatened but hope was held that the fire could be contained by the use of dynamite.

The town of Port Orford, Curry county, was saved by a quick change in the wind after one resident had been destroyed and eight families driven into the street by heat.

In the Bliverton sector 40 women were taken from timber camps along the logging railroad of a battle against timber and brush fires which swept over homesteads and ranches and destroyed logging equipment and buildings.

Two great fires southward of Powers, Coos county, converged and out of control brush fires were threatened by the boundary of the-Siskiyou reservations. Foresters said they feared the fires would reach the national forest if not quickly checked.

FROST DAMAGE SLIGHT IN SOUTHERN IDAHO REGION

BOISE, Sept. 9.—Reports of frost ranging all the way from light to slight damage were brought to the weather bureau here today, but it was estimated little injury had been done to any of the major field crops in southern Idaho.

A report from Pocatello said the official temperature had dropped to 25 degrees which resulted in cutting down the potatoes and similarly green growth but did not damage corn or wheat. The frost did not reach the potatoes. Light frosts were also reported in Twin Falls and Bullhead sections with no damage. Tender crops, such as beans and pumpkins, have been hurt to some extent in the Boise section.

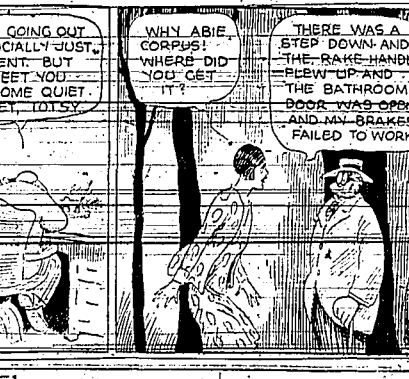

AGED MAN FACES HEARING IN COURT ON MURDER CHARGE

Arrangement of D. P. Moon, Accused of Slaying Jack Lemon, First Day Term of Appeal of Autumn Term

Arrangement of appeal of Moon, charged with first degree murder in connection with the fatal shooting of Jack Lemon here last July 11, was a development of the first day of the September term of district court here which opened Monday with a smaller number of criminal cases to be tried than any previous court term here in several years.

Moon received his plea which will be entered at 11 A. M. today. It was indicated that Moon, in the event he pleads not guilty, will not be brought to trial until after the adjournment of court here on September 15. It was also announced that Moon is now desirous to be the wish of W. L. Dunn, Moon's attorney.

Files 12 Informations
In addition to the information charging Moon with the fatal shooting, prosecuting attorney, will file 11 more informations in criminal cases today, and there are remaining from the last court term two informations charging Moon with murder.

Order for a jury to report to the court next Monday will be issued this week. It was stated that by Judge Hugh A. Baker, Rupert, who will occupy the bench during the present term, will judge W. A. Babcock, Twin Falls, to be the jury for the trial of the case.
