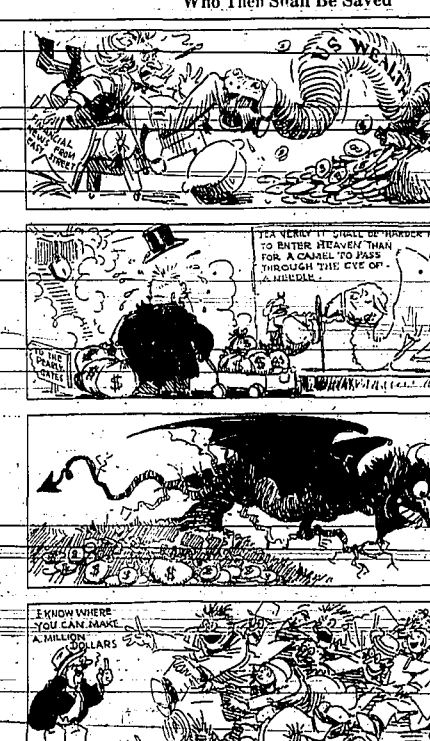

Shawkey would be the next manager of the Yankees.

Arthur Fletcher was first in the Huggins line-up, but the former Giant infielder and Philadelphia manager, died Colonel Ruppert's vice president, who was a straight cash deal, came up days after Mr. Huggins' death.
