PROPOSED RECESS OF SENATE SUBJECT FOR DEBATE IN CAPITAL

Chairman Smoot, Utah, Announces Intention to Go Ahead with Consideration of Tariff Revision Bill

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—Disagreement among Republican leaders on whether the senate should proceed with debate on the tariff revision bill before the regular December session was in evidence at the capital today after informal conferences of factional groups.

Senator Borah Gives Views

Senator Borah, Idaho, one of the Republican independent leaders, said the senate could complete action on the bill by November 20 if it confined debate to the items at issue and stopped quarreling for hours over insignificant rates. He saw no reason why secondary details should take more than 5 or 10 minutes each, or that much. Among those who should be heard, he said, were the manufacturer, the farmer and the consumer.

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION DEPLORES SOLONS' FAILURE

WASHINGTON, Oct. 30.—Advocating adequate tariff-anti-competitive tariff products, the National Association of Manufacturers and the National Association of Importers and Exporters today deplored the "apparent impending failure" of congress to enact tariff revisions on agricultural commodities at the special session.

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FORGERY CHARGES AILED AT HEARING

Hansen Eleven Defeats Bruin Cub Team by 12-to-7 Score

Beautiful Passing And Running Mark Interesting Game

Twin Falls Team Pushes First Counter Over During Opening Quarter But Fails to Maintain Pace

Hansen football team defeated the Twin Falls Cubs on Lincoln field yesterday, 12 to 7, in a game marked by pretty passes and runs, stubborn defense, and rapid, gingerly playing. The Cubs pushed their counter over in the first quarter, Hansen countered in the second and third quarters.

Twin Falls kicked off and got the ball again at midline on a punt. A drive toward Hansen's goal lost momentum when 20 yards from the end, and a short punt gave Hansen the ball close to her own goal. From a punt Hansen's quick offensive play brought Hansen a 12-yard gain. It encouraged Hansen into thinking she could get to some more, but the Cub line was obstinate in the middle, and Hansen promptly lost the ball on downs.

The Cubs looked at the goal line only 2 yards away, made three plays, got a penalty that helped in a tight place, and then Mye bucked through the line for the touchdown. A plunge for the entire point went across. Her carrying the ball, and Twin Falls had 7 points.

Fumble Losses Ball

The rest of the quarter was spent by Hansen trying to get her running play going, and with the whistle a Cub fumble gave Hansen the ball on her own 48-yard mark. With the new quarter, Hill started around his right end, found the going unfavorable because of too many Cubs, so reversed and went to the other way. Another fumble down made a score promising, but the Cub broke through to stop the next play for Hansen, and Hansen's attempted pass was short. The Cub aided by two five-yard penalties pointed their way for 58 yards in a sustained march, only to be held for downs on Hansen's 12-yard mark. Hansen promptly punted, the ball got away from the Cubs safety and Hansen had it back on the Cub's 25-yard line after a gain on the kick of 63 yards.

Fighting the Twin Falls boys to be somewhat upset, Hansen threw Smith at the weak side so effectively that he went 25 yards for a touchdown and was standing up when the crossed the line. A three kick for the point was blocked, and the score was Cub 7, Hansen 6.

Hansen threatened again in this quarter getting the better of Cub fumble from the kickoff, and rolling up 25 yards before the Cub defense got its legs down. Then the game started, Twin Falls punted to end the half.

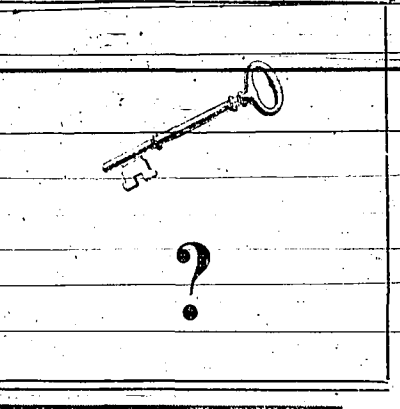

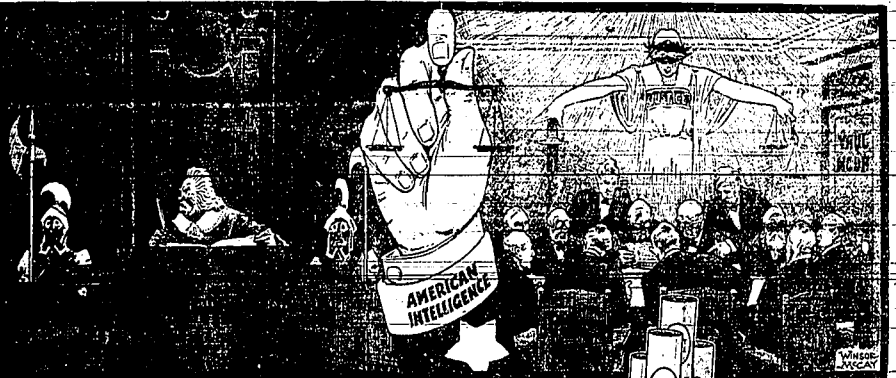

IDAHO POWER OPENS \$85,000 SUBSTATION

Rotarians and Visiting County Commissioners Guests for Inspection

Formal opening of the new \$85,000 substation of the Idaho Power company took place at noon yesterday in the presence of 40 guests including the Idaho county commissioners now in session in Twin Falls and the members of the Twin Falls Rotary club. The substation has been in operation since early fall but had never been formally opened. A buffet luncheon was served in connection with the affair. John D. Orr, Twin Falls manager, made a brief talk in connection with inspection of the substation, pointing out that it was built not only to supply present needs but to permit expansion of the system such as would naturally accompany the growth of the country. The Idaho Power company has, he stated, spent approximately \$400,000 on the Twin Falls section south of the Snake river during the year of 1928 and the year 1929 up to September 30, 1929, of which \$250,000 has been spent in rural electrification and extension of farm lines. There are now 543 miles of farm line in the Twin Falls section serving 235 customers. There are 150 employes.
