### Convicts In Colorado State Prison-Kill-Hostages While Battle Rages With Militia

Early Morning Brings New Threat Against Live of-Captives-Within Walls and De mand-for-Freedom-from

Institution

"In The Associated Press)

CANON CITY, Colo., (Friday-Morning). Oct. 4.— Convicts in Cellhouse 3 of Colorado state's prison for the fifth time demanded shortly after 12:30 of clock this morning that they be furnished automobiles and "free getaway." Accompanying the demand was a threat to execute the remaining five of 10 guards captured at the beginning of the rebellion 12 hours ago and held as hostages. The demand again was refused and a force of national guardsmen and, penitentiary officials prepared to carry on their seige with machine guns, dynamite and high-powered rifles.

The demand and threat were brought by Guard John Pense, one

The demand and threat were brought by Guard John Pense, one of the men held by the mutinying prisoners, It was signed by Danny Daniels, leader of the rebelling convicts. Refusal was shouted back to the cell.

Peace said there were five guard still in the cellhouse. An immediate barrage of gun fire was opened. Under cover of this fire, ather Patrick O'Nell, Canon City Priest, advanced to the cell-ouse-and-placed-a-second-charge of dynamite. The first had alled. Hot fire covered the doorway of the cellhouse to prevent
