COLORED FINANCIER DRAWS SENTENCE OF 16 YEARS IN PRISON

Man Who Out-Witted Great Gotham Banks Insists on Parading in Role of Robin Hood of High Finance

NEW YORK, Oct. 10 (AP)—An elderly, small town banker who came out of the West with a scheme that caused six of New York's biggest banks to turn over \$300,000 to his credit pleaded guilty today to mail fraud, but insisted that he was a Robin Hood of high finance, rather than an ordinary criminal.

DETECTIVES GET MAN IN IDAHO BOND CASE

Agency Operatives Locate One of Men Wanted For Sale of Redeemed Issue

PORTLAND, Oct. 10 (AP)—The appearance of redeemed and supposedly destroyed bonds of the Interstate Utilities company of Washington and Idaho in Des Moines, and San Francisco, and the arrest of Howard Polly, former chief engineer of the American bank build-

ing here, started a nation-wide search today for other persons believed involved.

Polly, who was arrested today at Eugene, Oregon, by operatives of a nationally known detective agency, is said to be one of the unidentified men charged with trying to sell the bonds supposed to have been burned in the bank building furnace. The bonds were for a \$1,000,000 issue of the Utilities company and were underwritten by the Lumberman's Trust company. The Utilities company made new bonds and sent money here to cover unpaid bonds. The certificates were placed in the furnace under the supervision of a company representative, it was alleged. The specific charge against Polly is having false evidence of debt in his possession with the intent to utter it as true.

George Mowry, chief deputy district attorney, said he had notified authorities and private detective agencies throughout the country to aid in the search for an unidentified "middle man," who assisted in circulating the bonds.

Mowry said the Utilities company maintained headquarters at Spokane. About \$750,000 of the issue had been sold, he said, and the Equitable Trust company, formerly the Lumberman's Trust company, Portland, held the remainder.

COLORADO MURDER TRIAL PROGRESSES

Swift-Moving Picture of Four Slayings Almost Complete in LaMar Court

LAMAR, Colo., Oct. 10 (AP)—A swift-moving picture of four murders in less than three days was almost complete tonight as the state wore its pattern of evidence against George J. Absher, charged with first degree murder in connection with the slaying of A. N. Parrish, during the robbery of the First National bank here in May, 1929.

Over the protest of Absher's counsel, the state introduced before a jury of 10 farmers, a dry-cleaner and barber, the testimony of numerous Kansas residents who took part in the chase after the bandit gang following its escape over the state line, or were had been intimately connected with unpeeling the mystery of the four slayings.

During and after the robbery at Parrish was killed, his son was shot and a bank teller and western Kansas doctor were found murdered. Among the articles introduced in evidence by the state as its case drew to a close were gun, pistol, a coat worn by Dr. W. W. Wheeler, Dighton, Kansas, and a cap worn by A. E. Kesinger, state attorney, bullets found in the bank and numerous maps.

The state had hoped to complete its case against Absher before adjournment of court late this afternoon, but a controversy between Allyn Gale, deputy district attorney, and Byron G. Rogers, chief of defense counsel, was climaxed by adjournment when it became evident that the final state witnesses would not be able to leave the stand before 6 P. M.

Experience In Police Cell Interrupts Clan Chieftain's Homecoming From Italy

Chicago—October 10 (AP)—Jim Genoa, happy homecoming from Italy was interrupted rudely today by his first experience in a Chicago police cell.

Chief of a flourishing clan of "alcohol chuggers," Genoa tried to his hometown four years ago after the slaying of three of his brothers in gang battles. But Italy, too, was inhospitable. He spent two of his years there in prison awaiting trial on a stock fraud charge of which, he emphasized, he was eventually acquitted, but found in Chicago had never molested him. So he decided to come back to the "dime or two cheese" business here.

Genoa sat forlornly in his cell today and listened to a recital of the list of his friends killed since he departed.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 10.—Speculation has arisen as to whether the federal farm board may alter its policy in disbursing the \$500,000,000 established for the rehabilitation of the farmer.

The board has had to battle a widespread impression that the government virtually is going to give away a half billion dollars, or that if the individual loans made from the revolving fund are not paid back Congress will remit them.

Frequently the applicant is an obscure cooperative with meager organization and not even a bookkeeper. SCOUTS BLAZE TRAILS IN TWO NATIONAL PARKS

CHICAGO, Mont., Oct. 10.—Like the trail blazers of pioneer days, Boy Scouts have completed their fifth year in bearing paths through the forests of America's national parks. Two and a half miles of completed trail that is not merely a foot-path but a three-foot wide passage between Red Eagle landing and Sun camp to the Glacier national park stands as a result of their three-year effort.

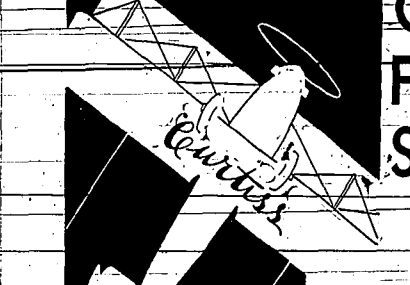

W. B. KINNE'S DEATH BRINGS SORROW TO CAPITOL OFFICIALS

Pleasant-Friendliness of Successful Business Man Results in Popularity Gubernatorial Nomination Talk Follows Kidnaping Case in Northern Idaho

(By The Associated Press) BOISE, Oct. 10.—Probably a more modestly unassuming man than the late Lieutenant Governor W. B. Kinne never sat in a place of high position in the state house.

And yet his unassuming rather writing the hearts of a considerable number of statehouses officials and employes who had known him in some connection or other in his varied business interests, and more recently, his political activities, was that he was very charming personality.

Certainly he was not widely known in the state when he was selected to be the lieutenant governor at the last Republican state convention, and yet within a few months an event which he had control and masterly did not invite, made him not only known by sight and name all over the state but all over the country.

While driving along a country road near Orofino, he was seized by a group of four men, all now in the penitentiary. They dragged him in the bottom of the car and drove rapidly over several score miles of country. The kidnaping precipitated a search that has not been equaled in Idaho in some years. Virtually every officer in northern Idaho was on the lookout for the fugitives and not one in the state but who hoped to see the president of the official as he lay crumpled in the bottom of the car.

The incident left the lieutenant governor with a none-too-joyful feeling and he sometimes chafed under the food nurtured feeling of his friends. 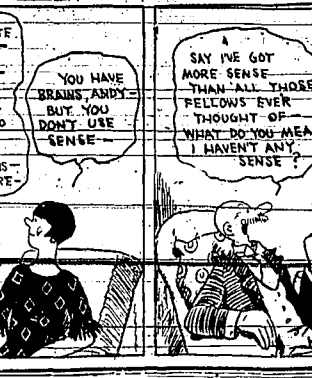
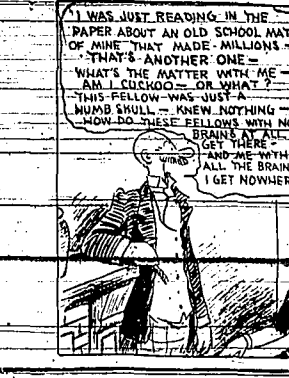
